Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Allows the Secretary of State to issue registration plates for electric vehicles as vanity or personalized plates.

AN ACT concerning transportation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by 5 changing Section 3-805 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/3-805) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 3-805)

7 Sec. 3-805. Electric vehicles. The Until January 1, 2020, the owner of a motor vehicle of the first division or a motor 8 9 vehicle of the second division weighing 8,000 pounds or less propelled by an electric engine and not utilizing motor fuel, 10 may register such vehicle for a fee not to exceed \$35 for a 11 2-year registration period. The Secretary may, in his 12 13 discretion, prescribe that electric vehicle registration 14 plates be issued for an indefinite term, such term to 15 correspond to the term of registration plates issued 16 generally, as provided in Section 3 414.1. In no event may the registration fee for electric vehicles exceed \$18 17 per registration year. Beginning on January 1, 2020, the 18 19 registration fee for these vehicles shall be equal to the fee set forth in Section 3-806 for motor vehicles of the first 20 division, other than Autocycles, Motorcycles, Motor Driven 21 Cycles, and Pedalcycles. In addition to the registration fees, 22 the Secretary shall assess an additional \$100 per year in lieu 23

of the payment of motor fuel taxes. \$1 of the additional fees shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special Services Fund and the remainder of the additional fees shall be deposited into the Road Fund. <u>The Secretary may issue</u> <u>registration plates under this Section as vanity or</u> <u>personalized plates under Section 3-405.1.</u>
