SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/6-109

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Removes provisions requiring that applicants 75 years of age or older demonstrate the ability to exercise reasonable care and ordinary and reasonable control of the operation of a motor vehicle when applying for a driver's license.

AN ACT concerning transportation.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by 5 changing Section 6-109 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/6-109)

7 Sec. 6-109. Examination of applicants.

8 (a) The Secretary of State shall examine every applicant 9 for a driver's license or permit who has not been previously licensed as a driver under the laws of this State or any other 10 state or country, or any applicant for renewal of such 11 12 driver's license or permit when such license or permit has been expired for more than one year. The Secretary of State 13 14 shall, subject to the provisions of paragraph (c), examine every licensed driver at least every 8 years, and may examine 15 16 or re-examine any other applicant or licensed driver, provided that during the years 1984 through 1991 those drivers issued a 17 license for 3 years may be re-examined not less than every 7 18 19 years or more than every 10 years.

The Secretary of State shall require the testing of the eyesight of any driver's license or permit applicant who has not been previously licensed as a driver under the laws of this State and shall promulgate rules and regulations to provide for the orderly administration of all the provisions of this
Section.

3 The Secretary of State shall include at least one test 4 question that concerns the provisions of the Pedestrians with 5 Disabilities Safety Act in the question pool used for the 6 written portion of the driver's license examination within one 7 year after July 22, 2010 (the effective date of Public Act 8 96-1167).

9 The Secretary of State shall include, in the question pool 10 used for the written portion of the driver's license 11 examination, test questions concerning safe driving in the 12 presence of bicycles, of which one may be concerning the Dutch 13 Reach method as described in Section 2-112.

The Secretary of State shall include, in the question pool used for the written portion of the driver's license examination, at least one test question concerning driver responsibilities when approaching a stationary emergency vehicle as described in Section 11-907.

19 (b) Except as provided for those applicants in paragraph (c), such examination shall include a test of the applicant's 20 eyesight, his or her ability to read and understand official 21 22 traffic control devices, his or her knowledge of safe driving 23 practices and the traffic laws of this State, and may include an actual demonstration of the applicant's ability to exercise 24 25 ordinary and reasonable control of the operation of a motor 26 vehicle, and such further physical and mental examination as

the Secretary of State finds necessary to determine the 1 2 applicant's fitness to operate a motor vehicle safely on the highways, except the examination of an applicant 75 years of 3 age or older shall include an actual demonstration of 4 the 5 applicant's ability to exercise ordinary and reasonable 6 control of the operation of a motor vehicle. All portions of 7 written and verbal examinations under this Section, excepting 8 where the English language appears on facsimiles of road 9 signs, may be given in the Spanish language and, at the 10 discretion of the Secretary of State, in any other language as 11 well as in English upon request of the examinee. Deaf persons 12 who are otherwise qualified are not prohibited from being 13 issued a license, other than a commercial driver's license, under this Code. 14

15 (c) Re-examination for those applicants who at the time of 16 renewing their driver's license possess a driving record 17 devoid of any convictions of traffic violations or evidence of committing an offense for which mandatory revocation would be 18 required upon conviction pursuant to Section 6-205 at the time 19 20 of renewal shall be in a manner prescribed by the Secretary in 21 order to determine an applicant's ability to safely operate a 22 motor vehicle, except that every applicant for the renewal of 23 a driver's license who is 75 years of age or older must prove, 24 by an actual demonstration, the applicant's ability 25 exercise reasonable care in the safe operation of a motor 26 vehicle.

1 (d) In the event the applicant is not ineligible under the 2 provisions of Section 6-103 to receive a driver's license, the 3 Secretary of State shall make provision for giving an 4 examination, either in the county where the applicant resides 5 or at a place adjacent thereto reasonably convenient to the 6 applicant, within not more than 30 days from the date said 7 application is received.

8 (e) The Secretary of State may adopt rules regarding the 9 use of foreign language interpreters during the application 10 and examination process.
