

102ND GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2021 and 2022 SB3051

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act

Creates the In-home Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure Act. Provides that if the construction of one or more new housing units or major renovations will include at least one garage, carport, or driveway for each housing unit, the builder or the builder's agent shall provide each buyer, prospective buyer, or homeowner with the option to include either an electric vehicle charging station capable of at least level 2 charging or equipment to support the later addition of a such a charging station in or on the garage, carport, or driveway. Requires a builder to give a buyer or homeowner notice of this requirement along with information on available rebate programs for installing an electric charging station. Requires the buyer or homeowner to provide notice of receipt. Provides a private right of action for persons aggrieved by a violation of the Act. Effective July 1, 2022.

AN ACT concerning civil law. 1

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

- 4 Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the In-home Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure Act.
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- Section 5. Definitions. In this Act: 6
- "Electric vehicle" means a vehicle that is exclusively 8 powered by and refueled by electricity, must be plugged in to
- 9 charge, and is licensed to drive on public roadways.
- "Electric vehicle charging station" means a station that 10 delivers electricity from a source outside an electric vehicle 11
- into one or more electric vehicles. 12
- "Level 2 charging" means that the charging capability of 13 14 the electric vehicle charging station:
- (1) includes the ability to charge a battery or any 15 16 other energy storage device in an electric vehicle through mean means of an alternating current electrical service 17 with a minimum of 208 volts; and 18
- 19 (2) meets applicable industry safety standards.
- "Major renovation" means a project with a construction 20 budget that equals 40% or more of the building's current 21 replacement cost. 22

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- 1 Section 10. In-home electric vehicle charging.
- 2 (a) If the construction of one or more new housing units or
 3 major renovation will include at least one garage, carport, or
 4 driveway for each housing unit, the builder or the builder's
 5 agent shall provide each buyer, prospective buyer, or
 6 homeowner with the option to include in or on the garage,
 7 carport, or driveway:
 - (1) an electric vehicle charging station capable of providing at least level 2 charging; or
 - (2) a dedicated electric line of sufficient voltage to support the later addition of an electric vehicle of an electric vehicle charging station capable of providing at least level 2 charging.
- 14 (b) The requirement in subsection (a) applies only to the 15 construction of new housing units or major renovation of 16 existing housing units in either single-family detached homes 17 or townhouse units.
 - (c) The builder or builder's agent shall give to each buyer, prospective buyer, or homeowner:
- 20 (1) notice of the options listed in subsection (a);
 21 and
- 22 (2) specific information about any available rebate 23 programs related to the purchase or installation of an 24 electric vehicle charging station.
- 25 (d) The buyer, prospective buyer, or homeowner shall 26 provide a physical or electronic signature indicating that the

- 1 buyer, prospective buyer, or homeowner has received the
- 2 options and information listed in subsection (c)
- 3 Section 15. Enforcement. A buyer, prospective buyer, or 4 homeowner aggrieved by a violation of this Act may bring an 5 action in the circuit court of the county in which the housing 6 unit is located to recover actual damages or \$1,000, whichever 7 is greater. The court shall award reasonable attorney's fees to a prevailing plaintiff. The court may, in its discretion, 8 9 award punitive damages and any other equitable relief it deems 10 appropriate. Any action arising under this Act shall be 11 commenced within 2 years after the date of the alleged 12 violation.
- Section 20. Applicability. This Act only applies prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or application to any new construction or major renovation for which a building permit is issued before the effective date of this Act.
- Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 2022.
