

## 102ND GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2021 and 2022 SB3985

Introduced 1/21/2022, by Sen. Dan McConchie

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/6-115 625 ILCS 5/6-118 from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 6-115

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Extends the term for a driver's license to 6 years (from 4 years). Increases the fee for an original or renewal driver's license from \$30\$ to \$45. Makes corresponding changes. Effective January 1, 2025.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing Sections 6-115 and 6-118 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/6-115) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 6-115)
- 7 Sec. 6-115. Expiration of driver's license.
- (a) Except as provided elsewhere in this Section, every 8 9 driver's license issued under the provisions of this Code shall expire 6 4 years from the date of its issuance, or at 10 such later date, as the Secretary of State may by proper rule 11 12 and regulation designate, not to exceed 12 calendar months; in 13 the event that an applicant for renewal of a driver's license 14 fails to apply prior to the expiration date of the previous driver's license, the renewal driver's license shall expire 6 15 16 4 years from the expiration date of the previous driver's license, or at such later date as the Secretary of State may by 17 proper rule and regulation designate, not to exceed 12 18 19 calendar months.
  - The Secretary of State may, however, issue to a person not previously licensed as a driver in Illinois a driver's license which will expire not less than  $\underline{6}$  4 years nor more than  $\underline{7}$  5 years from date of issuance, except as provided elsewhere in

1 this Section.

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- 2 (a-5) Every driver's license issued under this Code to an 3 applicant who is not a United States citizen or permanent 4 resident, or an individual who has an approved application for 5 asylum in the United States or has entered the United States in 6 refugee status, shall expire on whichever is the earlier date 7 of the following:
- 8 (1) as provided under subsection (a), (f), (g), or (i) 9 of this Section;
  - (2) on the date the applicant's authorized stay in the United States terminates; or
  - (3) if the applicant's authorized stay is indefinite and the applicant is applying for a Limited Term REAL ID compliant driver's license, one year from the date of issuance of the license.
  - (a-10) Every REAL ID compliant driver's license issued under this Code to an applicant who is not a United States citizen or permanent resident, or an individual who has an approved application for asylum in the United States or has entered the United States in refugee status, shall be marked "Limited Term".
  - (b) Before the expiration of a driver's license, except those licenses expiring on the individual's 21st birthday, or 3 months after the individual's 21st birthday, the holder thereof may apply for a renewal thereof, subject to all the provisions of Section 6-103, and the Secretary of State may

- 1 require an examination of the applicant. A licensee whose
- 2 driver's license expires on his 21st birthday, or 3 months
- 3 after his 21st birthday, may not apply for a renewal of his
- 4 driving privileges until he reaches the age of 21.
- 5 (c) The Secretary of State shall, 30 days prior to the
- 6 expiration of a driver's license, forward to each person whose
- 7 license is to expire a notification of the expiration of said
- 8 license which may be presented at the time of renewal of said
- 9 license.
- There may be included with such notification information
- 11 explaining the anatomical gift and Emergency Medical
- 12 Information Card provisions of Section 6-110. The format and
- text of such information shall be prescribed by the Secretary.
- 14 There shall be included with such notification, for a
- 15 period of 4 years beginning January 1, 2000 information
- 16 regarding the Illinois Adoption Registry and Medical
- 17 Information Exchange established in Section 18.1 of the
- 18 Adoption Act.
- 19 (d) The Secretary may defer the expiration of the driver's
- license of a licensee, spouse, and dependent children who are
- 21 living with such licensee while on active duty, serving in the
- 22 Armed Forces of the United States outside of the State of
- 23 Illinois, and 120 days thereafter, upon such terms and
- conditions as the Secretary may prescribe.
- (d-5) The Secretary may defer the expiration of the
- 26 driver's license of a licensee, or of a spouse or dependent

- children living with the licensee, serving as a civilian employee of the United States Armed Forces or the United States Department of Defense, outside of the State of Illinois, and 120 days thereafter, upon such terms and conditions as the Secretary may prescribe.
  - (e) The Secretary of State may decline to process a renewal of a driver's license of any person who has not paid any fee or tax due under this Code and is not paid upon reasonable notice and demand.
  - (f) The Secretary shall provide that each original or renewal driver's license issued to a licensee under 21 years of age shall expire 3 months after the licensee's 21st birthday. Persons whose current driver's licenses expire on their 21st birthday on or after January 1, 1986 shall not renew their driver's license before their 21st birthday, and their current driver's license will be extended for an additional term of 3 months beyond their 21st birthday. Thereafter, the expiration and term of the driver's license shall be governed by subsection (a) hereof.
  - (g) The Secretary shall provide that each original or renewal driver's license issued to a licensee 81 years of age through age 86 shall expire 2 years from the date of issuance, or at such later date as the Secretary may by rule and regulation designate, not to exceed an additional 12 calendar months. The Secretary shall also provide that each original or renewal driver's license issued to a licensee 87 years of age

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- or older shall expire 12 months from the date of issuance, or at such later date as the Secretary may by rule and regulation designate, not to exceed an additional 12 calendar months.
  - (h) The Secretary of State shall provide that each special restricted driver's license issued under subsection (g) of Section 6-113 of this Code shall expire 12 months from the date of issuance. The Secretary shall adopt rules defining renewal requirements.
- 9 (i) The Secretary of State shall provide that each driver's license issued to a person convicted of a sex offense as defined in Section 2 of the Sex Offender Registration Act shall expire 12 months from the date of issuance or at such date as the Secretary may by rule designate, not to exceed an additional 12 calendar months. The Secretary may adopt rules defining renewal requirements.

20	In order to ensure the proper implementation of the
21	Uniform Commercial Driver License Act, Article V of this
22	Chapter, the Secretary of State is empowered to prorate the
23	\$24 fee for the commercial driver's license proportionate to
24	the expiration date of the applicant's Illinois driver's
25	license.
26	The fee for any duplicate license or permit shall be

1	waived	for	any	person	who	presents	the	Secretary	of	State'	S
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- 2 office with a police report showing that his license or permit
- 3 was stolen.
- 4 The fee for any duplicate license or permit shall be
- 5 waived for any person age 60 or older whose driver's license or
- 6 permit has been lost or stolen.
- 7 No additional fee shall be charged for a driver's license,
- 8 or for a commercial driver's license, when issued to the
- 9 holder of an instruction permit for the same classification or
- 10 type of license who becomes eligible for such license.
- 11 The fee for a restricted driving permit under this
- 12 subsection (a) shall be imposed annually until the expiration
- of the permit.
- 14 (a-5) The fee for a driver's record or data contained
- 15 therein is \$12.
- 16 (b) Any person whose license or privilege to operate a
- 17 motor vehicle in this State has been suspended or revoked
- under Section 3-707, any provision of Chapter 6, Chapter 11,
- or Section 7-205, 7-303, or 7-702 of the Family Financial
- 20 Responsibility Law of this Code, shall in addition to any
- 21 other fees required by this Code, pay a reinstatement fee as
- 22 follows:
- Suspension under Section 3-707 ...... \$100
- Summary suspension under Section 11-501.1.....\$250
- 26 Suspension under Section 11-501.9.....\$250

1	Summary revocation under Section 11-501.1\$500
2	Other suspension \$70
3	Revocation \$500
4	However, any person whose license or privilege to operate
5	a motor vehicle in this State has been suspended or revoked for
6	a second or subsequent time for a violation of Section 11-501,
7	11-501.1, or 11-501.9 of this Code or a similar provision of a
8	local ordinance or a similar out-of-state offense or Section
9	9-3 of the Criminal Code of 1961 or the Criminal Code of 2012
10	and each suspension or revocation was for a violation of
11	Section 11-501, 11-501.1, or 11-501.9 of this Code or a
12	similar provision of a local ordinance or a similar
13	out-of-state offense or Section 9-3 of the Criminal Code of
14	1961 or the Criminal Code of 2012 shall pay, in addition to any
15	other fees required by this Code, a reinstatement fee as
16	follows:
17	Summary suspension under Section 11-501.1\$500
18	Suspension under Section 11-501.9\$500
19	Summary revocation under Section 11-501.1\$500

21	(c) All fees collected under the provisions of this
22	Chapter 6 shall be disbursed under subsection (g) of Section
23	2-119 of this Code, except as follows:
24	1. The following amounts shall be paid into the
25	Drivers Education Fund:
26	(A) \$16 of the \$20 fee for an original driver's

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- 2 (B)  $\frac{\$7.50}{\$5}$  of the  $\frac{\$30}{\$3}$  fee for an original driver's license;
  - (C)  $\frac{\$7.50}{\$5}$  of the  $\frac{\$30}{\$30}$  fee for a  $\frac{4}{\$30}$  renewal driver's license;
    - (D) \$4 of the \$8 fee for a restricted driving permit; and
    - (E) \$4 of the \$8 fee for a monitoring device driving permit.
    - 2. \$30 of the \$250 fee for reinstatement of a license summarily suspended under Section 11-501.1 or suspended under Section 11-501.9 shall be deposited into the Drunk and Drugged Driving Prevention Fund. However, for a person whose license or privilege to operate a motor vehicle in this State has been suspended or revoked for a second or subsequent time for a violation of Section 11-501, 11-501.1, or 11-501.9 of this Code or Section 9-3 of the Criminal Code of 1961 or the Criminal Code of 2012, \$190 of the \$500 fee for reinstatement of a license summarily suspended under Section 11-501.1 or suspended under \$190 Section 11-501.9, and of the \$500 fee for reinstatement of a revoked license shall be deposited into the Drunk and Drugged Driving Prevention Fund. \$190 of the \$500 fee for reinstatement of a license summarily revoked pursuant to Section 11-501.1 shall be deposited into the Drunk and Drugged Driving Prevention Fund.

1	3. \$6 of the original or renewal fee for a commercial
2	driver's license and \$6 of the commercial learner's permit
3	fee when the permit is issued to any person holding a valid
4	Illinois driver's license, shall be paid into the
5	CDLIS/AAMVAnet/NMVTIS Trust Fund.
6	4. \$30 of the \$70 fee for reinstatement of a license
7	suspended under the Family Financial Responsibility Law
8	shall be paid into the Family Responsibility Fund.

- 5. The \$5 fee for each original or renewal M or L endorsement shall be deposited into the Cycle Rider Safety Training Fund.
- 6. \$20 of any original or renewal fee for a commercial driver's license or commercial learner's permit shall be paid into the Motor Carrier Safety Inspection Fund.
- 7. The following amounts shall be paid into the General Revenue Fund:
  - (A) \$190 of the \$250 reinstatement fee for a summary suspension under Section 11-501.1 or a suspension under Section 11-501.9;
  - (B) \$40 of the \$70 reinstatement fee for any other suspension provided in subsection (b) of this Section; and
  - (C) \$440 of the \$500 reinstatement fee for a first offense revocation and \$310 of the \$500 reinstatement fee for a second or subsequent revocation.
  - 8. Fees collected under paragraph (4) of subsection

- 1 (d) and subsection (h) of Section 6-205 of this Code; 2 subparagraph (C) of paragraph 3 of subsection (c) of 3 Section 6-206 of this Code; and paragraph (4) of 4 subsection (a) of Section 6-206.1 of this Code, shall be
- 5 paid into the funds set forth in those Sections.
- 6 (d) All of the proceeds of the additional fees imposed by
  7 this amendatory Act of the 96th General Assembly shall be
  8 deposited into the Capital Projects Fund.
- 9 (e) The additional fees imposed by this amendatory Act of 10 the 96th General Assembly shall become effective 90 days after 11 becoming law.
- (f) As used in this Section, "active-duty member of the
  United States Armed Forces" means a member of the Armed
  Services or Reserve Forces of the United States or a member of
  the Illinois National Guard who is called to active duty
  pursuant to an executive order of the President of the United
  States, an act of the Congress of the United States, or an
  order of the Governor.

- 21 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect January 22 1, 2025.
