A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a
6 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations made
7 in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the School
8 Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the Transportation
9 Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond Series B Fund, the
10 Coal Development Fund, the Transportation Bond Series D Fund,
11 Multi-Modal Transportation Bond Fund, and the Build Illinois
12 Bond Fund will be paid or reimbursed from the proceeds of tax-
13 exempt bonds subsequently issued by the State.

14 ARTICLE 2

15 Section 1. "An ACT concerning appropriations", Public Act
16 102-0017, approved June 17, 2021, is amended by changing
17 Sections 1065, 1250, 1275, 1793 and 1920 of Article 137 as
18 follows:

19 (P.A. 102-0017, Article 137, Section 1065)

20 Sec. 1065. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as may

1 be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of business
2 on June 30, 2021, from an appropriation heretofore made for
3 such purpose in Article 8, Section 1065 of Public Act 101-0638,
4 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
5 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
6 costs associated with a grant to The Place for Children with
7 Autism for costs associated with capital improvements.

8 (P.A. 102-0017, Article 137, Section 1250, rep.)

9 Section 5. Section 1250 of Article 137 of Public Act 102-
10 0017, approved June 17, 2021, is repealed.

11 (P.A. 102-0017, Article 137, Section 1250, new)

12 Sec. 1250. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as may
13 be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
14 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
15 grant to Generations Housing Initiatives for costs associated
16 with capital improvements.

17 (P.A. 102-0017, Article 137, Section 1275)

18 Sec. 1275. The sum of \$2,500,000, or so much thereof as may
19 be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of business
20 on June 30, 2021, from an appropriation heretofore made for
21 such purpose in Article 8, Section ~~1270~~1275 of Public Act 101-

1 0638, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
2 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
3 Opportunity for a grant to the Bronzeville Community
4 Development Partnership for costs associated with an urban
5 innovation center and capital improvements.

6 (P.A. 102-0017, Article 137, Section 1793)

7 Sec. 1793. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as may
8 be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of business
9 on June 30, 2021, from an appropriation heretofore made for
10 such purpose in Article 8, Section ~~14793~~ 1793 of Public Act
11 101-0638, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
12 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
13 Opportunity for a grant to the City of Chicago Department of
14 Transportation for costs associated with capital improvements
15 in the 37th Ward.

16 (P.A. 102-0017, Article 137, Section 1920)

17 Sec. 1920. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as may
18 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
19 on June 30, 2021, from an appropriation heretofore made for

21 0638, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
22 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

3 ARTICLE 3

4 Section 5. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
6 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
7 such purpose in Article 137, Section 5 of Public Act 102-0017,
8 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
9 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity a grant
10 to the Uptown Theatre for costs associated with capital
11 improvements, including prior incurred costs.

12 Section 10. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
14 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
15 such purpose in Article 137, Section 10 of Public Act 102-0017,
16 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
17 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
18 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites,
19 including prior incurred costs.

20 Section 15. The sum of \$5,500,001, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business

1 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
2 such purpose in Article 137, Section 15 of Public Act 102-0017,
3 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
4 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
5 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites,
6 including prior incurred costs.

7 Section 25. The sum of \$8,140,319, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
9 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
10 such purpose in Article 137, Section 25 of Public Act 102-0017,
11 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
12 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
13 grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park, including
14 prior incurred costs.

15 Section 30. The sum of \$33,581,935, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
17 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
18 such purpose in Article 137, Section 30 of Public Act 102-0017,
19 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
20 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
21 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article
22 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act, including prior
23 incurred costs.

1 Section 40. The sum of \$2,200,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
3 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
4 such purpose in Article 137, Section 40 of Public Act 102-0017,
5 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
6 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
7 grant to the Illinois Medical District Commission for the
8 purpose of fostering economic development and increased
9 employment and the wellbeing of the citizens of Illinois, and
10 for any other purposes authorized in subsection (b) of Section
11 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State
12 agencies for such purposes, including prior incurred costs.

13 Section 50. The sum of \$21,767,839, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
15 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
16 such purpose in Article 137, Section 50 of Public Act 102-0017,
17 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
18 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
19 deposits into the Partners for Conservation Projects Fund and
20 other purposes authorized by subsection (c) of Section 3 of the
21 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies for
22 such purposes, including prior incurred costs.

1 Section 55. The sum of \$8,463,339, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
3 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
4 such purpose in Article 137, Section 55 of Public Act 102-0017,
5 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
6 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
7 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,
8 architectural planning, development, alteration, installation,
9 and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
10 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by
11 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act
12 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes, including
13 prior incurred costs.

14 Section 60. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
16 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
17 such purpose in Article 137, Section 60 of Public Act 102-0017,
18 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
19 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
20 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,
21 architectural planning, development, alteration, installation,
22 and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
23 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by
24 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act

1 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes, including
2 prior incurred costs.

3 Section 65. The sum of \$109,422, or so much thereof as may
4 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
5 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
6 such purpose in Article 137, Section 65 of Public Act 102-0017,
7 as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
8 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
9 grant to the Chicago Housing Authority for LeClaire Courts,
10 including prior incurred costs.

11 Section 71. The sum of \$385,199,111, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
13 on June 30, 2022, less \$25,845,080 to be lapsed, from a
14 reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in Article
15 137, Section 71 of Public Act 102-0017, as amended, is
16 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
17 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the purpose
18 of making grants and loans to foster economic development and
19 increase employment and the well-being of the citizens of
20 Illinois, and for any other purposes authorized in subsection
21 (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants
22 to State agencies for such purposes, including prior incurred
23 costs.

1 Section 75. The sum of \$3,414,314, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
3 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
4 such purpose in Article 137, Section 75 of Public Act 102-0017,
5 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
6 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
7 grants and loans including but not limited to broadband
8 deployment to expand and strengthen existing broadband network
9 infrastructure, health information technology, telemedicine,
10 distance learning, and public safety, including prior incurred
11 costs.

12 Section 80. The sum of \$13,816,995, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
14 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
15 such purpose in Article 137, Section 80 of Public Act 102-0017,
16 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
17 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
18 infrastructure projects that lead directly to private sector
19 expansion or retention activities including but not limited to
20 public infrastructure construction and renovation, financing
21 for the purchase of land and buildings, construction or
22 renovation of fixed assets, site preparation and purchase of
23 machinery and equipment, including prior incurred costs.

1 Section 90. The sum of \$125,591, or so much thereof as may
2 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
3 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
4 such purpose in Article 137, Section 90 of Public Act 102-0017,
5 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
6 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
7 grant to the Phoenix Foundation of Southern Illinois for
8 hospital renovation and equipment, including prior incurred
9 costs.

10 Section 95. The sum of \$1,859,597, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
12 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
13 such purpose in Article 137, Section 95 of Public Act 102-0017,
14 as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
15 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
16 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites,
17 including prior incurred costs.

18 Section 100. The sum of \$9,000,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
20 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
21 such purpose in Article 137, Section 100 of Public Act 102-
22 0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois

1 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 2 Opportunity for grants for acquisition, construction,
 3 renovation and equipping new charter schools, to a silver
 4 certification from the United States Green Building Council's
 5 Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design Green Building
 6 Rating System as approximated below: For Instituto Del
 7 Progreso Latino, including prior
 8 incurred costs9,000,000

9 Section 105. The sum of \$2,606,686, or so much thereof as
 10 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
 11 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
 12 such purpose in Article 137, Section 105 of Public Act 102-
 13 0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
 14 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 15 Opportunity to provide grants, loans, and other investments to
 16 emerging technology enterprises to support and encourage: (i)
 17 commercialization of technology based products and services;
 18 (ii) technology transfer projects involving the promotion of
 19 new or innovative technologies; or (iii) research and
 20 development projects to respond to unique, advanced technology
 21 projects and which foster the development of Illinois' economy
 22 through the advancement of the State's economic, scientific,
 23 and technological assets, including prior incurred costs.

1 Section 110. The sum of \$5,587,720, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
3 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
4 such purpose in Article 137, Section 110 of Public Act 102-
5 0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
6 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
7 Opportunity to provide grants for land acquisition,
8 infrastructure, equipment and other permissible capital
9 expenditures to businesses that will encourage new investment
10 and the creation or retention of jobs in economically depressed
11 areas of the State, including prior incurred costs.

12 Section 115. The sum of \$1,802,520, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
14 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
15 such purpose in Article 137, Section 115 of Public Act 102-
16 0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
17 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
18 Opportunity for a grant to the University of Chicago Medical
19 Center for costs associated with Provident Hospital, including
20 prior incurred costs.

21 Section 120. The sum of \$1,125,000, or so much thereof as
22 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
23 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for

1 such purpose in Article 137, Section 120 of Public Act 102-
2 0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
3 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
4 Opportunity for a grant to the Cook County Health and Hospital
5 System for costs associated with medical equipment and capital
6 improvements at Provident Hospital, including prior incurred
7 costs.

8 Section 125. The sum of \$9,241,221, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
10 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
11 such purpose in Article 137, Section 125 of Public Act 102-
12 0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
13 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
14 Opportunity for grants awarded in conjunction with the Office
15 of Minority Economic Empowerment, including prior incurred
16 costs.

17 Section 130. The sum of \$2, or so much thereof as may be
18 necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on
19 June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such
20 purpose in Article 137, Section 130 of Public Act 102-0017, as
21 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
22 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
23 costs associated with the Cairo Port Development, including

1 prior incurred costs.

2 Section 150. The sum of \$5,958,752, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
4 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
5 such purpose in Article 137, Section 150 of Public Act 102-
6 0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
7 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
8 Opportunity for grants to local governments for capital
9 improvements to civic centers, including prior incurred costs.

10 Section 155. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as may
11 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
12 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
13 such purpose in Article 137, Section 155 of Public Act 102-
14 0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
15 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
16 Opportunity for a grant to the Rockford District 205 for the
17 project hereinafter enumerated: CICS ROCKFORD CHARTER PATRIOTS

20 0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
21 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
22 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans to local
23 governments for planning, engineering, acquisition,

1 construction, reconstruction, development, improvement and
2 extension of the public infrastructure, and for any other
3 purposes authorized in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the Build
4 Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for such
5 purposes, including prior incurred costs.

6 Section 175. The sum of \$66,507,319, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
8 on June 30, 2022, from appropriations heretofore made for such
9 purpose in Article 137, Section 175 of Public Act 102-0017, as
10 amended is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
11 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
12 purpose of making grants and loans to local governments for
13 planning, engineering, acquisition, construction,
14 reconstruction, development, improvement and extension of the
15 public infrastructure, and for any other purposes authorized
16 in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
17 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes, including
18 prior incurred costs.

19 Section 180. The sum of \$173,325,000, or so much thereof
20 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
21 business on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore
22 made for such purpose in Article 137, Section 180 of Public Act
23 102-0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois

1 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
2 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans to foster
3 economic development and increase employment and the well-being
4 of the citizens of Illinois, and for any other purposes
5 authorized in subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois
6 Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for such purposes,
7 including prior incurred costs.

8 Section 185. The sum of \$19,801,912, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
10 on June 30, 2022, from appropriations heretofore made for such
11 purpose in Article 137, Section 185 of Public Act 102-0017, as
12 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
13 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
14 purposes authorized in subsection (c) of Section 4 of the Build

17 Section 190. The sum of \$7,267,741, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business

21 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
22 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for

2 purposes, including prior incurred costs.

3 Section 195. The sum of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
5 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
6 such purpose in Article 137, Section 195 of Public Act 102-
7 0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Rebuild Illinois
8 Projects Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
9 Opportunity for purposes authorized in subsection (c) of
10 Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to
11 State agencies for such purposes, including prior incurred
12 costs.

13 Section 200. The sum of \$92,456,622, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
15 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
16 such purpose in Article 137, Section 200 of Public Act 102-
17 0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
18 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
19 Opportunity for grants and loans including but not limited to
20 broadband deployment to expand and strengthen existing
21 broadband network infrastructure, health information
22 technology, telemedicine, distance learning, and public safety,
23 including prior incurred costs.

1 Section 210. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
3 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
4 such purpose in Article 137, Section 210 of Public Act 102-
5 0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
6 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
7 Opportunity to provide grants, loans, and other investments to
8 foster economic development for emerging technology enterprises
9 to support and encourage: (i) commercialization of technology
10 based products and services; (ii) technology transfer projects
11 involving the promotion of new or innovative technologies; or
12 (iii) research and development projects to respond to unique,
13 advanced technology projects and which foster the development
14 of Illinois' economy through the advancement of the State's
15 economic, scientific, and technological assets, and for any
16 other purposes authorized in subsection (b) of Section 4 of the
17 Build Illinois Bond Act, including prior incurred costs.

18 Section 215. The sum of \$68,135,560, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
20 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
21 such purpose in Article 137, Section 215 of Public Act 102-
22 0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
23 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

1 Opportunity to provide grants for land acquisition,
2 infrastructure, equipment and other permissible capital
3 expenditures to businesses that will encourage new investment
4 and the creation or retention of jobs in economically depressed
5 areas of the State, including prior incurred costs.

6 Section 220. The sum of \$15,000,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business

10 0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Rebuild Illinois
11 Projects Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
12 Opportunity for grants awarded in conjunction with the Office
13 of Minority Economic Empowerment, including prior incurred
14 costs.

15 Section 230. The sum of \$15,000,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
17 on June 30, 2022, from a reappropriation heretofore made for
18 such purpose in Article 137, Section 230 of Public Act 102-
19 0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois

1 Section 235. The sum of \$15,000,000, or so much thereof as

13 Section 110. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and

16 grants to units of local government for the acquisition and
17 development of bike paths.

18 Section 115. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Natural

21 facilities and programs for park and trail purposes provided

1 by the Department of Natural Resources, including construction

5 Section 120. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Natural

10 maintaining, reconstructing, rehabilitating, replacing fixed
