SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Makes appropriations and reappropriations for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022. Effective immediately.

AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

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ARTICLE 1

Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a 5 6 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations made 7 in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the School 8 Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the Transportation 9 Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond Series B Fund, the 10 Coal Development Fund, the Transportation Bond Series D Fund, 11 Multi-Modal Transportation Bond Fund, and the Build Illinois 12 Bond Fund will be paid or reimbursed from the proceeds of tax-13 exempt bonds subsequently issued by the State.

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ARTICLE 2

The sum of \$300,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business 15 on June 30, 2022, from an appropriation heretofore made for 16 17 such purpose in Article 173, Section 5 of Public Act 102-0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the State Coronavirus Urgent 18 19 Remediation Emergency Fund to the Department of Commerce and 20 Economic Opportunity for grants, loans and contracts including 21 but not limited to broadband deployment to expand and 22 strengthen existing broadband network infrastructure, health 23 information technology, telemedicine, distance learning, and SB4072 -420- OMB102 00320 HJH 10320 b public safety, including prior incurred costs.

2 Section 10. The sum of \$26,900,000, or so much thereof as 3 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2022, from an appropriation heretofore made for 4 5 such purpose in Article 173, Section 10 of Public Act 102-0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the State Coronavirus Urgent 6 Remediation Emergency Fund to the Department of Commerce and 7 8 Economic Opportunity for a grant to the City of Marengo for all 9 costs associated with water and/or wastewater infrastructure 10 improvements.

11 Section 15. The sum of \$3,300,000, or so much thereof as 12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2022, from an appropriation heretofore made for 13 14 such purpose in Article 173, Section 15 of Public Act 102-0017, 15 as amended, is reappropriated from the State Coronavirus Urgent 16 Remediation Emergency Fund to the Department of Commerce and 17 Economic Opportunity for a grant to the City of Algonquin for 18 all costs associated with the construction of wastewater 19 treatment facility.

20 Section 20. The sum of \$424,492,000, or so much thereof as 21 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business 22 on June 30, 2022, from an appropriation heretofore made for such purpose in Article 173, Section 20 of Public Act 102-0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the State Coronavirus Urgent Remediation Emergency Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for deposits into the Build Illinois Bond Fund for reimbursements and purposes as authorized by Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 and any associated federal guidance.

8 Section 25. No contract shall be entered into or obligation 9 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein 10 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have 11 been approved in writing by the Governor.
