SENATE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated, was 3 founded on December 4, 1906 by seven college men, respectfully 4 known as the Seven Jewels, on the campus of Cornell University 5 in Ithaca, New York and became the first intercollegiate 6 Greek-letter fraternity established by and for African 7 Americans; and

8 WHEREAS, The Seven Jewels of the Fraternity, Henry Arthur 9 Callis, Charles Henry Chapman, Eugene Kinckle Jones, George 10 Biddle Kelley, Nathaniel Allison Murray, Robert Harold Ogle, and Vertner Woodson Tandy, recognized the need for a strong 11 bond of brotherhood among African descendants in this country 12 13 and the need to help correct the educational, economic, 14 political, and social injustices faced by African Americans 15 and other people of color; and

16 WHEREAS, Alpha Phi Alpha initially served as a study and 17 support group for minority students who faced racial 18 prejudice, both educationally and socially, at Cornell 19 University; the founders and early leaders of the Fraternity 20 succeeded in laying a firm foundation for Alpha Phi Alpha's 21 principles of scholarship, fellowship, good character, and the 22 uplifting of humanity; and SR0895 -2- LRB102 26583 LAW 37295 r WHEREAS, While stressing academic excellence among its members since its founding, Alpha Phi Alpha has consistently supplied its voice and vision to the struggle of African Americans and people of color and to issues of civil rights around the world; and

6 WHEREAS, The aims of Alpha Phi Alpha are manly deeds, 7 scholarship, and love for all mankind; and

8 WHEREAS, The mission of Alpha Phi Alpha is to develop 9 leaders, promote brotherhood and academic excellence, and 10 provide service and advocacy for communities, as exemplified 11 through its national programs, which include "Go to High School, Go to College," a program focused on the educational 12 13 achievement of students in elementary, secondary, and 14 post-secondary schools that has given thousands of dollars in 15 scholarship funds to deserving students, "Project Alpha," a program that teaches teenage pregnancy prevention and sexually 16 17 transmitted disease prevention to young males, and the "A 18 Voteless People is a Hopeless People" campaign, a voter registration and education program through which thousands of 19 20 voters have been educated and registered; the Fraternity also 21 providing service through its focuses on strategic partnerships with Big Brothers Big Sisters, the Boy Scouts of 22 23 America, the March of Dimes, the American Heart/American 24 Stroke Association, and the American Cancer Society; and

1 WHEREAS, For over 115 years, Alpha Phi Alpha has played a 2 fundamental role in the positive development of the character 3 and education of more than 200,000 men around the world; and

WHEREAS, Alpha Phi Alpha has over 700 college and alumni 4 5 chapters in the United States of America, Africa, Asia, the 6 Caribbean, and Europe; this total includes 141 chapters in the 7 Midwestern Region, including 32 in Illinois; its presence 8 started in Illinois with the founding of the Theta Chapter in 9 1910, the first college chapter in Illinois, and the Xi Lambda 10 Chapter in 1924, the first alumni chapter, both in Chicago; 11 and

12 WHEREAS, Members of Alpha Phi Alpha include many 13 noteworthy leaders in the areas of government, business, 14 entertainment, science, and higher education, including Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., Thurgood Marshall, W.E.B. DuBois, John 15 Hope Franklin, John H. Johnson, Adam Clayton Powell, Andrew 16 Young, Robert Smith, and Cornel West; its membership also 17 federal, State, and local 18 includes elected officials, 19 including U.S. Representative Danny K. Davis, former U.S. 20 Senators Edward Brook and Roland Burris, former State Senator Donne E. Trotter, former State Representative Al Riley, former 21 State Representative Art Turner Jr., former Cook County Board 22 23 Presidents John and Todd Stroger, and former Mayor of Chicago

Sims Jr., who also served as the 26th vice president of the Midwestern Region; and

10 WHEREAS, Alpha Phi Alpha continues to enrich the lives of 11 its members, who, in turn, provide service and advocacy for 12 the communities they serve; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare March 16, 2022 as Alpha Phi Alpha Day in the State of Illinois in honor of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated and its continued impact on the communities it serves; and be it further

18 RESOLVED, That we welcome the members of Alpha Phi Alpha19 to the Illinois State Capitol on Alpha Phi Alpha Day.
