SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act

Creates the Local Government Business Anti-Poaching Act. Provides that no municipality or county shall offer after the effective date of the Act any incentive to a business or corporation to move its headquarters located in Illinois, or any part of its business located in Illinois, away from the current location. Defines "incentive". Limits home rule powers. Effective immediately.

1 AN ACT concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Local
- 5 Government Business Anti-Poaching Act.
- Section 5. Definition. As used in this Act, "incentive" 6 7 means any economic benefit, financial benefit, or other 8 benefit, such as those authorized under the 9 Development for a Growing Economy Tax Credit Act, the Property Tax Code, the Counties Code, the Illinois Municipal Code 10 (including the Tax Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act), or 11 any other provision of law authorizing abatements, credits, or 12 tax or fee reductions. 13
- Section Illinois business poaching prohibited. 14 10. 15 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no municipality or county shall offer after the effective date of this Act any 16 incentive to a business or corporation to move 17 18 headquarters located in Illinois, or any part of its business located in Illinois, away from the current location. 19
- Section 15. Home rule. The regulation of offering any incentive to a business or corporation to move its

- 1 headquarters located in Illinois, or any part of its business
- 2 located in Illinois, away from the current location are
- 3 exclusive powers and functions of the State. A home rule unit
- 4 may not regulate such matters. This Act is a denial and
- 5 limitation of home rule powers and functions under subsection
- 6 (h) of Section 6 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution.
- 7 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 8 becoming law.
