SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

430 ILCS 65/7

from Ch. 38, par. 83-7

Amends the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act. Provides that if a Firearm Owner's Identification Card is issued to a holder under 21 years of age, then that Firearm Owner's Identification Card shall expire on the holder's 21st birthday or 10 years from the date of issuance, whichever is earlier. Provides that after the holder's 21st birthday, the validity period of the holder's Firearm Owner's Identification Card shall be 10 years.

1 AN ACT concerning safety.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Firearm Owners Identification Card Act is amended by changing Section 7 as follows:
- 6 (430 ILCS 65/7) (from Ch. 38, par. 83-7)
- Sec. 7. Validity of Firearm Owner's Identification Card.
- 8 (a) Except as provided in Section 8 of this Act or 9 elsewhere in this Section, a Firearm Owner's Identification Card issued under the provisions of this Act shall be valid for 10 the person to whom it is issued for a period of 10 years from 11 12 the date of issuance. Unless the person no longer meets the 13 requirements or becomes subject to suspension or revocation 14 under this Act, a card issued under an application made as provided in subsection (a-25) of Section 4 shall remain valid 15 16 if the person meets the requirements of subsection (b-5) of 17 Section 3.1.
 - (b) If a renewal application is submitted to the Department before the expiration date of the applicant's current Firearm Owner's Identification Card, the Firearm Owner's Identification Card shall remain valid, unless the person is subject to or becomes subject to revocation under this Act. Unless the person no longer meets the requirements

- or becomes subject to suspension or revocation under this Act, a card issued under a renewal application made as provided in subsection (a-25) of Section 4 shall remain valid if the person meets the implementation requirements of Section 3.1.
 - (c) Beginning January 1, 2022, if the Firearm Owner's Identification Card of a licensee under the Firearm Concealed Carry Act expires during the term of the licensee's concealed carry license, the Firearm Owner's Identification Card and the license remain valid during the validity of the concealed carry license and the licensee does not have to renew his or her Firearm Owner's Identification Card, if the Firearm Owner's Identification Card has not been otherwise renewed as provided in this Act. Unless the Illinois State Police has reason to believe the licensee is no longer eligible for the card, the Illinois State Police may automatically renew the licensee's Firearm Owner's Identification Card.
 - (d) If a Firearm Owner's Identification Card is issued to a holder under 21 years of age, then that Firearm Owner's Identification Card shall expire on the holder's 21st birthday or 10 years from the date of issuance, whichever is earlier. Thereafter, the expiration and term of the Firearm Owner's Identification Card shall be governed by subsection (a).
