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1	AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 3794
2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 3794 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The Election Code is amended by changing
5	Section 1A-16.7 and by adding Sections 1A-16.10 and 1A-16.11
6	as follows:
7	(10 ILCS 5/1A-16.7)
8	Sec. 1A-16.7. Automatic voter registration.
9	(a) The State Board of Elections shall establish and
10	maintain a portal for automatic government agency voter
11	registration and electronic voter registration by the Office
12	of the Secretary of State that permits an eligible person to
13	electronically apply to register to vote or to update his or
14	her existing voter registration as provided in Section
15	1A-16.1 <u>,</u> or Section 1A-16.2 <u>, or Section 1A-16.10</u> . The portal
16	shall interface with the online voter registration system

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established in Section 1A-16.5 of this Code and shall be 1 capable of receiving and processing voter registration 2 application information, including electronic signatures, from 3 4 the Office of the Secretary of State and each designated 5 automatic voter registration agency, as defined in Section 1A-16.2. The State Board of Elections may cross-reference 6 voter registration information from any designated automatic 7 voter registration agency, as defined under Section 1A-16.2 of 8 9 this Code, with information contained in the database of the 10 Secretary of State as provided under subsection (c) of Section 1A-16.5 of this Code. The State Board of Elections shall 11 modify the online voter registration system as necessary to 12 13 implement this Section.

14 (b) Voter registration data received from the Office of 15 the Secretary of State or a designated automatic voter 16 registration agency through the online registration 17 application system shall be processed as provided in Section 18 1A-16.5 of this Code.

(c) The State Board of Elections shall establish technical 19 20 specifications applicable to each automatic government 21 registration program and electronic voter registration by the Office of the Secretary of State, including data format and 22 23 transmission specifications. The Office of the Secretary of 24 State and each designated automatic voter registration agency data transfer mechanism capable 25 shall maintain а of 26 transmitting voter registration application information,

including electronic signatures where available, to the online voter registration system established in Section 1A-16.5 of this Code.

4 (d) The State Board of Elections shall, by rule, establish 5 criteria and procedures for determining whether an agency of the State or federal government seeking to become a designated 6 automatic voter registration agency has access to reliable 7 8 personal information, as defined under this subsection (d) and 9 subsection (f) of Section 1A-16.2 of this Code, and otherwise 10 meets the requirements to enter into an interagency contract 11 and to operate as a designated automatic voter registration agency. The State Board of Elections shall approve each 12 interagency contract upon affirmative vote of a majority of 13 14 its members.

As used in this subsection (d), "reliable personal information" means information about individuals obtained from government sources that may be used to verify whether an individual is eligible to register to vote.

19 (e) Whenever an applicant's data is transferred from the 20 Office of the Secretary of State or a designated automatic 21 voter registration agency, the agency must transmit a 22 signature image if available. If no signature image was 23 provided by the agency, or if no signature image is available 24 in the Office of the Secretary of State's database or the 25 statewide voter registration database, the applicant must be 26 notified that his or her registration will remain in a pending 10300HB3794ham001 -4- LRB103 30935 BMS 57915 a

status, and the applicant will be required to provide
 identification that complies with the federal Help America
 Vote Act of 2002 and a signature to the election authority on
 election day in the polling place or during early voting.

5 (f) Upon receipt of personal information collected and 6 transferred by the Office of the Secretary of State or a designated automatic voter registration agency, the State 7 Board of Elections shall check the information against the 8 9 statewide voter registration database. The State Board of 10 Elections shall create and electronically transmit to the 11 appropriate election authority а voter registration application for any individual who is not registered to vote 12 13 in Illinois and is not disgualified as provided in this Section or whose information reliably indicates a more recent 14 15 update to the name or address of a person already included in 16 the statewide voter database. The election authority shall 17 process the application accordingly.

18 (g) The appropriate election authority shall ensure that any applicant who is registered to vote or whose existing 19 20 voter registration is updated under this Section is promptly 21 sent written notice of the change. The notice required by this subsection (g) may be sent or combined with other notices 22 required or permitted by law, including, but not limited to, 23 24 any notices sent pursuant to Section 1A-16.5 of this Code. Any 25 notice required by this subsection (g) shall contain, at a 26 minimum: (i) the applicant's name and residential address as

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1 reflected on the voter registration list; (ii) a statement notifying the applicant to contact the appropriate election 2 3 authority if his or her voter registration has been updated in 4 error; (iii) the qualifications to register to vote in 5 Illinois; (iv) a statement notifying the applicant that he or she may opt out of voter registration or request a change to 6 his or her registration information at any time by contacting 7 an election official; and (v) contact information for the 8 9 appropriate election authority, including a phone number, 10 address, electronic mail address, and website address.

11 (h) The appropriate election authority shall ensure that any applicant whose voter registration application is not 12 13 accepted or deemed incomplete is promptly sent written notice 14 of the application's status. The notice required by this 15 subsection may be sent or combined with other notices required 16 or permitted by law, including, but not limited to, any notices sent pursuant to Section 1A-16.5 of this Code. Any 17 notice required by this subsection (h) shall contain, at a 18 minimum, the reason the application was not accepted or deemed 19 20 incomplete and contact information for the appropriate election authority, including a phone number, address, 21 22 electronic mail address, and website address.

(i) If the Office of the Secretary of State or a designated automatic voter registration agency transfers information, or if the State Board of Elections creates and transmits a voter registration application, for a person who does not qualify as 10300HB3794ham001 -6- LRB103 30935 BMS 57915 a

1 an eligible voter, then it shall not constitute a completed 2 voter registration form, and the person shall not be 3 considered to have registered to vote.

4 (j) If the registration is processed by any election 5 authority, then it shall be presumed to have been effected and officially authorized by the State, and that person shall not 6 be found on that basis to have made a false claim to 7 citizenship or to have committed an act of moral turpitude, 8 9 nor shall that person be subject to penalty under any relevant 10 laws, including, but not limited to, Sections 29-10 and 29-19 11 of this Code. This subsection (j) does not apply to a person who knows that he or she is not entitled to register to vote 12 and who willfully votes, registers to vote, or attests under 13 14 penalty of perjury that he or she is eligible to register to 15 vote or willfully attempts to vote or to register to vote.

16 The State Board of Elections, the Office of the (k) Secretary of State, and each designated automatic voter 17 18 registration agency shall implement policies and procedures to protect the privacy and security of voter information as it is 19 20 acquired, stored, and transmitted among agencies, including 21 policies for the retention and preservation of voter 22 information. Information designated as confidential under this 23 Section may be recorded and shared among the State Board of 24 Elections, election authorities, the Office of the Secretary 25 of State, and designated automatic voter registration 26 agencies, but shall be used only for voter registration

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1 purposes, shall not be disclosed to the public except in the 2 aggregate as required by subsection (m) of this Section, and 3 shall not be subject to the Freedom of Information Act. The 4 following information shall be designated as confidential:

5 (1) any portion of an applicant's Social Security 6 number;

7 (2) any portion of an applicant's driver's license
8 number or State identification number;

9 (3) an applicant's decision to decline voter 10 registration;

11 (4) the identity of the person providing information 12 relating to a specific applicant; and

13 (5) the personal residence and contact information of 14 any applicant for whom notice has been given by an 15 appropriate legal authority.

16 This subsection (k) shall not apply to information the 17 State Board of Elections is required to share with the 18 Electronic Registration Information Center.

(1) The voter registration procedures implemented under this Section shall comport with the federal National Voter Registration Act of 1993, as amended, and shall specifically require that the State Board of Elections track registration data received through the online registration system that originated from a designated automatic voter registration agency for the purposes of maintaining statistics.

26 Nothing in this Code shall require designated voter

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1 registration agencies to transmit information that is 2 confidential client information under State or federal law 3 without the consent of the applicant.

4 (m) The State Board of Elections, each election authority 5 that maintains a website, the Office of the Secretary of State, and each designated automatic voter registration agency 6 that maintains a website shall provide information on their 7 websites informing the public about the new registration 8 9 procedures described in this Section. The Office of the 10 Secretary of State and each designated automatic voter 11 registration agency shall display signage or provide literature for the public containing information about the new 12 13 registration procedures described in this Section.

(n) No later than 6 months after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly, the State Board of Elections shall hold at least one public hearing on implementing this amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly at which the public may provide input.

(o) The State Board of Elections shall submit an annual 19 20 public report to the General Assembly and the Governor 21 detailing the progress made to implement this Section. The report shall include all of the following: the number of 22 23 records transferred under this Section by agency, the number 24 of voters newly added to the statewide voter registration list 25 because of records transferred under this Section by agency, 26 the number of updated registrations under this Section by 10300HB3794ham001 -9- LRB103 30935 BMS 57915 a

1 agency, the number of persons who opted out of voter 2 registration, and the number of voters who submitted voter registration forms using the online procedure described in 3 4 Section 1A-16.5 of this Code. The 2018 and 2019 annual reports 5 may include less detail if election authorities are not 6 equipped to provide complete information to the State Board of Elections. Any report produced under this subsection (o) shall 7 8 exclude any information that identifies any individual 9 personally.

10 (p) The State Board of Elections, in consultation with 11 election authorities, the Office of the Secretary of State, 12 designated automatic voter registration agencies, and 13 community organizations, shall adopt rules as necessary to 14 implement the provisions of this Section.

Sec. 1A-16.10. Electronic voter registration; Secretary of
 State.
 (a) A person who is qualified to register to vote, who

20 <u>currently holds an authentic Illinois driver's license or</u> 21 <u>State identification card issued by the Secretary of State and</u> 22 <u>who is not making any application for a driver's license or</u> 23 <u>identification card, may make application to register to vote</u> 24 <u>at Secretary of State driver services facilities or Secretary</u> 25 <u>of State mobile events. Voter registration of a person making</u>

1 application for a driver's license or identification card 2 shall be conducted pursuant to Section 1A-16.1. 3 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a person 4 who is qualified to register to vote and who holds an authentic 5 Illinois driver's license or State identification card issued by the Secretary of State may submit an application to 6 register to vote electronically on a website maintained by the 7 8 Secretary of State. 9 (c) A voter registration application submitted pursuant to 10 this Section shall be electronically transmitted by the 11 Secretary of State to the State Board of Elections and shall contain the same information the Secretary of State transmits 12 13 to the State Board of Elections for voter registration 14 applications submitted pursuant to Section 1A-16.1. 15 (d) For an applicant's registration or change in 16 registration to be accepted, the applicant shall mark the box associated with the following statement included as part of 17 18 the online voter registration application: 19 "By clicking on the box below, I swear or affirm all of 20 the following: 21 (1) I am the person whose name and identifying information is provided on this form, and I desire to 22 23 register to vote in the State of Illinois. 24 (2) All the information I have provided on this form 25 is true and correct as of the date I am submitting this 26 form.

1	(3) I authorize the Secretary of State to transmit
2	this application and my signature that is on file with the
3	Secretary of State to the State Board of Elections and
4	understand that such signature will be used by my local
5	election authority on this online voter registration
6	application for admission as an elector as if I had signed
7	this form personally."

9	Sec. 1A-16.11. Naturalization ceremony registration.
10	(a) The State Board of Elections and the Office of the
11	Secretary of State shall coordinate with each United States
12	District Court in Illinois for a representative or
13	representatives of the Secretary of State to offer voter
14	registration information, provide voter registration
15	applications, and collect completed voter registration
16	applications, including electronic voter registration
17	applications, from all eligible citizens after the
18	naturalization ceremony, as allowed by the United States
19	District Court presiding over the naturalization.
20	(b) The State Board of Elections and the Office of the
21	Secretary of State may jointly adopt rules to implement this
22	Section.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect January 23 1, 2024.". 24
