19 Such petition shall be signed by qualified primary 20 electors residing in the political division for which the 21 nomination is sought in their own proper persons only and 22 opposite the signature of each signer, his residence address 23 shall be written or printed. The residence address required to 24 be written or printed opposite each qualified primary 25 elector's name shall include the street address or rural route 10300HB3965ham001 -4- LRB103 29598 BMS 58176 a

1 number of the signer, as the case may be, as well as the signer's county, and city, village or town, and state. 2 However, the county or city, village or town, and state of 3 4 residence of the electors may be printed on the petition forms 5 where all of the electors signing the petition reside in the 6 same county or city, village or town, and state. Standard abbreviations may be used in writing the residence address, 7 including street number, if any. At the bottom of each sheet of 8 9 such petition shall be added a circulator statement signed by 10 a person 18 years of age or older who is a citizen of the 11 United States, stating the street address or rural route number, as the case may be, as well as the county, city, 12 13 village or town, and state; and certifying that the signatures 14 on that sheet of the petition were signed in his or her 15 presence and certifying that the signatures are genuine; and 16 either (1) indicating the dates on which that sheet was circulated, or (2) indicating the first and last dates on 17 which the sheet was circulated, or (3) for elections where the 18 petition circulation period is 90 days, certifying that none 19 20 of the signatures on the sheet were signed more than 90 days 21 preceding the last day for the filing of the petition, or (4) 22 for the 2022 general primary election only, certify that the 23 signatures on the sheet were signed during the period of 24 January 13, 2022 through March 14, 2022 or certify that the 25 signatures on the sheet were signed during the period of 26 January 13, 2022 through the date on which this statement was

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1 sworn or affirmed to and certifying that to the best of his or 2 her knowledge and belief the persons so signing were at the 3 time of signing the petitions qualified voters of the 4 political party for which a nomination is sought. Such 5 statement shall be sworn to before some officer authorized to 6 administer oaths in this State.

Except as otherwise provided in this Code, no petition sheet shall be circulated more than 90 days preceding the last day provided in Section 7-12 for the filing of such petition.

10 The person circulating the petition, or the candidate on 11 whose behalf the petition is circulated, may strike any 12 signature from the petition, provided that:

(1) the person striking the signature shall initial
the petition at the place where the signature is struck;
and

(2) the person striking the signature shall sign a
certification listing the page number and line number of
each signature struck from the petition. Such
certification shall be filed as a part of the petition.

Such sheets before being filed shall be neatly fastened together in book form, by placing the sheets in a pile and fastening them together at one edge in a secure and suitable manner, and the sheets shall then be numbered consecutively. The sheets shall not be fastened by pasting them together end to end, so as to form a continuous strip or roll. 1 officials, election authorities or the State Board of Elections shall be the original sheets which have been signed 2 by the voters and by the circulator thereof, and not 3 4 photocopies or duplicates of such sheets. Each petition must 5 include as a part thereof, a statement of candidacy for each of the candidates filing, or in whose behalf the petition is 6 filed. This statement shall set out the address of such 7 8 candidate, an email address for the candidate, the office for 9 which he is a candidate, shall state that the candidate is a 10 qualified primary voter of the party to which the petition 11 relates and is qualified for the office specified (in the case of a candidate for State's Attorney it shall state that the 12 13 candidate is at the time of filing such statement a licensed 14 attorney-at-law of this State), shall state that he has filed 15 (or will file before the close of the petition filing period) a 16 statement of economic interests as required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act, shall request that the candidate's 17 18 name be placed upon the official ballot, and shall be 19 subscribed and sworn to by such candidate before some officer 20 authorized to take acknowledgment of deeds in the State and 21 shall be in substantially the following form:

The petitions, when filed, shall not be withdrawn or added 2 3 to, and no signatures shall be revoked except by revocation 4 filed in writing with the State Board of Elections, election 5 authority or local election official with whom the petition is required to be filed, and before the filing of such petition. 6 7 Whoever forges the name of a signer upon any petition required 8 by this Article is deemed guilty of a forgery and on conviction 9 thereof shall be punished accordingly.

10 A candidate for the offices listed in this Section must 11 obtain the number of signatures specified in this Section on 12 his or her petition for nomination.

(a) Statewide office or delegate to a national nominating convention. Except as otherwise provided in this Code, if a candidate seeks to run for statewide office or as a delegate or alternate delegate to a national nominating convention elected from the State at-large, then the candidate's petition for nomination must contain at least 5,000 but not more than 10,000 signatures.

(b) Congressional office or congressional delegate to a national nominating convention. Except as otherwise provided in this Code, if a candidate seeks to run for United States Congress or as a congressional delegate or alternate congressional delegate to a national nominating convention elected from a congressional district, then the candidate's 10300HB3965ham001 -9- LRB103 29598 BMS 58176 a

1 petition for nomination must contain at least the number of signatures equal to 0.5% of the qualified primary electors of 2 3 his or her party in his or her congressional district. In the 4 first primary election following a redistricting of 5 congressional districts, a candidate's petition for nomination 6 must contain at least 600 signatures of qualified primary electors of the candidate's political party in his or her 7 8 congressional district.

(c) County office. Except as otherwise provided in this 9 10 Code, if a candidate seeks to run for any countywide office, 11 including, but not limited to, county board chairperson or county board member, elected on an at-large basis, in a county 12 13 other than Cook County, then the candidate's petition for 14 nomination must contain at least the number of signatures 15 equal to 0.5% of the qualified electors of his or her party who 16 cast votes at the last preceding general election in his or her county. If a candidate seeks to run for county board member 17 elected from a county board district, then the candidate's 18 petition for nomination must contain at least the number of 19 20 signatures equal to 0.5% of the qualified primary electors of his or her party in the county board district. In the first 21 primary election following a redistricting of county board 22 23 districts or the initial establishment of county board 24 districts, a candidate's petition for nomination must contain 25 at least the number of signatures equal to 0.5% of the 26 qualified electors of his or her party in the entire county who

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1 cast votes at the last preceding general election divided by 2 the total number of county board districts comprising the 3 county board; provided that in no event shall the number of 4 signatures be less than 25.

(d) County office; Cook County only.

6 (1) If a candidate seeks to run for countywide office 7 in Cook County, then the candidate's petition for 8 nomination must contain at least the number of signatures 9 equal to 0.5% of the qualified electors of his or her party 10 who cast votes at the last preceding general election in 11 Cook County.

(2) If a candidate seeks to run for Cook County Board 12 13 Commissioner, then the candidate's petition for nomination 14 must contain at least the number of signatures equal to 15 0.5% of the qualified primary electors of his or her party 16 in his or her county board district. In the first primary 17 election following a redistricting of Cook County Board of Commissioners districts, a candidate's petition for 18 19 nomination must contain at least the number of signatures 20 equal to 0.5% of the qualified electors of his or her party 21 in the entire county who cast votes at the last preceding 22 general election divided by the total number of county 23 board districts comprising the county board; provided that 24 in no event shall the number of signatures be less than 25.

25 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this Code, if a
 26 candidate seeks to run for Cook County Board of Review

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1 Commissioner, which is elected from a district pursuant to subsection (c) of Section 5-5 of the Property Tax Code, 2 3 then the candidate's petition for nomination must contain 4 at least the number of signatures equal to 0.5% of the 5 total number of registered voters in his or her board of review district in the last general election at which a 6 commissioner was regularly scheduled to be elected from 7 that board of review district. In no event shall the 8 9 number of signatures required be greater than the 10 requisite number for a candidate who seeks countywide 11 office in Cook County under subsection (d)(1) of this Section. In the first primary election following a 12 13 redistricting of Cook County Board of Review districts, a 14 candidate's petition for nomination must contain at least 15 4,000 signatures or at least the number of signatures 16 required for a countywide candidate in Cook County, whichever is less, of the qualified electors of his or her 17 18 party in the district.

(e) Municipal or township office. If a candidate seeks to 19 20 run for municipal or township office, then the candidate's petition for nomination must contain at least the number of 21 22 signatures equal to 0.5% of the qualified primary electors of 23 his or her party in the municipality or township. If a 24 candidate seeks to run for alderperson of a municipality, then 25 the candidate's petition for nomination must contain at least 26 the number of signatures equal to 0.5% of the qualified 10300HB3965ham001 -12- LRB103 29598 BMS 58176 a

1 primary electors of his or her party of the ward. In the first primary election following redistricting of wards or trustee 2 districts of a municipality or the initial establishment of 3 4 wards or districts, a candidate's petition for nomination must 5 contain the number of signatures equal to at least 0.5% of the total number of votes cast for the candidate of that political 6 party who received the highest number of votes in the entire 7 8 municipality at the last regular election at which an officer was regularly scheduled to be elected from the entire 9 10 municipality, divided by the number of wards or districts. In 11 no event shall the number of signatures be less than 25.

(f) State central committeeperson. If a candidate seeks to run for State central committeeperson, then the candidate's petition for nomination must contain at least 100 signatures of the primary electors of his or her party of his or her congressional district.

17 (a) Sanitary district trustee. Except as otherwise provided in this Code, if a candidate seeks to run for trustee 18 of a sanitary district in which trustees are not elected from 19 20 wards, then the candidate's petition for nomination must 21 contain at least the number of signatures equal to 0.5% of the 22 primary electors of his or her party from the sanitary 23 district. If a candidate seeks to run for trustee of a sanitary 24 district in which trustees are elected from wards, then the 25 candidate's petition for nomination must contain at least the 26 number of signatures equal to 0.5% of the primary electors of

his or her party in the ward of that sanitary district. In the first primary election following redistricting of sanitary districts elected from wards, a candidate's petition for nomination must contain at least the signatures of 150 gualified primary electors of his or her ward of that sanitary district.

(h) Judicial office. Except as otherwise provided in this 7 8 Code, if a candidate seeks to run for judicial office in a 9 district, then the candidate's petition for nomination must 10 contain the number of signatures equal to 0.4% of the number of votes cast in that district for the candidate for his or her 11 political party for the office of Governor at the last general 12 13 election at which a Governor was elected, but in no event less 14 than 500 signatures. If a candidate seeks to run for judicial office in a circuit or subcircuit, then the candidate's 15 16 petition for nomination must contain the number of signatures equal to 0.25% of the number of votes cast for the judicial 17 candidate of his or her political party who received the 18 highest number of votes at the last general election at which a 19 20 judicial officer from the same circuit or subcircuit was 21 regularly scheduled to be elected, but in no event less than 1,000 signatures in circuits and subcircuits located in the 22 23 First Judicial District or 500 signatures in every other 24 Judicial District.

(i) Precinct, ward, and township committeeperson. Except
as otherwise provided in this Code, if a candidate seeks to run

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1 for precinct committeeperson, then the candidate's petition for nomination must contain at least 10 signatures of the 2 primary electors of his or her party for the precinct. If a 3 4 candidate seeks to run for ward committeeperson, then the 5 candidate's petition for nomination must contain no less than the number of signatures equal to 10% of the primary electors 6 of his or her party of the ward, but no more than 16% of those 7 8 same electors; provided that the maximum number of signatures 9 may be 50 more than the minimum number, whichever is greater. 10 If a candidate seeks to run for township committeeperson, then 11 the candidate's petition for nomination must contain no less than the number of signatures equal to 5% of the primary 12 13 electors of his or her party of the township, but no more than 8% of those same electors; provided that the maximum number of 14 15 signatures may be 50 more than the minimum number, whichever 16 is greater.

(j) State's attorney or regional superintendent of schools for multiple counties. If a candidate seeks to run for State's attorney or regional Superintendent of Schools who serves more than one county, then the candidate's petition for nomination must contain at least the number of signatures equal to 0.5% of the primary electors of his or her party in the territory comprising the counties.

(k) Any other office. If a candidate seeks any other
office, then the candidate's petition for nomination must
contain at least the number of signatures equal to 0.5% of the

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1 registered voters of the political subdivision, district, or 2 division for which the nomination is made or 25 signatures, 3 whichever is greater.

4 For purposes of this Section the number of primary 5 electors shall be determined by taking the total vote cast, in the applicable district, for the candidate for that political 6 party who received the highest number of votes, statewide, at 7 the last general election in the State at which electors for 8 9 President of the United States were elected. For political 10 subdivisions, the number of primary electors shall be 11 determined by taking the total vote cast for the candidate for that political party who received the highest number of votes 12 13 in the political subdivision at the last regular election at which an officer was regularly scheduled to be elected from 14 15 subdivision. For wards or districts of political that 16 subdivisions, the number of primary electors shall be 17 determined by taking the total vote cast for the candidate for that political party who received the highest number of votes 18 in the ward or district at the last regular election at which 19 20 an officer was regularly scheduled to be elected from that ward or district. 21

A "qualified primary elector" of a party may not sign petitions for or be a candidate in the primary of more than one party.

The changes made to this Section by Public Act 93-574 are declarative of existing law, except for item (3) of subsection 1 (d).

Petitions of candidates for nomination for offices herein specified, to be filed with the same officer, may contain the names of 2 or more candidates of the same political party for the same or different offices. In the case of the offices of Governor and Lieutenant Governor, a joint petition including one candidate for each of those offices must be filed.

The receipt issued by the Secretary of State indicating that the candidate has filed the statement of economic interests required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act must be filed with the petitions for nomination as provided in subsection (8) of Section 7-12 of this Code. Except as otherwise provided in this Code, all petitions for nomination for the office of State Senator shall be signed by at least 1,000 but not more than 3,000 of the qualified primary electors of the candidate's party in his legislative district.

Except as otherwise provided in this Code, all petitions for nomination for the office of Representative in the General Assembly shall be signed by at least 500 but not more than 1,500 of the qualified primary electors of the candidate's party in his or her representative district.

11 Opposite the signature of each qualified primary elector who signs a petition for nomination for the office of State 12 Representative or State Senator such elector's residence 13 14 address shall be written or printed. The residence address 15 required to be written or printed opposite each qualified 16 primary elector's name shall include the street address or rural route number of the signer, as the case may be, as well 17 as the signer's county and city, village, or town. 18

For the purposes of this Section, the number of primary electors shall be determined by taking the total vote cast, in the applicable district, for the candidate for such political party who received the highest number of votes, state-wide, at the last general election in the State at which electors for President of the United States were elected.

A "qualified primary elector" of a party may not sign petitions for or be a candidate in the primary of more than one 1 party.

In the affidavit at the bottom of each sheet, the petition 2 3 circulator, who shall be a person 18 years of age or older who 4 is a citizen of the United States, shall state his or her 5 street address or rural route number, as the case may be, as well as his or her county, city, village or town, and state; 6 and shall certify that the signatures on that sheet of the 7 8 petition were signed in his or her presence; and shall certify 9 that the signatures are genuine; and shall certify that, to 10 the best of his or her knowledge and belief, the persons so 11 signing were at the time of signing the petition qualified primary voters for which the nomination is sought. 12

13 In the affidavit at the bottom of each petition sheet, the petition circulator shall either (1) indicate the dates on 14 15 which he or she circulated that sheet, or (2) indicate the 16 first and last dates on which the sheet was circulated, or (3) for elections where the petition circulation period is 90 17 days, certify that none of the signatures on the sheet were 18 signed more than 90 days preceding the last day for the filing 19 20 of the petition, or (4) for the 2022 general primary election only, certify that the signatures on the sheet were signed 21 during the period of January 13, 2022 through March 14, 2022 or 22 23 certify that the signatures on the sheet were signed during 24 the period of January 13, 2022 through the date on which this 25 statement was sworn or affirmed to. If the nomination papers of any candidate and the statement of economic interest of that 6 candidate are not required to be filed with the same officer, 7 the candidate must file with the officer with whom the 8 9 nomination papers are filed a receipt from the officer with 10 whom the statement of economic interests is filed showing the 11 date on which such statement was filed. Such receipt shall be 12 so filed not later than the last day on which nomination papers 13 may be filed.
