Amends the School Code. Makes a technical change in a Section concerning licensure of educators.

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AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
21B-5 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/21B-5)

7 Sec. 21B-5. Licensure powers of the State Board of8 Education.

9 (a) Recognizing <u>that</u> that the education of our citizens is 10 the single most important influence on the prosperity and 11 success of this State and recognizing that new developments in 12 education require a flexible approach to our educational 13 system, the State Board of Education, in consultation with the 14 State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board, shall have the 15 power and authority to do all of the following:

16 (1) Set standards for teaching, supervising, or
17 otherwise holding licensed employment in the public
18 schools of this State and administer the licensure process
19 as provided in this Article.

20 (2) Approve, evaluate, and sanction educator
 21 preparation programs.

22 (3) Enter into agreements with other states relative23 to reciprocal approval of educator preparation programs.

(4) Establish standards for the issuance of new types
 of educator licenses.

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(5) Establish a code of ethics for all educators.

4 (6) Maintain a system of licensure examination aligned
5 with standards determined by the State Board of Education.

6 (7) Take such other action relating to the improvement 7 of instruction in the public schools as is appropriate and 8 consistent with applicable laws.

9 Only the State Board of Education, acting (b) in 10 accordance with the applicable provisions of this Article and 11 rules, shall have the authority to issue or endorse any 12 license required for teaching, supervising, or otherwise holding licensed employment in the public schools; and no 13 14 other State agency shall have any power or authority (i) to 15 establish or prescribe any qualifications or other 16 requirements applicable to the issuance or endorsement of any 17 such license or (ii) to establish or prescribe any licensure or equivalent requirement that must be satisfied in order to 18 19 teach, supervise, or hold licensed employment in the public 20 schools.
