Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Gambling Act is amended by changing Section 5.4 as follows:

- Sec. 5.4. Retired investigators and sworn law enforcement

 personnel Retiring investigators; purchase of service firearm

 and badge.
- (a) The Board shall establish a program to allow an 10 investigator appointed under paragraph (20.6) of subsection 11 (c) of Section 4 who is honorably retiring in good standing to 12 purchase either one or both of the following: (1) any badge 13 14 previously issued to the investigator by the Board; or (2) if the investigator has a currently valid Firearm Owner's 15 16 Identification Card, the service firearm issued or previously 17 issued to the investigator by the Board. The badge must be permanently and conspicuously marked in such a manner that the 18 19 individual who possesses the badge is not mistaken for an actively serving law enforcement officer. The cost of the 20 21 firearm shall be the replacement value of the firearm and not the firearm's fair market value. 22

- (2) issue photographic identification cards to sworn law enforcement personnel employed by the Board who retire in good standing that indicate their separation from service and identify the person as having been employed by the Board as sworn law enforcement personnel.

 re-issue a replacement identification card that meets the

 requirements of paragraph (1) or (2) upon written request by

 the retired sworn law enforcement personnel.
