#### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

730 ILCS 150/4

from Ch. 38, par. 224

Amends the Sex Offender Registration Act. Provides that the Department of Corrections shall notify, in writing, the victim of the offense committed by the sex offender or sexual predator and the law enforcement agencies and State's Attorneys' offices of the county of conviction and the county where the sex offender or sexual predator expects to reside not less than 30 days before the sex offender or sexual predator's release.

1 AN ACT concerning criminal law.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**  
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Sex Offender Registration Act is amended by  
5 changing Section 4 as follows:

6 (730 ILCS 150/4) (from Ch. 38, par. 224)

7 Sec. 4. Discharge of sex offender, as defined in Section 2  
8 of this Act, or sexual predator from Department of Corrections  
9 facility or other penal institution; duties of official in  
10 charge. Any sex offender, as defined in Section 2 of this Act,  
11 or sexual predator, as defined by this Article, who is  
12 discharged, paroled or released from a Department of  
13 Corrections or Department of Juvenile Justice facility, a  
14 facility where such person was placed by the Department of  
15 Corrections or Department of Juvenile Justice or another penal  
16 institution, and whose liability for registration has not  
17 terminated under Section 7 shall, prior to discharge, parole  
18 or release from the facility or institution, be informed of  
19 his or her duty to register in person within 3 days of release  
20 by the facility or institution in which he or she was confined.  
21 The facility or institution shall also inform any person who  
22 must register that if he or she establishes a residence  
23 outside of the State of Illinois, is employed outside of the

1 State of Illinois, or attends school outside of the State of  
2 Illinois, he or she must register in the new state within 3  
3 days after establishing the residence, beginning employment,  
4 or beginning school.

5 The facility shall require the person to read and sign  
6 such form as may be required by the Illinois State Police  
7 stating that the duty to register and the procedure for  
8 registration has been explained to him or her and that he or  
9 she understands the duty to register and the procedure for  
10 registration. The facility shall further advise the person in  
11 writing that the failure to register or other violation of  
12 this Article shall result in revocation of parole, aftercare  
13 release, mandatory supervised release or conditional release.  
14 The facility shall obtain information about where the person  
15 expects to reside, work, and attend school upon his or her  
16 discharge, parole or release and shall report the information  
17 to the Illinois State Police. The facility shall give one copy  
18 of the form to the person and shall send one copy to each of  
19 the law enforcement agencies having jurisdiction where the  
20 person expects to reside, work, and attend school upon his or  
21 her discharge, parole or release and retain one copy for the  
22 files. Electronic data files which includes all notification  
23 form information and photographs of sex offenders being  
24 released from an Illinois Department of Corrections or  
25 Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice facility will be  
26 shared on a regular basis as determined between the Illinois

1 State Police, the Department of Corrections, and Department of  
2 Juvenile Justice.

3 The Department of Corrections shall notify, in writing,  
4 the victim of the offense committed by the sex offender or  
5 sexual predator and the law enforcement agencies and State's  
6 Attorneys' offices of the county of conviction and the county  
7 where the sex offender or sexual predator expects to reside  
8 not less than 30 days before the sex offender or sexual  
9 predator's release.
