2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. 16 Sec. 3-606. Members of General Assembly. Upon receipt of a request of a member of the General Assembly, accompanied by 17 the appropriate application and fee, the Secretary of State 18 19 shall issue to the member 2 plates as described in this 20 Section. The special plates issued under this Section shall be 21 affixed only to passenger vehicles of the first division, 22 motorcycles, autocycles, and motor vehicles of the second division weighing not more than 8,000 pounds. Except as 23

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otherwise provided in this Section, if the member so requests, 1 2 the Secretary shall issue 2 sets of such registration plates 3 for use on 2 different motor vehicles. A member may request that the Secretary of State issue registration plates in the 4 5 name of a corporation when the corporation owns or leases the 6 vehicle to be registered and the member is an officer or director of that corporation. Such registration plates shall 7 8 be issued for a 2-year period beginning January 1 of each 9 odd-numbered year and ending December 31 of the subsequent 10 even-numbered year. If the application is from a member of the 11 Senate, there shall appear on the rear plate, in addition to 12 the designation of the State and the year for which the license was issued, the word "official" and appropriate wording or 13 14 abbreviation indicating that the holder is a member of the 15 Senate, followed by the number of the senatorial district of 16 the member. On the front plate, there shall appear appropriate 17 wording or abbreviation indicating that the holder is a member of the Senate. If the application is from a member of the House 18 19 of Representatives, there shall appear on the rear plate, in 20 addition to the designation of the State and the year for which the license was issued, the word "official" and appropriate 21 22 wording or abbreviation indicating that the holder is a member 23 of the House of Representatives, followed by the number 24 assigned to the member. On the front plate, there shall appear 25 appropriate wording or abbreviation indicating that the holder 26 is a member of the House of Representatives. 1 118 shall be assigned and members with the longest length of 2 service as members of the legislature shall be given the lower 3 numbers.

When members have an equal length of service, the lower numbers shall be given in alphabetical order based on surnames.

7 A member of the General Assembly who has a disability as 8 defined under Section 1-159.1 may request one set of 9 specialized plates which display the International Symbol of 10 Access and shall be subject to the provisions within Section 11 3-616. The set of specialized plates displaying the 12 International Symbol of Access shall only be issued along with the assignment of a corresponding disability placard that must 13 be displayed in the vehicle. The surviving spouse of the 14 15 member shall not be entitled to retain this plate.

Retired members of the General Assembly. 18 19 Upon receipt of a request from a retired member of the General 20 Assembly, accompanied by the appropriate application and fee, 21 the Secretary of State shall issue to such retired member 22 plates bearing appropriate wording or abbreviations indicating that the holder is a retired member of the General Assembly. 23 24 The special plates issued under this Section shall be affixed only to passenger vehicles of the first division, motorcycles, 25

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autocycles, and motor vehicles of the second division weighing 1 2 not more than 8,000 pounds. Such plates may be issued for a 3 2-year 2 year period beginning January 1st of each odd-numbered year and ending December 31st of the subsequent 4 5 even-numbered year. Except as otherwise provided in this Section, upon the death of a retired member who has been issued 6 7 a retired member of the General Assembly plate, that member's 8 surviving spouse shall be entitled to retain the plate so long 9 as the surviving spouse is a resident of Illinois and 10 transfers the registration to his or her name within 90 days of 11 the death of the retired member.

12 A retired member of the General Assembly who has a disability as defined under Section 1-159.1 may request one 13 14 set of specialized plates which display the International 15 Symbol of Access and shall be subject to the provisions within 16 Section 3-616. The set of specialized plates displaying the 17 International Symbol of Access shall only be issued along with the assignment of a corresponding disability placard that must 18 19 be displayed in the vehicle. The surviving spouse of the retired member shall not be entitled to retain this plate. 20

"Retired member" means any individual who (a) has served as a member of the General Assembly for a minimum of 6 years, or (b) is 62 or older, has served as a member of the General Assembly for a minimum of 4 years, and retired prior to the convening of the 83rd General Assembly.

26 The fees and procedures relating to such plates for

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retired members of the General Assembly shall be the same as
 the fees and procedures applicable to personalized plates
 issued under this Code.

Upon receipt of a request from a retired executive branch constitutional officer, accompanied by the appropriate 8 9 application and fee, the Secretary of State shall issue to the 10 retired executive branch constitutional officer plates bearing 11 appropriate wording or abbreviations indicating that the 12 holder is a retired executive branch constitutional officer and the office held. The special plates issued under this 13 Section shall be affixed only to passenger vehicles of the 14 15 first division, motorcycles, autocycles, and motor vehicles of 16 the second division weighing not more than 8,000 pounds. Such plates may be issued for a 2-year period beginning on January 1 17 18 of each odd-numbered year and ending on December 31 of the subsequent even-numbered year. Upon the death of a retired 19 20 executive branch constitutional officer who has been issued a 21 retired executive branch constitutional officer plate, the 22 retired executive branch constitutional officer's surviving spouse shall be entitled to retain the plate so long as the 23 24 surviving spouse is a resident of Illinois and transfers the 25 registration to his or her name within 90 days of the death of

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the retired executive branch constitutional officer. 1 For "retired executive 2 purposes of this Section, branch constitutional officer" means any individual who has served at 3 least one full term of office as (i) Governor; (ii) Lieutenant 4 5 Governor; (iii) Attorney General; (iv) Secretary of State; (v) Comptroller; or (vi) Treasurer; and who was not removed from 6 7 office pursuant to Section 14 of Article IV of the Illinois Constitution of 1970. 8

The special plates issued under this Section shall be affixed only to passenger 7 8 vehicles of the first division, motorcycles, autocycles, and 9 motor vehicles of the second division weighing not more than 10 8,000 pounds. Two duplicate sets of these number plates may be 11 issued if requested and may be used on 2 different motor 12 vehicles. The plates may be 10 issued for a 2-year 2-year period beginning January 1st of each 11 odd-numbered year and ending December 31st of the subsequent 12 even-numbered year. The special plates issued under this 13 Section shall be affixed only to passenger vehicles of the first division, motorcycles, autocycles, and motor vehicles of 14 the second division weighing not more than 8,000 pounds. 15

16 An applicant shall be charged a \$15 fee for original 17 issuance in addition to the applicable registration fee. 15 The Secretary, upon receipt of a request from a (a) 16 municipality or fire protection district that operates a fire department, accompanied by an application and the appropriate 17 fee, may issue, to a fire chief, deputy fire chief, and 18 assistant fire chief of each municipal fire department or fire 19 protection district, special registration plates designated as 20 21 Fire Chief license plates. The special plates issued under 22 this Section shall be affixed only to passenger vehicles of 23 the first division, motorcycles, autocycles, or motor vehicles 24 of the second division weighing not more than 8,000 pounds, 25 owned by the fire department or the fire chief, deputy fire chief, or assistant fire chief of the fire department. Plates issued under this Section shall expire according to the multi-year procedure established by Section 3-414.1 of this Code.

5 (b) The design and color of the special plates shall be 6 wholly within the discretion of the Secretary. The plates are 7 not required to designate "Land of Lincoln" as prescribed in subsection (b) of Section 3-412 of this Code. The Secretary 8 9 may prescribe rules governing the requirements and approval of 10 the special plates. The fee for this plate for a vehicle owned 11 by the fire chief, deputy fire chief, or assistant fire chief 12 shall be the same as the fee prescribed for first division vehicles in Section 3-806 of this Code. Permanent license 13 14 plates for fire chief, deputy fire chief, or assistant fire 15 chief vehicles owned by a municipal fire department or fire 16 protection district shall be issued at the fee prescribed in 17 Section 3-808.1(b).

(c) Any fire chief, deputy fire chief, or assistant fire chief operating warning devices as described in paragraph 2.1 of subsection (a) of Section 12-215 or subsection (b) of Section 12-601 upon a vehicle not owned by a municipality or fire protection district shall display license plates as described in this Section.

(d) With the exception of permanently issued license
plates, upon the resignation, termination, or reassignment to
a rank other than fire chief, deputy fire chief, or assistant

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fire chief, a person issued plates under this Section shall immediately surrender the license plate to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall have the ability to recover license plates issued under this Section.

Any resident of Illinois, being a member of the Official Presidential 8 9 Inaugural Committee, may, during the period from January 10 through February 15th of any year in which the President of the 11 United States is being inaugurated, display a special 12 inauqural license plate furnished by such person in lieu of the current and valid Illinois license plate issued to a motor 13 vehicle of the first division, motorcycle, or autocycle owned 14 15 such person, provided that the official inaugural by 16 credentials or a valid certificate thereof acceptable to the Secretary of State and the valid and current Illinois license 17 plates and registration card issued to such motor vehicle are 18 19 simultaneously carried within such vehicle and available for 20 inspection.

Secretary, upon receipt of an application made on the form

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prescribed by the Secretary of State, may issue Illinois 1 2 Honorary Consular license plates to any person who is a non-resident and an official or employee of the Coordination 3 Council for North American Affairs as recognized in the Taiwan 4 5 Relation Act, Public Law 96-8, and serving that 6 instrumentality and temporarily residing in this State. The 7 special plates issued under this Section shall be affixed only to passenger vehicles of the first division, motorcycles, 8 9 autocycles, and motor vehicles of the second division weighing 10 not more than 8,000 pounds. In addition, these plates may be 11 issued to United States nationals or permanent residents who 12 are appointed Honorary Consular officers and confirmed by the 13 Federal Department of State.

14 Such registration plates may be issued for a <u>2-year</u> 2 year 15 period beginning January 1 of each odd-numbered year and 16 ending December 31 of the subsequent even-numbered year. 17 Applicants shall verify their status as Honorary Consular or 18 Taiwanese representatives on forms provided by the Department 19 of State.

In the event any holder of such registration plates or card leaves this State or no longer serves as an Honorary Consular or Taiwanese official or employee, the registration plates and card issued to such persons shall terminate and the owner shall remove such plates from the vehicle so registered and return them and the registration card to the Secretary of State. 5 (a) Upon receiving an application for a certificate of 6 registration for a motor vehicle of the first division, a 7 motorcycle, an autocycle, or for a motor vehicle of the second division weighing no more than 8,000 pounds, accompanied with 8 9 payment of the registration fees required under this Code from 10 a person with disabilities or a person who is deaf or hard of 11 hearing, the Secretary of State, if so requested, shall issue to such person registration plates as provided for in Section 12 13 3-611, provided that the person with disabilities or person 14 who is deaf or hard of hearing must not be disgualified from 15 obtaining a driver's license under subsection 8 of Section 16 6-103 of this Code, and further provided that any person making such a request must submit a statement, certified by a 17 18 licensed physician, by a licensed physician assistant, or by a 19 licensed advanced practice registered nurse, to the effect 20 that such person is a person with disabilities as defined by 21 Section 1-159.1 of this Code, or alternatively provide 22 adequate documentation that such person has a Class 1A, Class 2A or Type Four disability under the provisions of Section 4A 23 24 of the Illinois Identification Card Act. For purposes of this 25 Section, an Illinois Person with a Disability Identification

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Card issued pursuant to the Illinois Identification Card Act
 indicating that the person thereon named has a disability
 shall be adequate documentation of such a disability.

(b) The Secretary shall issue plates under this Section to 4 5 a parent or legal quardian of a person with disabilities if the person with disabilities has a Class 1A or Class 2A disability 6 as defined in Section 4A of the Illinois Identification Card 7 8 Act or is a person with disabilities as defined by Section 9 1-159.1 of this Code, and does not possess a vehicle 10 registered in his or her name, provided that the person with disabilities relies frequently on the parent or legal quardian 11 12 for transportation. Only one vehicle per family may be registered under this subsection, unless the applicant can 13 14 justify in writing the need for one additional set of plates. 15 Any person requesting special plates under this subsection 16 shall submit such documentation or such physician's, physician 17 assistant's, or advanced practice registered nurse's statement as is required in subsection (a) and a statement describing 18 19 the circumstances qualifying for issuance of special plates 20 under this subsection. An optometrist may certify a Class 2A Visual Disability, as defined in Section 4A of the Illinois 21 22 Identification Card Act, for the purpose of qualifying a 23 person with disabilities for special plates under this 24 subsection.

(c) The Secretary may issue a parking decal or device to a
 person with disabilities as defined by Section 1-159.1 without

regard to qualification of such person with disabilities for a 1 2 driver's license or registration of a vehicle by such person 3 with disabilities or such person's immediate family, provided such person with disabilities making such a request has been 4 5 issued an Illinois Person with a Disability Identification 6 Card indicating that the person named thereon has a Class 1A or Class 2A disability, or alternatively, submits a statement 7 8 certified by a licensed physician, or by a licensed physician 9 assistant or a licensed advanced practice registered nurse as 10 provided in subsection (a), to the effect that such person is a 11 person with disabilities as defined by Section 1-159.1. An 12 optometrist may certify a Class 2A Visual Disability as 13 defined in Section 4A of the Illinois Identification Card Act 14 for the purpose of qualifying a person with disabilities for a 15 parking decal or device under this subsection.

16 (d) The Secretary shall prescribe by rules and regulations 17 procedures to certify or re-certify as necessary the eligibility of persons whose disabilities are other than 18 permanent for special plates or parking decals or devices 19 20 issued under subsections (a), (b) and (c). Except as provided under subsection (f) of this Section, no such special plates, 21 22 decals or devices shall be issued by the Secretary of State to 23 or on behalf of any person with disabilities unless such 24 person is certified as meeting the definition of a person with 25 disabilities pursuant to Section 1-159.1 or meeting the 26 requirement of a Type Four disability as provided under

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Section 4A of the Illinois Identification Card Act for the 1 2 period of time that the physician, or the physician assistant 3 advanced practice registered nurse as provided in or subsection (a), determines the applicant will have the 4 5 disability, but not to exceed 6 months from the date of certification or recertification. 6

7 (e) Any person requesting special plates under this
8 Section may also apply to have the special plates
9 personalized, as provided under Section 3-405.1.

10 (f) The Secretary of State, upon application, shall issue 11 disability registration plates or a parking decal to 12 corporations, school districts, State or municipal agencies, 13 limited liability companies, nursing homes, convalescent homes, or special education cooperatives which will transport 14 persons with disabilities. The Secretary shall prescribe by 15 16 rule a means to certify or re-certify the eligibility of 17 organizations to receive disability plates or decals and to designate which of the 2 person with disabilities emblems 18 19 shall be placed on gualifying vehicles.

(g) The Secretary of State, or his designee, may enter into agreements with other jurisdictions, including foreign jurisdictions, on behalf of this State relating to the extension of parking privileges by such jurisdictions to residents of this State with disabilities who display a special license plate or parking device that contains the International symbol of access on his or her motor vehicle,

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and to recognize such plates or devices issued by such other 1 2 jurisdictions. This State shall grant the same parking privileges which are granted to residents of this State with 3 disabilities to any non-resident whose motor vehicle is 4 5 licensed in another state, district, territory or foreign country if such vehicle displays the international symbol of 6 7 access or a distinguishing insignia on license plates or parking device issued in accordance with the laws of the 8 9 non-resident's state, district, territory or foreign country. 13 Sec. 3-627. Environmental License Plate.

14 (a) The Secretary, upon receipt of an application made in 15 the form prescribed by the Secretary of State, may issue 16 special registration plates designated to be environmental license plates. The special plates issued under this Section 17 shall be affixed only to passenger vehicles of the first 18 division, motorcycles, autocycles, motor vehicles of the 19 20 second division weighing not more than 8,000 pounds, and, as 21 of January 1, 1996, recreational vehicles as defined by 22 Section 1-169 of this Code. Plates issued under this Section shall expire according to the multi-year procedure established 23 24 by Section 3-414.1 of this Code.

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(b) The design and color of the plates shall be wholly

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within the discretion of the Secretary of State. Appropriate documentation, as determined by the Secretary, shall accompany the application. As of January 1, 1996, the Secretary may, in his or her discretion, allow the plates to be issued as vanity or personalized plates in accordance with Section 3-405.1 of this Code.

7 (c) An applicant shall be charged a \$40 fee for original 8 issuance in addition to the appropriate registration fee, if 9 applicable. Of this fee, \$25 shall be deposited into the State 10 Parks Fund and \$15 shall be deposited into the Secretary of 11 State Special License Plate Fund, to be used by the Secretary 12 of State to help defray the administrative processing costs. For each registration renewal period, a \$27 fee, in addition 13 to the appropriate registration fee, shall be charged. Of this 14 15 fee, \$25 shall be deposited into the State Parks Fund and \$2 16 shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special License 17 Plate Fund.

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Sec. 3-629. Collegiate license plates; scholarship fund.

(a) In addition to any other special license plate, the
 Secretary, upon receipt of all applicable fees and
 applications made in the form prescribed by the Secretary of
 State, may issue collegiate license plates. The collegiate

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plates issued under this Section shall be affixed only to passenger vehicles of the first division, motorcycles, autocycles, and motor vehicles of the second division weighing not more than 8,000 pounds and subject to the staggered registration system. Plates issued under this Section shall expire according to the staggered multi-year procedure established under Section 3-414.1 of this Code.

8 (b) The design, color, and format of the plates shall be 9 wholly within the discretion of the Secretary of State. The 10 Secretary of State may, at his or her discretion, issue the 11 plates for any public college or university located in this 12 State or for any degree-granting, not-for-profit private college or university located in this State or a contiguous 13 state. If the college or university is located in a contiguous 14 15 state, there must be not less than 10,000 alumni of the college 16 or university residing in this State. The Secretary may, in 17 his or her discretion, allow the plates to be issued as vanity plates or personalized in accordance with Section 3-405.1 of 18 this Code. The plates are not required to designate "Land Of 19 20 Lincoln", as prescribed in subsection (b) of Section 3-412 of this Code. The Secretary shall prescribe the eligibility 21 22 requirements including a minimum level of specialized license 23 plates requests and, in his or her discretion, shall approve and prescribe stickers or decals as provided under Section 24 25 3-412.

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(c) An applicant shall be charged a \$40 fee for original

issuance in addition to the applicable registration fee. Of 1 2 the original issuance fee in the case of a public university or 3 college, \$25 shall be deposited into the State College and University Trust Fund and \$15 shall be deposited into the 4 5 Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund to be used by the Secretary of State, subject to appropriation, to help defray 6 the administrative costs of issuing the plate. Of the original 7 8 issuance fee in the case of a degree-granting, not-for-profit 9 private college or university, \$25 shall be deposited into the 10 University Grant Fund and \$15 shall be deposited into the 11 Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund to be used by the 12 Secretary of State, subject to appropriation, to help defray the administrative cost of issuing the plate.
