1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 5643

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 5643, AS AMENDED,
3 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the
4 following:

5 "Section 5. The State Employees Group Insurance Act of
6 1971 is amended by changing Section 6.11 as follows:

7 (5 ILCS 375/6.11)

8 Sec. 6.11. Required health benefits; Illinois Insurance
9 Code requirements. The program of health benefits shall
10 provide the post-mastectomy care benefits required to be
11 covered by a policy of accident and health insurance under
12 Section 356t of the Illinois Insurance Code. The program of
13 health benefits shall provide the coverage required under
14 Sections 356g, 356g.5, 356g.5-1, 356m, 356q, 356u, 356w, 356x,
15 356z.2, 356z.4, 356z.4a, 356z.6, 356z.8, 356z.9, 356z.10,
16 356z.11, 356z.12, 356z.13, 356z.14, 356z.15, 356z.17, 356z.22,

1 356z.25, 356z.26, 356z.29, 356z.30a, 356z.32, 356z.33,
2 356z.36, 356z.40, 356z.41, 356z.45, 356z.46, 356z.47, 356z.51,
3 356z.53, 356z.54, 356z.55, 356z.56, 356z.57, 356z.59, 356z.60,
4 ~~and 356z.61, and 356z.62,~~ 356z.64, 356z.67, 356z.68, 356z.70,
5 and 356z.71 of the Illinois Insurance Code. The program of
6 health benefits must comply with Sections 155.22a, 155.37,
7 355b, 356z.19, 370c, and 370c.1 and Article XXXIIB of the
8 Illinois Insurance Code. The program of health benefits shall
9 provide the coverage required under Section 356m of the
10 Illinois Insurance Code and, for the employees of the State
11 Employee Group Insurance Program only, the coverage as also
12 provided in Section 6.11B of this Act. The Department of
13 Insurance shall enforce the requirements of this Section with
14 respect to Sections 370c and 370c.1 of the Illinois Insurance
15 Code; all other requirements of this Section shall be enforced
16 by the Department of Central Management Services.

17 Rulemaking authority to implement Public Act 95-1045, if
18 any, is conditioned on the rules being adopted in accordance
19 with all provisions of the Illinois Administrative Procedure
20 Act and all rules and procedures of the Joint Committee on
21 Administrative Rules; any purported rule not so adopted, for
22 whatever reason, is unauthorized.

6 Section 10. The Illinois Insurance Code is amended by
7 adding Section 356z.71 as follows:

8 (215 ILCS 5/356z.71 new)

9 Sec. 356z.71. Coverage for at-home pregnancy tests. A
10 group or individual policy of accident and health insurance or
11 a managed care plan that is amended, delivered, issued, or
12 renewed on or after January 1, 2026 shall provide coverage for
13 at-home, urine-based pregnancy tests that are prescribed to
14 the covered person, regardless of whether the tests are
15 otherwise available over-the-counter. The coverage required
16 under this Section is limited to 2 at-home, urine-based
17 pregnancy tests every 30 days.

18 Section 15. The Illinois Public Aid Code is amended by
19 adding Section 5-5.24a as follows:

20 (305 ILCS 5/5-5.24a new)

21 Sec. 5-5.24a. Coverage for at-home pregnancy tests.
22 Beginning January 1, 2025, the medical assistance program

1 shall provide coverage for at-home, urine-based pregnancy
2 tests that are ordered directly by a clinician or furnished
3 through a standing order for patient use, regardless of
4 whether the tests are otherwise available over the counter.
5 The coverage required under this Section is limited to a
6 multipack, as defined by the Department, of at-home,
7 urine-based pregnancy tests every 30 days.

8 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect January
9 1, 2025."
