SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Makes appropriations for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Law Enforcement Training Standards Board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, as follows:

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A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and purposes
7 hereinafter named, are appropriated to meet the ordinary and
8 contingent expenses of the Law Enforcement Training Standards
9 Board:

11 Payable from the Police Training Board Services Fund:

17 Payable from the Law Enforcement Training Fund:

2 Section 10. The following named amount, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and purposes
4 hereinafter named, is appropriated to the Law Enforcement
5 Training Standards Board as follows:

6 GRANTS-IN-AID

7 Payable from the Traffic and Criminal
8 Conviction Surcharge Fund:

9 For payment of and/or reimbursement
10 of basic training and basic training services
11 in accordance with statutory provisions10,290,000

12 For payment of and/or reimbursement
13 of in-service training and in-service training services
14 in accordance with statutory provisions17,220,000

15 Section 15. The sum of \$8,000,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Law Enforcement
17 Officers Training Board Federal Projects Fund to the Law
18 Enforcement Training Standards Board for expenses relating to
19 various federal projects.

20 Section 20. The amount of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof
21 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Law Enforcement
22 Recruitment and Retention Fund to the Law Enforcement Training

1 Standards Board for grants and administrative expenses to hire
2 or retain law enforcement officers pursuant to Public Act 102-
3 755.

4 Section 25. The sum of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
6 on June 30 2024, from an appropriation heretofore made for such
7 purposes in Article 94, Section 35 of Public Act 103-0006, as
8 amended is reappropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the
9 Law Enforcement Training Standards Board for grants to local
10 law enforcement agencies for costs associated with the
11 expansion and support of National Integrated Ballistics
12 Information Network (NIBIN) and other ballistic technology
13 equipment for ballistic testing.

14 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
15 2024.
