WHEREAS, According to a report by NBC 5 Chicago, as of September 30, 2021, a total of 185 expressway shootings happened in the Chicago region, more than double the 83 the area had seen by the same date the previous year, which is a fincrease over the 128 shootings the region experienced in all of 2020; and

- WHEREAS, By September 30, 2021, at least 85 people have been wounded in expressway shootings, and 16 have been killed; and
- 11 WHEREAS, According to the Illinois State Police, a very
 12 small percentage of expressway shootings in the Chicago area
 13 are cases of road rage; the shootings are opportunistic, where
 14 somebody has a problem with somebody else and they cross paths
 15 on the interstate; and
- 16 WHEREAS, One suggestion that has been put forth to deter
 17 crime on the Chicago expressways is to convert expressways
 18 into toll roads, but that idea may be illegal; the 1956
 19 Interstate Highway Act generally bans tolling on interstates;
 20 and
- 21 WHEREAS, Throughout the years, Congress has authorized

- 1 pilot programs under which states can start collecting tolls
- on existing interstates to fund improvements on those roads,
- 3 but only for the purpose of road improvements; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The Dan Ryan Expressway I-57 is a high traffic
- 5 expressway where numerous shootings have occurred, and a state
- 6 tollway system could serve to reduce violence by making it
- 7 more difficult for these opportunistic shootings to take
- 8 place; therefore, be it
- 9 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE
- 10 HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that
- 11 we call on the U.S. Congress to authorize a policy change to
- 12 allow existing interstates built with federal funding to
- 13 become state tollways, enabling Illinois to convert the Dan
- 14 Ryan Expressway I-57 into a toll road for the safety of its
- 15 citizens; and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be
- 17 delivered to the President of the United States, the U.S.
- 18 Senate Majority Leader, the U.S. Senate Minority Leader, the
- 19 U.S. Speaker of the House, the U.S. House of Representatives
- 20 Minority Leader, and all members of the Illinois Congressional
- 21 Delegation.
