1 HOUSE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, There are nearly one million people living with 3 cerebral palsy in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Cerebral palsy is a group of neurological disorders affecting motor and developmental skills, and it is neither a genetic nor contagious condition; rather, it is caused due to brain damage or abnormal brain development during gestation, birth, or soon thereafter; and

WHEREAS, The symptoms of cerebral palsy vary greatly from individual to individual, and 75% of individuals with cerebral palsy also have one or more developmental disabilities, including epilepsy, intellectual disability, autism, visual impairment, or blindness; and

WHEREAS, Cerebral palsy is the most common motor disability in children; according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), approximately 1 in 345 children in the United States have been diagnosed with cerebral palsy; and

WHEREAS, In 2006, National Cerebral Palsy Awareness Month was established by Reaching for the Stars (RFTS), a non-profit educational advocacy group led by parent volunteers under the

- 2 held annually in March to provide an educational opportunity
- 3 for those outside the cerebral palsy community to learn about
- 4 the condition and about life with cerebral palsy; and
- 5 WHEREAS, National Cerebral Palsy Awareness Month further
- 6 encourages individuals to consider ways to be more inclusive
- 7 towards those who live with the condition; most importantly,
- 8 the observance allows people to learn how they can become
- 9 long-term allies of the cerebral palsy community; and
- 10 WHEREAS, National Cerebral Palsy Awareness Day is also
- observed every year on March 25th; therefore, be it
- 12 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE
- 13 HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that
- 14 we declare the month of March 2024 as Cerebral Palsy Awareness
- 15 Month in the State of Illinois; and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be
- 17 presented to the Cerebral Palsy Foundation and United Cerebral
- 18 Palsy with our sincere appreciation for their efforts.
