- 2 WHEREAS, Celiac disease is one of the world's most 3 prevalent genetic autoimmune diseases, affecting an estimated 4 three million Americans, 70-80% of whom are undiagnosed; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Celiac disease causes the body to attack its own 6 small intestine, which can lead to many other devastating 7 health conditions, including cancer; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Celiac disease results in extraordinary economic 9 and productivity costs to both the public and private sectors 10 from employee and student absenteeism, as well as repeated, 11 inconclusive visits to healthcare providers; and
- 12 WHEREAS, On average, it takes four years to be correctly 13 diagnosed with celiac disease; and
- 14 WHEREAS, There is no medication or cure for celiac 15 disease; the only treatment is a lifelong, strict gluten-free 16 diet; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Studies show that up to 50% of people on a 18 gluten-free diet continue to experience symptoms and have 19 intestinal damage, revealing the ineffectiveness of the 20 gluten-free diet as a treatment; therefore, be it
