SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/10-20.85 new 105 ILCS 5/34-18.82 new

Amends the School Code. Beginning with the 2023-2024 school year, requires school boards to report, on their school district's website, a list of the learning materials and activities to be used for student instruction during the school year. Requires that the report also include any procedures that are in effect at each school for the documentation, review, or approval of the learning materials and activities used for student instruction. Specifies the minimum information that must be included in the report. Allows a school district to update the report on an ongoing basis, but requires the report to be updated by January 1 and August 1 of each year. Allows a school district to utilize collaborative online document or spreadsheet software to update or make additions to the report. Sets forth other requirements. Effective immediately.

STATE MANDATES ACT MAY REQUIRE REIMBURSEMENT 1 AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 1. This Act may be referred to as the School

 Materials and Activities Report for Transparency Law.
- Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Sections 10-20.85 and 34-18.82 as follows:

- (b) Beginning with the 2023-2024 school year, the school board of each school district shall report for each of the district's schools the following information in a prominent location on the district's website:
 - (1) A list of the learning materials and activities that are to be used for student instruction during the school year. The list of learning materials and activities shall be organized, at a minimum, by grade level and subject area.
 - (2) Any procedures that are in effect at each school for the documentation, review, or approval by the school's administrators, principal, or teachers of the learning materials and activities used for student instruction.
- (c) Under this Section, a school board shall provide updated information on the district's website by January 1 and August 1 of each year and more frequently as the school board deems appropriate. A school board is required to report only the information that is necessary to identify the specific learning materials and activities used for student instruction at each school. The information reported must include the title and the author, the name of the organization, or the
