1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 698

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend Senate Bill 698 on page 1, by

3 replacing lines 4 and 5 with the following:

4 "Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the

5 Highway Work Zone Safety Act.

6 Section 5. Definitions. As used in this Act:

"Automatic traffic control system" means a photographic device, radar device, laser device, or other electrical or mechanical device or devices designed to record the speed of a vehicle and obtain a clear photograph or other recorded image of the vehicle, the vehicle operator, and the vehicle's registration plate or digital registration plate while the driver is violating Section 11-605.1 of the Illinois Vehicle Code. The photograph or other recorded image must also display the time, date, and location of the violation. A law enforcement officer is not required to be present or to

- 1 witness the violation.
- 2 "Construction or maintenance speed zone" has the same
- 3 meaning given to that term under Section 11-605.1 of the
- 4 Illinois Vehicle Code.
- 5 "Motor vehicle rental company" has the meaning given to
- 6 that term under Section 6-305.3 of the Illinois Vehicle Code.
- 7 "Owner" means a person in whose name a motor vehicle is
- 8 registered under the laws of this State, another state, or a
- 9 foreign country or under the International Registration Plan.
- 10 "Program" means the Highway Work Zone Speed Control
- 11 Program created under this Act.
- "Work zone speed limit" means a temporary speed limit
- 13 established for a work zone by (i) the Illinois Department of
- 14 Transportation and the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority,
- or (ii) a unit of local government that has jurisdiction over
- 16 the work zone.
- 17 Section 10. Highway Work Zone Speed Control Program.
- 18 (a) The Illinois Department of Transportation, in
- 19 coordination with the Illinois State Police, shall establish
- 20 the Highway Work Zone Speed Control Program for the purposes
- of enforcing the speed limits established for construction or
- 22 maintenance speed zones.
- 23 (b) The Illinois Department of Transportation shall
- 24 administer the Program in coordination with the Illinois State
- 25 Police and the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority.

- 1 (c) The Illinois State Police and the Illinois Department
- 2 of Transportation shall enter into an agreement to share
- 3 information regarding the Program.
- 4 (d) The Illinois Department of Transportation may enter
- 5 into an agreement with a third-party vendor to assist in the
- 6 administration of the Program.
- 7 Section 15. Procedures.
- 8 (a) The Illinois State Police, in conjunction with the
- 9 Illinois Department of Transportation and the Illinois State
- 10 Toll Highway Authority, shall set up and operate automated
- 11 traffic control systems in highway construction and
- 12 maintenance speed zones to detect violations of posted work
- 13 zone speed limits.
- 14 (b) Before setting up an automated traffic control system
- for the purposes of the Program:
- 16 (1) the Illinois State Police and the Illinois
- 17 Department of Transportation may conduct a public
- information campaign to inform drivers about the use of
- 19 automated traffic control systems to detect speeds in
- 20 excess of a work zone speed limit; and
- 21 (2) signs indicating that work zone speeds are
- 22 enforced by automated traffic control systems shall be
- clearly posted in the areas where the systems are or will
- be in use.

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- 1 Section 20. Automated traffic control system operator requirements; duties; restrictions. The Illinois Department of 2 3 Transportation or the Illinois State Police may employ 4 automated traffic control system operators to 5 automated traffic control systems in construction Illinois 6 maintenance speed zones. The Department Transportation may adopt any rules necessary to establish 7 8 requirements, duties, or restrictions concerning automated 9 traffic control system operators.
- 10 Section 25. Photograph and recorded images; permitted and nonpermitted uses. 11
 - (a) Except as otherwise provided in this Act, information and photographs or recorded images collected under the Program are not discoverable by court order as evidence in a proceeding except to assess a penalty under Section 30 of this Act.
 - Information and a photograph or recorded image collected under the Program must be destroyed not later than 2 years after the date the information and photograph or recorded image is collected.
 - Notwithstanding any other provision information and photographs or recorded images collected under the Program are the exclusive property of the State and not the property of the manufacturer or vendor of the automated traffic control system.

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- 1 (d) Except as otherwise provided under the Illinois
 2 Vehicle Code or this Act, use of a photograph or recorded image
 3 obtained through the use of an automated traffic control
 4 system for the purpose of enforcing a traffic offense is
 5 prohibited.
 - (e) A photograph or recorded image obtained through the use of an automated traffic control system may not be used as evidence in any action other than an action to collect a work zone speed limit fine for which the photograph or recorded image was obtained.
 - (f) A photograph or recorded image obtained through the use of an automated traffic control system may be used internally to administer the Program. However, unless authorized by court order, a photograph or recorded image obtained through the use of an automated traffic control system may not be disclosed to anyone other than:
 - (1) the owner of the motor vehicle at the time the recorded speed of the motor vehicle exceeded a work zone speed limit;
 - (2) an individual alleged to have been operating the motor vehicle at the time the work zone speed limit was exceeded;
 - (3) an attorney representing an individual;
- 24 (4) a law enforcement officer;
- 25 (5) the Illinois State Police, the Illinois State Toll 26 Highway Authority, or the Illinois Department of

1 Transportation;	or
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2 (6) a court.

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- 3 (g) The information and recorded images collected under 4 the Program are confidential and exempt from disclosure under 5 the Freedom of Information Act.
- 6 Section 30. Civil law violation.
 - (a) A person who owns a motor vehicle that is identified by an automated traffic control system as operating in a construction or maintenance speed zone at a speed in excess of the posted speed limit commits a civil law violation.
 - (b) A person found to have committed a violation in subsection (a) or subsection (c):
 - (1) is guilty of a civil law violation punishable by a minimum fine of \$100 and a maximum fine of \$200. The proceeds of the fine shall be payable to the clerk of the circuit court. Within one month after the deposit of the fine, the clerk shall distribute the proceeds of the fine as follows:
 - (A) \$10 of the fine to the circuit clerk;
 - (B) \$10 of the fine to the State's Attorney;
- 21 (C) \$50 of the fine to the Transportation Safety
 22 Highway Hire-back Fund in the State treasury;
- 23 (D) any remainder of the fine to the State Police 24 Vehicle Fund in the State treasury.
 - (2) With respect to funds designated for the Illinois

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- State Police, the moneys shall be remitted by the circuit court clerk to the Illinois State Police within one month after receipt for deposit into the State Police Vehicle Fund.
 - (3) With respect to moneys designated for the Illinois Department of Transportation, the moneys shall be remitted by the circuit court clerk to the Illinois Department of Transportation within one month after receipt for deposit into the Transportation Safety Highway Hire-back Fund.
 - (c) A person found to have committed a third or subsequent violation of subsection (a), and found to have failed to pay all fines and costs within 30 days of the last judgment, commits a separate civil law violation. The State may proceed with collections in accordance with the law against a person who is guilty under this Act but has failed to pay all fines and costs.
- 17 Section 35. Vehicle rental or leasing company's identification of a renter or lessee.
 - (a) A civil law violation issued under this Act to a motor vehicle rental or leasing company shall be dismissed with respect to the rental or leasing company if:
 - (1) the company responds to the civil law violation by submitting, within 30 days of the mailing of the citation, an affidavit of non-liability stating that, at the time of the alleged speeding or other traffic violation, the

- 1 vehicle was in the custody and control of a renter or
- lessee under the terms of a rental agreement or lease; and
- 3 (2) the company provides the driver's license number,
- and address of the renter or lessee.
- 5 (b) A civil law violation dismissed with respect to a
- 6 motor vehicle rental or leasing company in accordance with
- 7 subsection (a) may then be issued and delivered by mail or
- 8 other means to the renter or lessee identified in the
- 9 affidavit of non-liability.
- 10 Section 40. Procurement. The Illinois Department of
- 11 Transportation may procure such as is necessary to implement
- 12 and administer this Act.
- 13 Section 45. Rulemaking. The Illinois Department of
- 14 Transportation shall adopt rules to implement and administer
- 15 this Act.
- Section 900. The Freedom of Information Act is amended by

- 23 Section 905. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
- 24 changing Sections 3-400, 11-208.8, and 11-612 as follows:

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1 (625 ILCS 5/3-400) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 3-400)

Sec. 3-400. Definitions. Notwithstanding the definitions set forth in Chapter 1 of this Act, for the purposes of this Article, the following words shall have the meaning ascribed to them as follows:

"Apportionable Fee" means any periodic recurring fee required for licensing or registering vehicles, such as, but not limited to, registration fees, license or weight fees.

"Apportionable Vehicle" means any vehicle, except recreational vehicles, vehicles displaying restricted plates, city pickup and delivery vehicles, buses used transportation of chartered parties, and government owned vehicles that are used or intended for use in 2 or more member jurisdictions that allocate or proportionally register vehicles, in a fleet which is used for the transportation of persons for hire or the transportation of property and which has a gross vehicle weight in excess of 26,000 pounds; or has three or more axles regardless of weight; or is used in combination when the weight of such combination exceeds 26,000 pounds gross vehicle weight. Vehicles, or combinations having a gross vehicle weight of 26,000 pounds or less and two-axle vehicles may be proportionally registered at the option of such owner.

"Base Jurisdiction" means, for purposes of fleet registration, the jurisdiction where the registrant has an established place of business, where operational records of

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the fleet are maintained and where mileage is accrued by the fleet. In case a registrant operates more than one fleet, and maintains records for each fleet in different places, the "base jurisdiction" for a fleet shall be the jurisdiction where an established place of business is maintained, where records of the operation of that fleet are maintained and where mileage is accrued by that fleet.

"Operational Records" means documents supporting miles traveled in each jurisdiction and total miles traveled, such as fuel reports, trip leases, and logs.

"Owner" means a person who holds legal title of a motor vehicle, or in the event a motor vehicle is the subject of an agreement for the conditional sale or lease thereof with the right of purchase upon performance of the conditions stated in the agreement and with an immediate right of possession vested in the conditional vendee or lessee with right of purchase, or in the event a mortgagor of such motor vehicle is entitled to possession, or in the event a lessee of such motor vehicle is entitled to possession or control, then such conditional vendee or lessee with right of purchase or mortgagor or lessee is considered to be the owner for the purpose of this Act.

"Registration plate or digital registration plate cover" means any tinted, colored, painted, marked, clear, or illuminated object that is designed to (i) cover any of the characters of a motor vehicle's registration plate or digital registration plate; or (ii) distort a recorded image of any of

- 1 the characters of a motor vehicle's registration plate or
- 2 digital registration plate recorded by an automated
- 3 enforcement system as defined in Section 11-208.6, 11-208.8,
- 4 or 11-1201.1 of this Code or recorded by an automated traffic
- 5 control system as defined in Section 5 of the Highway Work Zone
- 6 Safety Act. 15 of the Automated Traffic Control Systems in
- 7 Highway Construction or Maintenance Zones Act.
- 8 "Rental Owner" means an owner principally engaged, with
- 9 respect to one or more rental fleets, in renting to others or
- 10 offering for rental the vehicles of such fleets, without

- Sec. 11-612. Certain systems to record vehicle speeds
- 23 prohibited. Except as authorized in the Highway Work Zone
- 24 <u>Safety Act</u> Automated Traffic Control Systems in Highway

1 Construction or Maintenance Zones Act and Section 11-208.8 of this Code, no photographic, video, or other imaging system may 2 3 be used in this State to record vehicle speeds for the purpose 4 of enforcing any law or ordinance regarding a maximum or 5 minimum speed limit unless a law enforcement officer is present at the scene and witnesses the event. No State or local 6 governmental entity, including a home rule county or 7 8 municipality, may use such a system in a way that is prohibited 9 by this Section. The regulation of the use of such systems is 10 an exclusive power and function of the State. This Section is a 11 denial and limitation of home rule powers and functions under subsection (h) of Section 6 of Article VII of the Illinois 12 13 Constitution.

Section 995. No acceleration or delay. Where this Act makes changes in a statute that is represented in this Act by text that is not yet or no longer in effect (for example, a Section represented by multiple versions), the use of that text does not accelerate or delay the taking effect of (i) the changes made by this Act or (ii) provisions derived from any other Public Act.

Section 999. Effective date. This Act takes effect January 1 1, 2027, except that this Section, Sections 40 and 45, and the amendatory changes to Section 11-208.8 of the Illinois Vehicle 3 Code take effect upon becoming law.".
