1 primary election, except that in 2022 the period shall begin 2 on May 15, 2022, and ending the day after the general primary election and during a period beginning September 1 of the year 3 4 of a general election and ending the day after the general 5 election, any newsletters or brochures that were printed, at 6 any time, by the Legislative Printing Unit, except that such a newsletter or brochure may be mailed during those times if it 7 is mailed to a constituent in response to that constituent's 8 9 inquiry concerning the needs of that constituent or questions 10 raised by that constituent. Newsletters and printed material 11 may include autobiographical or biographical information about a member of the General Assembly as long as the information 12 13 does not include: (1) information about past or future 14 campaigns; (2) information designed to provide an economic 15 benefit to the member or the member's family; or (3) family 16 news unrelated to the member's official role.
