5 WHEREAS, Joe Bates was born in Princeton, Indiana on July 6 29, 1949; he graduated from Princeton High School in 1967; he 7 served in the U.S. Marine Corps during the Vietnam War from 8 1969 to 1971, and he received the rank of corporal; after being 9 discharged from the military, he pursued earning his 10 bachelor's degree in accounting from Indiana University in 11 Bloomington, Indiana; and

12 WHEREAS, Joe Bates worked for Bankers Life Casualty 13 Insurance Company in Chicago; during his career in the 14 insurance field, he held the positions of certified public 15 accountant (CPA), controller, and vice president; and

16 WHEREAS, Donna Bates was born in Chicago on May 18, 1951; 17 she graduated from Carl Schurz High School in 1969; she earned 18 her associate's degree in applied science from Wilbur Wright 19 College in 1971; and

20 WHEREAS, Donna Bates began her career with Bankers Life 21 Casualty Insurance Company in Chicago; she served as a

12 WHEREAS, Joe and Donna Bates met while working at Bankers 13 Life Casualty Insurance Company and married in Chicago on 14 August 8, 1981; they had two daughters, Sarah and Abbie; they 15 resided in both Chicago and Princeton, Indiana; and

16 WHEREAS, Joe and Donna Bates loved spending time with 17 family and frequently traveled to visit family members across 18 the Midwest; they took pride in each accomplishment and 19 milestone that their daughters achieved; individually, he 20 enjoyed working on projects in the garage, while she enjoyed 21 tending to her garden; they both loved animals and enjoyed 22 taking their dogs on nightly walks together; and
