WHEREAS, Rev. Heino served as a frontline battalion chaplain for the 1st Battalion, 9th Marines of the U.S. Marine Corps in Vietnam from 1967 to 1968, where he was awarded the Bronze Star and the Purple Heart and received the rank of captain; he completed his service as chief of chaplains for all chaplains of the U.S. Armed Forces, based out of Washington, D.C., retiring in 1995; and
