WHEREAS, Darrel Randolph was born to Raymond and Evelyn 5 6 (Woodruff) Randolph in Columbus Junction, Iowa on June 25, 7 1933; he graduated from United Township High School in 1951, 8 where he lettered in football, basketball, and track; as a sophomore, he competed in the running high jump at the 1949 9 10 State Track and Field Championship Meet; he served as a U.S. 11 Army paratrooper in the 11th Airborne Division, Fort Campbell, Kentucky; he married Janice Hollister in Port Byron on 12 September 28, 1953; and 13
