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SENATE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, After being released from a state or federal 3 penal system, 95% of justice-involved persons will reenter 4 society at a crossroads, with one path leading to recidivism 5 and the other leading to an opportunity for a second chance; 6 and

7 WHEREAS, Prison-based education and vocational programs 8 vield favorable dividends; for everv \$1 invested in 9 prison-based education, up to \$5 of taxpayer savings are 10 produced from reduced incarceration costs as well as a 43% 11 decrease in recidivism by individuals who participate in prison education programs, a 13% increase in employment among 12 13 those who participate in either academic or vocational 14 programs, and a 28% increase in employment among those who 15 participate in vocational programs alone; and

16 WHEREAS, A study, conducted by the Illinois Criminal 17 Information Authority involving a Justice segment of justice-involved persons who exited a prison facility in 18 19 Illinois in 2018 and had their employment tracked through 20 2021, found that participants had an unemployment rate of 46%, their average income was lower than the federal poverty level, 21 22 and their hourly wages were lower than the state minimum wage; 23 this study also noted that African American persons who were

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL 3 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge support for the 4 5 development and execution of rehabilitation, job and career assessment, and job training programming, all of which is 6 7 essential in training persons released from a state 8 correctional facility to promote the individual's successful 9 rehabilitation, reentry, and reintegration into the community 10 as productive, self-sufficient members of society; and be it 11 further

12 RESOLVED, That we express our commitment to learning more 13 about how the State of Illinois can help support 14 justice-involved individuals reentering society address 15 barriers to employment and attain good paying jobs to enable 16 their ability to become contributing taxpayers in the future.
