WHEREAS, Ron Lovett was born to Charles Lovett and Lucille Brickey Lovett in Granite City, Illinois on November 7, 1948; he graduated from Jacksonville High School; he received his bachelor's degree from Illinois College and earned his master's degree from Troy University; and

WHEREAS, Ron Lovett served as a pilot in the U.S. Air Force on active-duty for over 30 years; he later earned the honor of becoming the squadron commander for the 15th Special Operations Squadron (SOS), based in Hurlburt Field, Fort Walton Beach, Florida; he flew AC-130H Spectre gunships and later piloted the MC-130E Talon I and the MC-130H Talon II, and he acquired over 4,200 flying hours; he also served as a staff member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff at the Pentagon; and

WHEREAS, Ron Lovett was a recipient of the Bronze Star; he was also awarded the Meritorious Service Medal with three oak leaf clusters, the Air Medal with an oak leaf cluster, the Vietnam Service Medal, and the Kuwait Liberation Medal; and
