AN ACT in relation to alcoholic liquor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Liquor Control Act of 1934 is amended by 5 changing Section 12-4 as follows:

6 (235 ILCS 5/12-4)

Sec. 12-4. Grape and Wine Resources Fund. Beginning July 7 1, 1999 and ending June 30, 2006 2004, on the first day of 8 each State fiscal year, or as soon thereafter as may be 9 practical, the State Comptroller shall transfer the sum of 10 \$500,000 from the General Revenue Fund to the Grape and Wine 11 Resources Fund, which is hereby continued as a special fund 12 13 in the State Treasury. By January 1, 2006 2004, the Department of Commerce and Community Affairs shall review the 14 activities of the Council and report to the General Assembly 15 16 and the Governor its recommendation of whether or not the funding under this Section should be continued. 17

18 The Grape and Wine Resources Fund shall be administered by the Department of Commerce and Community Affairs, which 19 20 shall serve as the lead administrative agency for allocation and auditing of funds as well as 21 monitoring program 22 implementation. The Department shall make an annual grant of moneys from the Fund to the Council, which shall be used to 23 pay for the Council's operations and expenses. These moneys 24 shall be used by the Council to achieve the Council's 25 objectives and shall not be used for any political 26 or 27 legislative purpose. Money remaining in the Fund at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the Fund for use during 28 the following year and shall not be transferred to any other 29 State fund. 30
