- 3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 4 represented in the General Assembly:
- 5 Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Article
- 6 21A as follows:
- 7 (105 ILCS 5/Art. 21A heading new)
- 8 ARTICLE 21A. NEW TEACHER INDUCTION AND MENTORING
- 9 (105 ILCS 5/21A-5 new)
- 10 <u>Sec. 21A-5. Findings and declarations. The General</u>
- 11 <u>Assembly finds and declares all of the following:</u>
- 12 <u>(1) The revised system of teacher certification</u>
- established under subsection (g) of Section 21-la of this
- 14 <u>Code recognizes that the first years of teaching are</u>
- 15 <u>particularly critical to a teacher's professional</u>
- 16 <u>development and that teachers who hold Initial Teaching</u>
- 17 <u>Certificates need to develop their knowledge, skills, and</u>
- 18 <u>abilities before being issued Standard Teaching</u>
- 19 <u>Certificates.</u>
- 20 (2) When new teachers are provided with focused
- 21 <u>professional development opportunities and support and</u>
- 22 guidance from experienced teachers, a process known as
- 23 <u>induction and mentoring, the new teachers more quickly</u>
- 24 and effectively develop the knowledge, skills, and
- 25 <u>abilities expected of teachers holding Standard Teaching</u>
- 26 <u>Certificates.</u>
- 27 (3) To be effective, induction and mentoring
- 28 <u>programs must be designed to enhance the knowledge</u>,
- 29 <u>skills, and abilities described in the Illinois</u>
- 30 <u>Professional Teaching Standards and content area</u>

- 1 standards. These programs must be based on research and
- best practices, targeted toward a set of clearly defined
- 3 <u>purposes, and must include mentoring, continuing support</u>
- 4 <u>and professional development, and regular opportunities</u>
- for formative assessment of a new teacher.
- 6 (4) In authorizing induction and mentoring
- 7 programs, it is the intent of the General Assembly to
- 8 <u>create programs to maximize the development of the</u>
- 9 <u>knowledge, skills, and abilities of teachers who hold</u>
- 10 <u>Initial Teaching Certificates and to provide adequate</u>
- 11 <u>funding for these programs.</u>
- 12 (105 ILCS 5/21A-10 new)
- Sec. 21A-10. Definitions. In this Article:
- 14 "New teacher" means the holder of an Initial Teaching
- 15 <u>Certificate</u>, as set forth in Section 21-2 of this Code, who
- is employed by a public school and who has not previously
- 17 participated in a new teacher induction and mentoring program
- 18 required by this Article, except as provided in Section
- 19 <u>21A-30 of this Code</u>.
- 20 "Public school" means any school operating pursuant to
- 21 the authority of this Code, including without limitation a
- 22 <u>school district, a charter school, a cooperative or joint</u>
- 23 agreement with a governing body or board of control, and a
- 24 <u>school operated by a regional office of education.</u>
- 25 (105 ILCS 5/21A-15 new)
- 26 <u>Sec. 21A-15. Development of program required. During</u>
- 27 the 2003-2004 school year, each public school or 2 or more
- 28 <u>public schools acting jointly shall develop</u>, in conjunction
- 29 <u>with its exclusive representative or their exclusive</u>
- 30 representatives, if any, a new teacher induction and
- 31 <u>mentoring program to assist new teachers in developing the</u>
- 32 <u>skills and strategies necessary for instructional excellence,</u>

- 1 provided that funding is made available by the State Board of
- 2 <u>Education from an appropriation made for this purpose.</u>
- 3 (105 ILCS 5/21A-20 new)
- 4 Sec. 21A-20. When program is to be established and
- 5 <u>implemented</u>. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this
- 6 Code, by the beginning of the 2004-2005 school year, each
- 7 public school or 2 or more public schools acting jointly
- 8 shall establish and implement, in conjunction with its
- 9 <u>exclusive representative or their exclusive representatives</u>,
- 10 <u>if any, the new teacher induction and mentoring program as</u>
- 11 <u>set forth in this Article, provided that funding is made</u>
- 12 <u>available</u> by the State Board of Education, from an
- 13 appropriation made for this purpose, as described in Section
- 14 <u>21A-30</u> of this Code. A public school may contract with an
- 15 <u>institution of higher education or other independent party to</u>
- 16 <u>assist in implementing the program.</u>
- 17 (105 ILCS 5/21A-25 new)
- 18 <u>Sec. 21A-25. Program requirements. Each new teacher</u>
- 19 <u>induction</u> and mentoring program must be based on a plan that
- 20 <u>at least does all of the following:</u>
- 21 (1) Assigns a mentor teacher to each new teacher
- for a period of time established by the public school,
- which must be for a period of at least 2 school years.
- 24 (2) Aligns with the Illinois Professional Teaching
- 25 <u>Standards, content area standards, and applicable local</u>
- 26 <u>school improvement and professional development plans, if</u>
- 27 <u>any.</u>
- 28 (3) Addresses all of the following elements and how
- 29 <u>they will be provided:</u>
- 30 (A) Mentoring of the new teacher.
- 31 (B) Professional development specifically
- 32 <u>designed to ensure the growth of the new teacher's</u>

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- 2 (C) Formative assessment designed to ensure
- 3 feedback and reflection, which must not be used in
- 4 any evaluation of the new teacher.
- (4) Describes the role of mentor teachers, the 5
- criteria and process for their selection, and how they 6
- 7 will be trained, provided that each mentor teacher shall
- demonstrate the best practices in teaching his or her 8
- 9 respective field of practice. A mentor teacher may not
- 10 directly or indirectly participate in the evaluation of a
- 11 new teacher pursuant to Article 24A of this Code or the
- evaluation procedure of the public school. 12
- (105 ILCS 5/21A-30 new) 13
- Sec. 21A-30. Funding. From a separate appropriation 14
- 15 made for the purposes of this Article, for each new teacher
- 16 participating in a new teacher induction and mentoring
- program, the State Board of Education shall pay the public 17
- school \$1,200 annually for each of 2 school years for the 18
- purpose of providing one or more of the following: 19
- 2.0 (1) Mentor teacher compensation.
- 21 (2) Mentor teacher training or new teacher training
- 22 or both.

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- 23 (3) Release time.
- 24 However, if a new teacher, after participating in the new
- 25 teacher induction and mentoring program for one school year,

- 10 <u>Sec. 21A-35. Evaluation of programs. The State Board of</u>
- 11 <u>Education and the State Teacher Certification Board shall</u>
- 12 jointly contract with an independent party to conduct a
- 13 <u>comprehensive</u> evaluation of new teacher induction and
- 14 mentoring programs established pursuant to this Article. The
- 15 <u>first report of this evaluation shall be presented to the</u>
- 16 General Assembly on or before January 1, 2009. Subsequent
- 17 <u>evaluations shall be conducted and reports presented to the</u>
- 18 General Assembly on or before January 1 of every third year
- 19 <u>thereafter</u>.
- 20 (105 ILCS 5/21A-40 new)
- 21 <u>Sec. 21A-40. Rules. The State Board of Education, in</u>
- 22 <u>consultation</u> with the State Teacher Certification Board,
- 23 <u>shall adopt rules for the implementation of this Article.</u>
- 24 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 25 becoming law.
