- 30 (a) Each year, the Commission shall receive and consider
- 31 <u>applications for scholarship assistance under this Section</u>
- 32 and award scholarships, to be known as Opportunity
- 33 <u>Scholarships, to eliqible applicants. Six scholarships per</u>

- 1 <u>legislative district shall be awarded to residents of each</u>
- 2 <u>legislative district</u>. The Commission may adopt any rules
- 3 <u>necessary to implement and administer this Section.</u>
- 4 (b) An applicant is eligible for a scholarship under
- 5 this Section if he or she meets all of the following
- 6 <u>requirements:</u>
- 7 (1) The applicant is a resident of the legislative
- 8 <u>district for which he or she is applying for a</u>
- 9 scholarship and is registered to vote in that legislative
- 10 <u>district</u> (if he or she is a citizen of the United States

A scholarship awarded under this 2 3 Section shall be good for a period of not more than 2 4 semesters or 3 quarters while enrolled for residence credit. 5 The maximum number of academic terms for which a recipient may receive scholarship assistance under this Section is 8 6 7 semesters or 12 quarters of undergraduate study or the number of semesters or quarters of graduate study that the 8 9 Commission determines.".
