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AN ACT in relation to schools.

- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:
- Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing
 Section 3-14.20 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/3-14.20) (from Ch. 122, par. 3-14.20)

Sec. 3-14.20. Building plans and specifications. To 7 8 inspect the building plans and specifications, including but not limited to plans and specifications for the heating, 9 ventilating, lighting, seating, water supply, toilets and 10 safety against fire of public school rooms and buildings 11 12 submitted to him by school boards, and to approve all those 13 which comply substantially with the building code authorized in Section 2-3.12. Within 10 business days after the regional 14 superintendent of schools receives plans and specifications 15 from a school board and prior to the bidding process, he or 16 she shall notify the municipality and, if applicable, the 17 fire protection district where the school that is being 18 19 constructed or altered lies that plan and specifications have 20 been submitted. In the case of an unincorporated area, the county shall be notified. If (i) local fire, building, or 21 plumbing inspectors in the municipality, fire protection 22 23 district, or county request a review of the plans and specifications or (ii) the regional superintendent of schools 24 requests that any of these local inspectors review the plans 25 and specifications and the municipality, fire protection 26 district, or county determines that it can accommodate this 27 28 request, then the school board shall submit a copy of the plans and specifications to the local inspectors. The local 29 30 inspectors or, on behalf of the local inspectors, a certified plan reviewer or certified inspector shall comment on the 31

1 plans and specifications based on the building code 2 authorized in Section 2-3.12 and respond to the regional superintendent of schools within 15 business days after a 3 4 copy of the plans and specifications has been received by the local inspectors. "Certified plan reviewer" and "certified 5 inspector mean an individual who has been certified as such 6 7 by a national model code organization or equivalent agency approved by the Capital Development Board. If the local 8 9 inspectors or certified inspector wish to inspect the actual 10 school construction or alteration, the local inspectors or 11 certified inspector must set up an initial pre-construction meeting with the regional superintendent of schools, 12 13 outlining the inspection schedule and construction reviews. The regional superintendent of schools shall then notify the 14 school district. The local inspectors or certified inspector 15 16 shall respond to the regional superintendent of schools with 17 any comments at the completion of each inspection. The review and inspection shall be done at no cost to the school 18 district. With respect to the provisions of this Section 19 20 concerning the review of the plans and specifications and the 21 inspection of the actual school construction or alteration, 22 in the case of Cook County, references to the regional superintendent of schools shall be deemed to refer to the 23 intermediate service center for the school district. The 24 25 local fire department or fire protection district where the school is being constructed or altered may request a review 26 of the plans and specifications. The regional superintendent 27 shall copy of the plans and 28 of schools submit а specifications within 10 business days after the request. The 29 fire department or fire protection district may comment on 30 the plans and specifications based on the building code 31 authorized in Section 2-3.12 of the Code and, if any 32 corrective action must be taken, shall respond to the 33 34 regional superintendent of schools within 15 days after

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1 receipt of the plans and specifications. The Office of the 2 State Fire Marshal may review the plans and specifications at 3 the request of the fire department or fire protection 4 district. The review must be conducted at no cost to the 5 school district.

6 If such plans and specifications are not approved or 7 denied approval by the regional superintendent of schools 8 within 3 months after the date on which they are submitted to 9 him or her, the school board may submit such plans and 10 specifications directly to the State Superintendent of 11 Education for approval or denial.
