- 4 Section 5. The Department of Employment Security Law of

- 8 <u>Sec. 1005-155. Illinois Employment and Training Centers</u>
- 9 report. The Department of Employment Security, or the State
- 10 <u>agency responsible for the oversight of the federal Workforce</u>
- 11 <u>Investment Act of 1998 if that agency is not the Department</u>
- 12 <u>of Employment Security, shall prepare a report for the</u>
- 13 Governor and the General Assembly regarding the progress of
- 14 the Illinois Employment and Training Centers in serving
- 15 <u>individuals with disabilities. The report must include, but</u>
- 16 <u>is not limited to, the following: (i) the number of</u>
