AN ACT concerning health improvement.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
Statewide Health Improvement Plan Act.

6 Section 5. Statewide Health Improvement Plan.

7 (a) On January 1, 2005 and every 4 years thereafter, the
8 Governor shall deliver to the General Assembly a Statewide
9 Health Improvement Plan.

The Plan shall identify, prioritize, and recommend 10 (b) strategies to improve health status and the public health 11 12 system, using the National Healthy People goals and 13 objectives and the National Public Health Performance Standards as the frameworks for assessment. The Plan shall 14 15 focus on prevention as a key strategy for long-term health 16 improvement in Illinois.

The Plan shall examine and make recommendations on 17 (C) 18 both public and private/voluntary sector contributions to and 19 strategies for improving health status and public health 20 systems. Planning shall incorporate all State agencies with health and public health related responsibilities, including 21 22 the Department of Public Health, the Department of Human Services, the Department of Public Aid, the Department on 23 Aging, the Environmental Protection Agency, the Illinois 24 25 Violence Prevention Authority, and the Department of 26 Insurance, or the successor to any of these agencies, and all 27 agencies that the Governor deems necessary. other The planning shall take into consideration the priorities and 28 29 strategies developed at the community level through the Illinois Project for Local Assessment of Needs (IPLAN) and 30 other community collaborative planning processes. 31

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1 (d) The Governor shall appoint a bi-partisan Task Force 2 of public and private/voluntary sector stakeholders to 3 develop the plan. The Task Force shall include a 4 representative of the Governor's office, the Directors of the 5 identified State agencies or their designees, а representative of the State Board of Health, and individuals б 7 with expertise who represent a broad array of organizations and constituencies engaged in health improvement, public 8 health, and prevention. 9
