(1) The Department shall develop a fair and 15 impartial process for recruiting and receiving 16 nominations for members for the Illinois Long-Term Care 17 Council from the State Long-Term Care Ombudsman, the area 18 agencies on aging, regional ombudsman programs, provider 19 agencies, and other public agencies, using a nomination 20 21 form provided by the Department. 22 (2) The Department shall appoint members to the

2	(3) The Department shall consider and act in good

1 (5) Provide an opportunity for public input at each 2 scheduled meeting. 3 (6) Make recommendations to the Director, upon his 4 or her request, as to individuals who are capable of serving as the State Long-Term Care Ombudsman and who 5 should make appropriate application for that position 6 7 should it become vacant. (e) Composition and operation. The Illinois Long-Term 8 9 Care Council shall be composed of at least 15 but not more than 25 members concerned about the quality of life in 10 long-term care facilities and protecting the rights of 11 residents, including members from long-term care facilities. 12 13 The State Long-Term Care Ombudsman shall be a permanent member of the Long-Term Care Council. Members shall be 14 appointed for a 4-year term with initial appointments 15 staggered with 2-year, 3-year, and 4-year terms. A lottery 16 will determine the terms of office for the members of the 17 first term. Members may be reappointed to a term but no 18 member may be reappointed to more than 2 consecutive terms. 19 The Illinois Long-Term Care Council shall meet a minimum of 3 20 21 times per calendar year. 22 (f) Member requirements. All members shall be individuals who have demonstrated concern about the quality 23 of life in long-term care facilities. A minimum of 3 members 24 must be current or former residents of long-term care 25 facilities or the family member of a current or former 26 resident of a long-term care facility. A minimum of 2 members 27 shall represent current or former long term care facility 28 resident councils or family councils. Long-term care facility 29 members shall be long-term care facility employees or 30 consultants as follows: (i) one from the Illinois Health Care 31

33 from the County Nursing Homes Association; and (iv) one from

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Association; (ii) one from Life Services Network; (iii) one

34 the Illinois Council on Long Term Care. A representative of

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1 long-term care facility employees must also be included as a member. There shall be non-voting State agency members on 2 3 the Long-Term Care Council from the following agencies: (i) 4 the Department of Veterans Affairs; (ii) the Department of 5 Human Services; (iii) the Department of Public Health; (iv) the Department on Aging; (v) the Department of Public Aid; б 7 (vi) the Illinois State Police Medicaid Fraud Control Unit; and (vii) others as appropriate. 8

9 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon10 becoming law.".
