- Each health care facility <u>must</u> shall maintain any advance 26
- 27 directives proffered by the patient or other authorized
- person, including a do not resuscitate order, a living will, 28
- 29 a declaration for mental health treatment, or a power of
- attorney for health care, in the patient's medical records 30
- for the duration of the patient's stay. This Act does apply 31

- to patients without a qualifying condition. If a patient is 1
- 2 an adult with decisional capacity, then the right to refuse
- medical treatment or life-sustaining treatment does not 3
- 4 require the presence of a qualifying condition.
