AN ACT concerning professional regulation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Professional Engineering Practice Act of
 1989 is amended by adding Section 17.6 as follows:
- 6 (225 ILCS 325/17.6 new)

7 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2010)
8 <u>Sec. 17.6. Emeritus status requirements.</u>

(a) An Illinois licensee who has been licensed for at 9 least 10 consecutive years, is 65 years of age or older, and 10 is retired from active practice may request emeritus status 11 12 by filing the request on forms prescribed by the Department and paying a nonrefundable fee as established by rule. If 13 14 the requirements of this Section have been met, all fees for the biennial license renewal shall be waived by the 15 Department during the period the professional engineer is in 16 emeritus status. An engineer with emeritus status may 17 maintain the title "professional engineer". 18

(b) An emeritus professional engineer may be readmitted
 to active practice within 3 years of acquiring emeritus
 status upon payment of the current renewal fee.

(c) An emeritus professional engineer who has held 2.2 emeritus status in excess of 3 consecutive years may be 23 readmitted to active practice only after filing an 24 application on forms supplied by the Department, payment of 25 the applicable fees, and completion of the current 26 examination in the principles and practice of engineering or 27 28 by appearing before the Board to satisfactorily demonstrate his or her qualifications to resume active practice. 29

30(d) An emeritus professional engineer seeking31readmission to active practice shall be required to meet
