- 2 days may be used as a teacher's workshop, when approved by
- 18 the regional superintendent, up to 2 days may be used for

A school district may use one of those 4 days on the last day of the school term. 12 "Inservice Training Workshops" or "Professional educational experiences" means 13 any educational gathering, demonstration of methods 14 instruction, visitation of schools or other institutions or 15 16 facilities, or sexual abuse and sexual assault awareness seminar held or approved by the regional superintendent and 17 18 declared by him to be an inservice training workshop, 19 parent-teacher conferences. With the concurrence of the State Superintendent of Education, he may employ 20 21 assistance as is necessary to conduct the inservice training 22 workshop. With the approval of the regional superintendent, 23 2 or more adjoining districts may jointly hold an inservice training workshop. In addition, with the approval of 24 25 regional superintendent, one district may conduct its own inservice training workshop with subject matter consultants 26 requested from the county, State or any State institution of 27 higher learning. 28 Such teachers institutes as referred to in this Section 29

may be held on consecutive or separate days at the option of

the regional superintendent having jurisdiction thereof.

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the institutes may not be held on any Tuesday, Wednesday, or 33

- 27 continued operation and maintenance of school facilities or
- 28 property, be required to work on legal school holidays, which
- 29 are January 1, New Year's Day; the third Monday in January,
- 30 <u>observance of</u> the Birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.;
- 31 <u>the third Monday in</u> February 12, <u>observance of</u> the Birthday

No deduction shall be made from 13 t.he time orcompensation of a school employee on account of any legal or 14 15 special holiday. 16 Commemorative holidays, which recognize patriotic, civic, cultural or historical persons, activities, 17 or events, are regular school days. Commemorative holidays 18 19 are: January 28 (to be known as Christa McAuliffe Day and observed as a commemoration of space exploration), February 20 2.1 15 (the birthday of Susan B. Anthony), March 29 (Viet Nam War 22 Veterans Day), September 11 (September 11th Day of 23 Remembrance), the school day immediately preceding Veteran's Day (Korean War Veterans Day), October 1 (Recycling Day), 24 25 December 7 (Pearl Harbor Veterans Day) and any day so appointed by the President or Governor. School boards may 26 establish commemorative holidays whenever in their 27 judgment action is advisable. School boards shall include 28 29 instruction relative to commemorated persons, activities, 30 events on the commemorative holiday or at any other time during the school year and at any point in the curriculum 31 32 when such instruction may be deemed appropriate. The State 33 Board of Education shall prepare and make available to school 34 boards instructional materials relative to commemorated

- 4 City of Chicago School District 299 shall observe March 4
- of each year as a commemorative holiday. This holiday shall
