AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 2633 1 2 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend House Bill 2633, AS AMENDED, by 3 replacing everything after the enacting clause with the 4 following: "Section 5. The Counties Code is amended by adding Section 5 6 5-1041.2 as follows: 7 (55 ILCS 5/5-1041.2 new)Sec. 5-1041.2. Requests for refunds of cash contributions; 8 limitations; payments under protest. 9 (a) Any request for the refund of cash contributions paid 10 in lieu of land donations under this Division, and pursuant to 11 a county's ordinance, that is based on objections to the 12 validity of an ordinance or to the manner in which donations or 13 contributions are calculated under the ordinance must be filed 14 with the county within one year after the date of payment or a 15 16 longer period, if specified in a county ordinance or in an annexation agreement. Each request must state: (i) the name and 17 address of the person who made the payment; (ii) the amount of 18 the cash contribution; (iii) the reasons for which a refund is 19 being requested; and (iv) evidence that the contribution was 20 21 made under protest at the time of payment. 22 (b) Any request for the refund of cash contributions paid in lieu of land donations under this Division, and pursuant to 23 a county ordinance, that is based on an objection that the 24

However, in any case, the request must be filed within 5 years after the 4 5 money has been spent. - 13 (c) The county may institute procedures to facilitate consideration of refund requests and must require strict 14 compliance with the requirements of this Section. Failure to 15 file a request within the designated time period and to comply 16 with the requirements of this Section constitutes grounds for 17 denial of the request. 18
- 19 Section 10. The Illinois Municipal Code is amended by 20 adding Section 11-12-5.2 as follows:
- (65 ILCS 5/11-12-5.2 new) 21
- Sec. 11-12-5.2. Requests for refunds of 22 cash 23 contributions; limitations; payment under protest.
- 24 (a) Any request for the refund of cash contributions paid in lieu of land donations under this Division, and pursuant to 25 26 a municipality's ordinance, that is based on objections to the 27 validity of an ordinance or to the manner in which donations or contributions are calculated under the ordinance must be filed 28 29 with the municipality within one year after the date of payment or a longer period, if specified in a municipal ordinance or in 30 31 an annexation agreement. Each request must state: (i) the name and address of the person who made the payment; (ii) the amount 32

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of the cash contribution; (iii) the reasons for which a refund 1 2 is being requested; and (iv) evidence that the contribution was made under protest at the time of payment. 3

(b) Any request for the refund of cash contributions paid in lieu of land donations under this Division, and pursuant to a municipal ordinance, that is based on an objection that the money collected has been spent in a manner inconsistent with the ordinance must be filed within one year after the objector knew or should have known the money has been spent. However, in any case, the request must be filed within 5 years after the money has been spent. Each request shall be directed to the unit of local government that is alleged to have spent the funds incorrectly and shall be copied to the municipality, requesting that the funds be returned to the municipality so that it may issue a refund. Each request must state: (i) the name and address of the person who made the payment, (ii) the amount of the cash contribution, and (iii) the reasons for which the refund is being requested.

(c) The municipality may institute procedures facilitate consideration of refund requests and must require strict compliance with the requirements of this Section. Failure to file a request within the designated time period and to comply with the requirements of this Section constitutes grounds for denial of the request.

25 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect on 26 January 1, 2005.".
