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AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 2657

2 AMENDMENT NO. ____. Amend House Bill 2657 by replacing 3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Illinois Public Aid Code is amended by
5 changing Section 5-5.4 as follows:

6 (305 ILCS 5/5-5.4) (from Ch. 23, par. 5-5.4)

Sec. 5-5.4. Standards of Payment - Department of Public
Aid. The Department of Public Aid shall develop standards of
payment of skilled nursing and intermediate care services in
facilities providing such services under this Article which:

(1) Provide for the determination of a facility's 11 payment for skilled nursing and intermediate care services on 12 a prospective basis. The amount of the payment rate for all 13 14 nursing facilities certified by the Department of Public Health under the Nursing Home Care Act as Intermediate Care 15 for the Developmentally Disabled facilities, Long Term Care 16 for Under Age 22 facilities, Skilled Nursing facilities, or 17 Intermediate Care facilities under the medical assistance 18 program shall be prospectively established annually on the 19 of historical, financial, and statistical data 20 basis reflecting actual costs from prior years, which shall 21 be applied to the current rate year and updated for inflation, 22

except that the capital cost element for newly constructed facilities shall be based upon projected budgets. The annually established payment rate shall take effect on July 1 in 1984 and subsequent years. No rate increase and no update for inflation shall be provided on or after July 1, 1994 and before July 1, 2004, unless specifically provided for in this Section.

8 For facilities licensed by the Department of Public 9 Health under the Nursing Home Care Act as Intermediate Care for the Developmentally Disabled facilities or Long Term Care 10 11 for Under Age 22 facilities, the rates taking effect on July 1998 shall include an increase of 3%. For facilities 12 1. licensed by the Department of Public Health under the Nursing 13 Home Care Act as Skilled Nursing facilities or Intermediate 14 15 Care facilities, the rates taking effect on July 1, 1998 16 shall include an increase of 3% plus \$1.10 per resident-day, as defined by the Department. 17

For facilities licensed by the Department of Public 18 Health under the Nursing Home Care Act as Intermediate Care 19 for the Developmentally Disabled facilities or Long Term Care 20 21 for Under Age 22 facilities, the rates taking effect on July 22 1, 1999 shall include an increase of 1.6% plus \$3.00 per 23 resident-day, as defined by the Department. For facilities licensed by the Department of Public Health under the Nursing 24 25 Home Care Act as Skilled Nursing facilities or Intermediate Care facilities, the rates taking effect on July 1, 1999 26 shall include an increase of 1.6% and, for services provided 27 on or after October 1, 1999, shall be increased by \$4.00 per 28 resident-day, as defined by the Department. 29

For facilities licensed by the Department of Public Health under the Nursing Home Care Act as Intermediate Care for the Developmentally Disabled facilities or Long Term Care for Under Age 22 facilities, the rates taking effect on July 1, 2000 shall include an increase of 2.5% per resident-day, 1 as defined by the Department. For facilities licensed by the 2 Department of Public Health under the Nursing Home Care Act facilities or 3 as Skilled Nursing Intermediate Care 4 facilities, the rates taking effect on July 1, 2000 shall include an increase of 2.5% per resident-day, as defined by 5 6 the Department.

7 For facilities licensed by the Department of Public 8 Health under the Nursing Home Care Act as skilled nursing 9 facilities or intermediate care facilities, a new payment methodology must be implemented for the nursing component of 10 11 the rate effective July 1, 2003. The Department of Public Aid shall develop the new payment methodology using the Minimum 12 as the instrument to collect information 13 Data Set (MDS) concerning nursing home resident condition necessary to 14 compute the rate. The Department of Public Aid shall develop 15 16 the new payment methodology to meet the unique needs of Illinois nursing home residents while remaining subject to 17 the appropriations provided by the General Assembly. 18 Α 19 transition period from the payment methodology in effect on June 30, 2003 to the payment methodology in effect on July 1, 20 21 2003 shall be provided for a period not exceeding 2 years 22 after implementation of the new payment methodology as 23 follows:

For a facility that would receive a lower 24 (A) 25 nursing component rate per patient day under the new system than the facility received effective on the date 26 27 immediately preceding the date that the Department implements the new payment methodology, the nursing 28 29 component rate per patient day for the facility shall be 30 held at the level in effect on the date immediately preceding the date that the Department implements the new 31 payment methodology until a higher nursing component rate 32 of reimbursement is achieved by that facility. 33

(B) For a facility that would receive a higher

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nursing component rate per patient day under the payment methodology in effect on July 1, 2003 than the facility received effective on the date immediately preceding the date that the Department implements the new payment methodology, the nursing component rate per patient day for the facility shall be adjusted.

7 (C) Notwithstanding paragraphs (A) and (B), the 8 nursing component rate per patient day for the facility 9 shall be adjusted subject to appropriations provided by 10 the General Assembly.

For facilities licensed by the Department of Public Health under the Nursing Home Care Act as Intermediate Care for the Developmentally Disabled facilities or Long Term Care for Under Age 22 facilities, the rates taking effect on March 1, 2001 shall include a statewide increase of 7.85%, as defined by the Department.

For facilities licensed by the Department of Public 17 Health under the Nursing Home Care Act as Intermediate Care 18 for the Developmentally Disabled facilities or Long Term Care 19 for Under Age 22 facilities, the rates taking effect on April 20 21 1, 2002 shall include a statewide increase of 2.0%, as 22 defined by the Department. This increase terminates on July 2002; beginning July 1, 2002 these rates are reduced to 23 1, the level of the rates in effect on March 31, 2002, as 24 25 defined by the Department.

For facilities licensed by the Department of Public 26 27 Health under the Nursing Home Care Act as skilled nursing facilities or intermediate care facilities, the rates taking 28 29 effect on July 1, 2001 shall be computed using the most recent cost reports on file with the Department of Public Aid 30 no later than April 1, 2000, updated for inflation to January 31 2001. For rates effective July 1, 2001 only, rates shall 32 1, be the greater of the rate computed for July 1, 2001 or the 33 34 rate effective on June 30, 2001.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section, for facilities licensed by the Department of Public Health under the Nursing Home Care Act as skilled nursing facilities or intermediate care facilities, the Illinois Department shall determine by rule the rates taking effect on July 1, 2002, which shall be 5.9% less than the rates in effect on June 30, 2002.

8 For facilities licensed by the Department of Public 9 Health under the Nursing Home Care Act as Intermediate Care 10 for the Developmentally Disabled facilities or as long-term 11 care facilities for residents under 22 years of age, the 12 rates taking effect on July 1, 2003 shall include a statewide 13 increase of 4%, as defined by the Department.

Rates established effective each July 1 shall govern 14 15 payment for services rendered throughout that fiscal year, 16 except that rates established on July 1, 1996 shall be increased by 6.8% for services provided on or after January 17 1, 1997. Such rates will be based upon the rates calculated 18 for the year beginning July 1, 1990, and for subsequent years 19 thereafter until June 30, 2001 shall be based on the facility 20 21 cost reports for the facility fiscal year ending at any point 22 in time during the previous calendar year, updated to the 23 midpoint of the rate year. The cost report shall be on file with the Department no later than April 1 of the current rate 24 25 Should the cost report not be on file by April 1, the year. Department shall base the rate on the latest cost report 26 filed by each skilled care facility and intermediate care 27 facility, updated to the midpoint of the current rate year. 28 29 In determining rates for services rendered on and after July 30 1, 1985, fixed time shall not be computed at less than zero. The Department shall not make any alterations of regulations 31 which would reduce any component of the Medicaid rate to a 32 level below what that component would have been utilizing in 33 the rate effective on July 1, 1984. 34

1 (2) Shall take into account the actual costs incurred by 2 facilities in providing services for recipients of skilled 3 nursing and intermediate care services under the medical 4 assistance program.

5 (3) Shall take into account the medical and 6 psycho-social characteristics and needs of the patients.

7 (4) Shall take into account the actual costs incurred by 8 facilities in meeting licensing and certification standards 9 imposed and prescribed by the State of Illinois, any of its 10 political subdivisions or municipalities and by the U.S. 11 Department of Health and Human Services pursuant to Title XIX 12 of the Social Security Act.

The Department of Public Aid shall develop precise 13 standards for payments to reimburse nursing facilities for 14 any utilization of appropriate rehabilitative personnel for 15 16 the provision of rehabilitative services which is authorized by federal regulations, including reimbursement for services 17 18 provided by qualified therapists or qualified assistants, and 19 which is in accordance with accepted professional practices. Reimbursement also may be made for utilization of other 20 21 supportive personnel under appropriate supervision.
