- 4 Section 5. The Code of Criminal Procedure of 1963 is
- 5 amended by adding Article 106F as follows:

- 7 ARTICLE 106F. VIDEOTAPE OF INTERROGATIONS IN CAPITAL CASES
- 8 (725 ILCS 5/106F-5 new)
- 9 <u>Sec. 106F-5. Videotape of interrogations of suspects in</u>
- 10 <u>capital cases</u>.
- 11 (a) A peace officer who interrogates a person who is
- 12 <u>suspected of committing a capital offense must videotape the</u>
- 13 <u>interrogation and must inform the suspect that the</u>
- 14 <u>interrogation is being videotaped.</u>
- 15 (b) The videotape is admissible in court in a
- 16 prosecution of the suspect for a capital offense if the
- 17 <u>suspect confesses to the capital offense or otherwise makes</u>
- 18 <u>an admission that may be used in a prosecution of the suspect</u>
- 19 <u>for the capital offense and if the suspect recants his or her</u>
- 20 <u>confession or contradicts any admission made to a peace</u>
- 21 officer.
- 22 (c) The failure of a peace officer to videotape the
- 23 <u>interrogation of a person suspected of a capital offense</u>
- 24 renders any confession or other admission made by the suspect
- 25 <u>inadmissible</u> in any trial of the suspect for the capital
