AN ACT concerning professional regulation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Funeral Directors and Embalmers Licensing
Code is amended by changing Sections 1-10, 1-15, 1-20, 5-10,
5-15, 5-25, 10-5, 10-10, 10-15, 10-30, 10-35, 15-5, 15-45,
15-55, 15-75, and 15-80 as follows:

9 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2013)

10 Sec. 1-10. Definitions. As used in this Code:

11 "Applicant" means any person making application for a 12 license or certificate of registration.

13 "Board" means the Funeral Directors and Embalmers14 Licensing and disciplinary Board.

15 "Department" means the Department of Professional 16 Regulation.

"Director" means the Director of Professional Regulation. 17 18 "Funeral director and embalmer" means a person who is licensed and qualified to practice funeral directing and to 19 20 prepare, disinfect and preserve dead human bodies by the external application of antiseptics, 21 injection or 22 disinfectants or preservative fluids and materials and to use derma surgery or plastic art for the restoring of mutilated 23 features. It further means a person who restores the remains 24 of a person for the purpose of funeralization whose organs or 25 bone or tissue has been donated for anatomical purposes. 26

27 "Funeral director and embalmer <u>intern</u> trainee" means a 28 person licensed by the State who is qualified to render 29 assistance to a funeral director and embalmer in carrying out 30 the practice of funeral directing and embalming under the 31 supervision of the funeral director and embalmer. 1 "Embalming" means the process of sanitizing and 2 chemically treating a deceased human body in order to reduce 3 the presence and growth of microorganisms, to retard organic 4 decomposition, to render the remains safe to handle while 5 retaining naturalness of tissue, and to restore an acceptable 6 physical appearance for funeral viewing purposes.

7 "Funeral director" means a person, known by the title of
8 "funeral director" or other similar words or titles, licensed
9 by the State who practices funeral directing.

10 "Funeral establishment", "funeral chapel", "funeral 11 home", or "mortuary" means a building or separate portion of 12 a building having a specific street address or location and 13 devoted to activities relating to the shelter, care, custody 14 and preparation of a deceased human body and which may 15 contain facilities for funeral or wake services.

16 "Owner" means the individual, partnership, corporation, 17 association, trust, estate, or agent thereof, or other person 18 or combination of persons who owns a funeral establishment or 19 funeral business.

20 "Person" means any individual, partnership, association, 21 firm, corporation, trust or estate, or other entity. 22 (Source: P.A. 87-966.)

25 Sec. 1-15. Funeral directing; definition. Conducting or 26 engaging in or representing or holding out oneself as 27 conducting or engaged in any one or any combination of the 28 following practices constitutes the practice of funeral 29 directing:

30 (a) The practice of preparing, otherwise than by
31 embalming, for the burial, cremation, or disposal and
32 directing and supervising the burial or disposal of
33 deceased human remains or performing any act or service

in connection with the preparing of dead human bodies.
 Preparation, direction, and supervision shall not be
 construed to mean those functions normally performed by
 cemetery and crematory personnel.

(b) The practice of operating a place for preparing 5 for the disposition of deceased human bodies or for 6 7 deceased human bodies before their caring for disposition. Nothing in this Code shall prohibit the 8 9 ownership and management of such a place by an unlicensed owner if the place is operated in accordance with this 10 11 Code and the unlicensed owner does not engage in any form of funeral directing. 12

(c) The removal of a deceased human body from 13 its place of death, institution or other location. 14 The licensed funeral director may engage others who 15 are not 16 licensed funeral directors to assist in the removal if the funeral director directs and instructs 17 them in handling and precautionary procedures and accompanies 18 them on all calls. The transportation of deceased human 19 remains to a cemetery, crematory or other place of final 20 21 disposition shall be under the immediate direct supervision of a licensee unless otherwise permitted by 22 23 this Section. The transportation of deceased human remains that are embalmed or otherwise prepared and 24 enclosed in an appropriate container to some other place 25 that is not the place of final disposition, such as 26 another funeral home or common carrier, or to a facility 27 shares common ownership with the transporting 28 that 29 funeral home may be performed under the general supervision of a licensee, but the supervision need not 30 be immediate or direct. 31

32 (d) The administering and conducting of, or
33 assuming responsibility for administering and conducting
34 of, at need funeral arrangements.

(e) The assuming custody of, transportation,
 providing shelter, protection and care and disposition of
 deceased human remains and the furnishing of necessary
 funeral services, facilities and equipment.

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5 (f) Using in connection with a name or practice the 6 word "funeral director," "undertaker," "mortician," 7 "funeral home," "funeral parlor," "funeral chapel," or 8 any other title implying that the person is engaged in 9 the practice of funeral directing.

10 The practice of funeral directing shall not include the 11 phoning in of obituary notices, ordering of flowers for the 12 funeral, or reporting of prices on the firm's general price 13 list as required by the Federal Trade Commission <u>Funeral Rule</u> 14 rule by nonlicensed persons, or like clerical tasks 15 incidental to the act of making funeral arrangements.

16 The making of funeral arrangements, at need, shall be 17 done only by licensed funeral directors or licensed funeral 18 directors and embalmers.

22 Sec. 1-20. Funeral directing and embalming; definition.
23 "The practice of funeral directing and embalming" means:

24 (a) The practice of preparing, otherwise than by embalming, for the burial, cremation, or disposal and 25 directing and supervising the burial or disposal of 26 deceased human remains or performing any act or service 27 28 in connection with the preparing of dead human bodies. Preparation, direction, and supervision shall not be 29 construed to mean those functions normally performed by 30 cemetery and crematory personnel. 31

32 (b) The practice of operating a place for preparing33 for the disposition of deceased human bodies or for

1 caring for deceased human bodies before their 2 disposition. Nothing in this Code shall prohibit the 3 ownership and management of such a place by an unlicensed 4 owner if the place is operated in accordance with this 5 Code and the unlicensed owner does not engage in any form 6 of funeral directing and embalming.

7 (c) The removal of a deceased human body from its 8 place of death, institution or other location. A licensed 9 funeral director and embalmer intern trainee may remove a deceased human body from its place of death, institution, 10 11 or other location without another licensee being present. The licensed funeral director and embalmer may engage 12 others who are not licensed funeral directors 13 and embalmers or funeral director and embalmer interns 14 15 trainees to assist in the removal if the funeral director 16 and embalmer directs and instructs them in handling and precautionary procedures and accompanies them on all 17 calls. The transportation of deceased human remains to a 18 cemetery, crematory or other place of final disposition 19 20 shall be under the immediate, direct supervision of a 21 licensee unless otherwise permitted by this Section. The 22 transportation of deceased human remains that are 23 embalmed or otherwise prepared and enclosed in an appropriate container to some other place that is not the 24 place of final disposition, such as another funeral home 25 or common carrier, or to a facility that shares common 26 27 ownership with the transporting funeral home may be performed under the general supervision of a licensee, 28 29 but the supervision need not be immediate or direct.

30 (d) The administering and conducting of, or
31 assuming responsibility for administering and conducting
32 of, at need funeral arrangements.

33 (e) The assuming custody of, transportation,
 34 providing shelter, protection and care and disposition of

deceased human remains and the furnishing of necessary
 funeral services, facilities and equipment.

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3 (f) Using in connection with a name or practice the
4 word "funeral director and embalmer", "embalmer",
5 "funeral director", "undertaker", "mortician", "funeral
6 home", "funeral parlor", "funeral chapel", or any other
7 title implying that the person is engaged in the practice
8 of funeral directing and embalming.

9 (g) The embalming or representing or holding out 10 oneself as engaged in the practice of embalming of 11 deceased human bodies or the transportation of human 12 bodies deceased of a contagious or infectious disease.

13 The practice of funeral directing and embalming shall not 14 include the phoning in of obituary notices, ordering of 15 flowers for the funeral, or reporting of prices on the firm's 16 general price list as required by the Federal Trade 17 Commission <u>Funeral Rule</u> rule by nonlicensed persons, or like 18 clerical tasks incidental to the act of making funeral 19 arrangements.

The making of funeral arrangements, at need, shall be done only by licensed funeral directors or licensed funeral directors and embalmers. Licensed funeral director and embalmer <u>interns</u> trainees may, however, assist or participate in the arrangements.

Every holder of a license as a funeral director shall display it in a conspicuous place in the <u>licensee's</u> holder's place of practice or in the place of practice in which the <u>licensee</u> holder is employed or, in case the <u>licensee</u> holder is engaged in funeral directing at more than one place of

practice, then in the <u>licensee's holder's</u> principal place of practice or the principal place of practice of the <u>licensee's</u> holder's employer.

б (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2013) 7 Sec. 5-15. Expiration and renewal; inactive status; 8 continuing education. The expiration date and renewal period for each license issued under this Article shall be set by 9 10 rule. The holder of a license as a licensed funeral director may renew the license during the month preceding the 11 expiration date of the license by paying the required fee. A 12 licensed funeral director whose license has expired may have 13 the license reinstated within 5 years from the date of 14 15 expiration upon payment of the required reinstatement fee. The reinstatement shall be effective as of the date of 16 17 reissuance of the license.

Any licensed funeral director whose license has been 18 expired for more than 5 years may have the license restored 19 20 only by fulfilling the requirements of the Department's rules 21 and by paying the required restoration fee. However, any 22 licensed funeral director whose license has expired while he or she has been engaged (1) in federal service on active duty 23 24 with the Army of the United States, the United States Navy, the Marine Corps, the Air Force, the Coast Guard, or the 25 State Militia called into the service or training of the 26 27 United States of America or (2) in training or education 28 under the supervision of the United States preliminary to 29 induction into the military service may have his or her license restored without paying any lapsed renewal fees or 30 restoration fee or without passing any examination if, within 31 2 years after termination of the service, training or 32 33 education other than by dishonorable discharge, he or she

furnishes the Department with an affidavit to the effect that
 he or she has been so engaged and that <u>his or her</u> service,
 training or education has been so terminated.

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4 In addition to any other requirement for renewal of а 5 license or reinstatement of an expired license, beginning with-licenses-renewed-or-reinstated-in-1993, as a condition 6 7 for the renewal or reinstatement of a license as a licensed 8 funeral director, each licensee shall provide evidence to the 9 Department of completion of at least 12 hours of continuing education during the 24 months preceding the expiration date 10 11 of the license, or in the case of reinstatement, during the 12 24 months preceding application for reinstatement. The continuing education sponsors shall be approved by the Board. 13 In addition, any qualified continuing education course for 14 15 funeral directors offered by a college, university, the 16 Illinois Funeral Directors Association, Funeral Directors Services Association of Greater Chicago, Cook County 17 Association of Funeral Home Owners, Inc., Illinois Selected 18 19 Morticians Association, Inc., Illinois Cemetery and Funeral Home Association, National Funeral Directors Association, 20 Selected Independent Funeral Homes National--Foundation--of 21 22 Funeral---Service,--National--Selected--Morticians, National 23 Directors and Morticians Association, Funeral Inc., International Order of the Golden Rule, or an Illinois school 24 25 of mortuary science shall be accepted toward satisfaction of the continuing education requirements. 26

The Department shall establish by rule a means for 27 verification of completion of the continuing education 28 29 required by this Section. This verification may be 30 accomplished through audits of records maintained by licensees, by requiring the filing of continued education 31 certificates with the Department or a qualified organization 32 selected by the Department to maintain these records, or by 33 34 other means established by the Department.

1 A person who is licensed as a funeral director under this 2 Act and who has engaged in the practice of funeral directing for at least 40 years shall be exempt from the continuing 3 4 education requirements of this Section. In addition, the 5 Department shall establish by rule an exemption or exception 6 for funeral directors who, by reason of advanced age, health 7 or other extreme condition should reasonably be excused from the continuing education requirement upon explanation to the 8 9 Board, the approval of the Director, or both. Those persons, identified above, who cannot attend on-site classes, shall 10 11 have the opportunity to comply by completing home study courses designed for them by sponsors. 12

Any funeral director who notifies the Department in 13 writing on forms prescribed by the Department may elect 14 to place his or her license on an inactive status and shall be 15 16 excused from completion of continuing education requirements until he or she notifies the Department in writing of an 17 intent to restore the license to active status. 18 Any licensee requesting restoration from inactive status shall 19 notify the Department as provided by rule of the Department 20 21 and pay the fee required by the Department for restoration of 22 the license. Any licensee whose license is on inactive 23 status shall not practice in the State of Illinois.

Practice on a license that has lapsed or been placed in inactive status is practicing without a license and a violation of this <u>Code</u> Aet.

1 after that date under the provisions of this Article and that 2 person may continue to renew or restore the license during his or her lifetime, subject only to the renewal or 3 4 restoration requirements for the license under this Code. 26 Sec. 10-5. License requirement. It is unlawful for any 27 person to practice or attempt to practice funeral directing 28 and embalming without being licensed by the Department.

No person shall practice funeral directing and embalming who does not have a fixed place of practice or establishment <u>in Illinois</u> devoted to the care and preparation for burial or for transportation of deceased human bodies, or who is not regularly employed in a fixed place of practice or

1 establishment.

2 No person shall practice funeral directing and embalming 3 independently at the fixed place of practice or establishment 4 of another licensee unless his or her name shall be published 5 and displayed at all times in connection therewith.

No licensed <u>intern</u> trainee shall independently practice funeral directing and embalming; however, a licensed funeral director and embalmer <u>intern</u> trainee may under the immediate personal supervision of a licensed funeral director and embalmer assist a licensed funeral director and embalmer in the practice of funeral directing and embalming.

12 No person shall practice as a funeral director and 13 embalmer <u>intern</u> trainee unless he or she possesses a valid 14 license in good standing to do so in the State of Illinois. 15 (Source: P.A. 87-966.)

22 (b) Has successfully completed one academic year in a 23 college or university and has successfully completed a course 24 of instruction of at least one year duration in a 25 professional school or college teaching the practice of 26 funeral directing and embalming that is recognized and 27 approved by the Department.

(c) Has studied funeral directing and embalming in this State under a funeral director and embalmer, licensed under this Code or any prior Act, for at least one year. Nevertheless, no credit shall be given for the study of funeral directing and embalming in this State as <u>an intern</u> a trainee unless the applicant during the period of study was a 1 licensed funeral director and embalmer <u>intern</u> trainee.

2 (d) Is satisfactorily versed in approved measures used 3 by the practice for the prevention and against the spread of 4 disease and has the skills reasonably involved, and is 5 adequately and properly protected against communicable 6 diseases by means usually adopted and approved by medical 7 science.

8 (e) Has passed an examination developed or acquired by 9 the Department and conducted by the Department or its 10 designee to determine the fitness of an applicant to receive 11 a license as a licensed funeral director and embalmer.

The holder of a license as a licensed funeral director and embalmer or funeral director and embalmer intern trainee 24 25 may renew the license during the month preceding the expiration date of the license by paying the required fee. However, any licensed funeral director and embalmer or 7 licensed funeral director and embalmer intern trainee whose license has expired while he or she has been engaged (1) 8 in 9 federal service on active duty with the Army of the United States, the United States Navy, the Marine Corps, the Air 10 Force, the Coast Guard, or the State Militia called into the 11 service or training of the United States of America or (2) in 12 training or education under the supervision of the United 13 States preliminary to induction into the military service, 14 15 may have his or her the license restored without paying any 16 lapsed renewal fees or restoration fee or without passing any examination if, within 2 years after termination of the 17 service, training or education other than by dishonorable 18 19 discharge, he or she the-licensee furnishes the Department with an affidavit to the effect that he or she has been so 20 21 engaged and that his or her service, training or education 22 has been so terminated.

No license of a funeral director and embalmer <u>intern</u>
trainee shall be renewed more than twice.

Any licensee 10 the 11 requesting restoration from inactive status shall notify the Department as provided by rule of the Department and pay the 12 fee required by the Department for restoration of the 13 license. Any licensee whose license is on inactive status 14 shall not practice in the State of Illinois. 15

22 Sec. 15-5. Funeral Directors and Embalmers Licensing and Disciplinary Board. A Funeral Directors 23 and Embalmers 24 Licensing and Disciplinary Board is created and shall consist of 7 persons, 6 of whom are licensed to practice funeral 25 directing and embalming in this State, and one who 26 is а knowledgeable public member. Each member shall be appointed 27 28 by the Director of the Department. The persons so appointed 29 shall hold their offices for 4 years and until a qualified successor is appointed. All vacancies occurring shall be 30 31 filled by the Director for the unexpired portion of the term rendered vacant. No member shall be eligible to serve for 32 33 more than 2 full consecutive terms. Any appointee may be

1 removed by the Director when in his or her discretion he or 2 she finds removal to be in the public interest. The cause for removal must be set forth in writing. The Board shall 3 4 annually select a chairman from its membership. The members of the Board shall be reimbursed for all legitimate and 5 necessary expenses incurred in attending meetings of the 6 7 The Board may meet as often as necessary to perform Board. its duties under this Code, and shall meet at least once a 8 9 year in Springfield, Illinois.

16 The Department may seek the advice and recommendations of 17 the Board on any matter relating to the administration and 18 enforcement of this Code.

The Department shall seek the advice and recommendations 19 20 of the Board in connection with rulemaking any or 21 disciplinary actions, including applications for restoration 22 of revoked licenses. The Board shall have 60 days to respond 23 to a Department request for advice and recommendations. Τf the Department fails to adopt, in whole or in part, a Board 24 recommendation in connection with any 25 rulemaking or disciplinary action, it shall provide a written explanation 26 27 of its specific reasons for not adopting the Board recommendation. The written explanations shall be made 28 29 available for public inspection.

 and desist order; civil penalties.

(a) The practice of funeral directing and embalming or 23 24 funeral directing by any person who has not been issued a license by the Department, whose license has been suspended 25 or revoked, or whose license has not been renewed is hereby 26 declared to be inimical to the public welfare and to 27 28 constitute a public nuisance. The Director of Professional Regulation may, in the name of the People of the State of 29 Illinois through the Attorney General of the State of 30 Illinois, or the State's Attorney of any county in the State 31 of Illinois, apply for an injunction in the circuit court to 32 33 enjoin any person who has not been issued a license or whose

1 license has been suspended or revoked, or whose license has 2 not been renewed, from practicing funeral directing and embalming or funeral directing. Upon the filing of a verified 3 4 complaint in court, the court, if satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that the person is or has been practicing funeral 5 directing and embalming or funeral directing without having 6 7 been issued a license or after his or her license has been 8 suspended, revoked, or not renewed, may issue a temporary 9 restraining order or preliminary injunction, without notice or bond, enjoining the defendant from further practicing 10 11 funeral directing and embalming or funeral directing. A copy 12 of the verified complaint shall be served upon the defendant and the proceedings shall thereafter be conducted as in other 13 civil cases. If it is established that the defendant has been 14 15 is practicing funeral directing and embalming or funeral 16 directing without having been issued a license or has been or is practicing funeral directing and embalming or funeral 17 directing after his or her license has been suspended, 18 revoked, or not renewed, the court may enter a judgment 19 perpetually enjoining the defendant from further practicing 20 21 funeral directing and embalming or funeral directing. In case 22 of violation of any injunction entered under this Section, 23 the court may summarily try and punish the offender for contempt of court. Any injunction proceeding shall be in 24 25 addition to, and not in lieu of, all penalties and other remedies in this Code. 26

27 (b) Whenever, in the opinion of the Department, any person or other entity violates any provision of this Act, 28 29 the Department may issue a notice to show cause why an order to cease and desist should not be entered against that person 30 31 or other entity. The rule shall clearly set forth the grounds relied upon by the Department and shall provide a period of 7 32 days from the date of the rule to file an answer to the 33 satisfaction of the Department. Failure to answer to the 34

9 (1) Practicing the profession of funeral directing 10 and embalming or funeral directing, or attempting to 11 practice the profession of funeral directing and 12 embalming or funeral directing without a license as a 13 licensed funeral director and embalmer or funeral 14 director.

15 (2) Serving as <u>an intern</u> a-trainee under a licensed 16 funeral director and embalmer or attempting to serve as a 17 <u>intern</u> trainee under a licensed funeral director and 18 embalmer without a license as a licensed funeral director 19 and embalmer <u>intern</u> trainee.

20 (3) Obtaining or attempting to obtain a license,

5 (2) Conviction in this State or another state of 6 any crime that is a felony <u>or misdemeanor</u> under the laws 7 of this State or conviction of a felony <u>or misdemeanor</u> in 8 a federal court.

9 (3) Violation of the laws of this State relating to 10 the funeral, burial or disposal of deceased human bodies 11 or of the rules and regulations of the Department, or the 12 Department of Public Health.

Nothing in this paragraph shall 25 prevent including the name of any owner, officer or 26 corporate director of a funeral <u>business</u> home who is not 27 a licensee in any advertisement used by a funeral home 28 individual is affiliated if the 29 with which the advertisement specifies the individual's affiliation with 30 the funeral home. 31

32 (7) Engaging in, promoting, selling, or issuing
 33 burial contracts, burial certificates, or burial
 34 insurance policies in connection with the profession as a

funeral director and embalmer, funeral director, or

4 (8) Refusing, without cause, to surrender the
5 custody of a deceased human body upon the proper request
6 of the person or persons lawfully entitled to the custody

9 as to amount to the perpetration of fraud.

10 (10) Engaging in funeral directing and embalming or11 funeral directing without a license.

(11) Encouraging, requesting, or suggesting by a 12 13 licensee or some person working on his behalf and with his consent for compensation that a person utilize the 14 15 services of a certain funeral director and embalmer, 16 funeral director, or funeral establishment unless that 17 information has been expressly requested by the person. This does not prohibit general advertising or pre-need 18 solicitation. 19

(12) Making or causing to be made any false or
misleading statements about the laws concerning the
disposal of human remains, including, but not limited to,
the need to embalm, the need for a casket for cremation
or the need for an outer burial container.

25 (13) Continued practice by a person having an
26 infectious or contagious disease.

(14) Embalming or attempting to embalm a deceased
human body without express prior authorization of the
person responsible for making the funeral arrangements
for the body. This does not apply to cases where
embalming is directed by local authorities who have
jurisdiction or when embalming is required by State or
local law.

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(15) Making a false statement on a Certificate of

Death where the person making the statement knew or
 should have known that the statement was false.

3 (16) Soliciting human bodies after death or while4 death is imminent.

5 (17) Performing any act or practice that is a 6 violation of this Code, <u>the rules for the administration</u> 7 <u>of this Code</u>, or any federal, State or local laws, rules, 8 or regulations governing the practice of funeral 9 directing or embalming.

10 (18) Performing any act or practice that is a
11 violation of Section 2 of the Consumer Fraud and
12 Deceptive Business Practices Act.

13 (19) Engaging in unethical or unprofessional 14 conduct of a character likely to deceive, defraud or harm 15 the public in--the--course--of--providing--professional 16 services-or-activities.

17 (20) Taking possession of a dead human body without
18 having first obtained express permission from next of kin
19 or a public agency legally authorized to direct, control
20 or permit the removal of deceased human bodies.

21 (21) Advertising in a false or misleading manner or 22 advertising using the name of an unlicensed person in 23 with any service being rendered in the connection practice of funeral directing or funeral directing and 24 25 The use of any name of an unlicensed or embalming. unregistered person in an advertisement so as to imply 26 that the person will perform services is considered 27 misleading advertising. Nothing in this paragraph shall 28 29 prevent including the name of any owner, officer or 30 corporate director of a funeral home, who is not a licensee, in any advertisement used by a funeral home 31 with which the individual is affiliated, if 32 the advertisement specifies the individual's affiliation with 33 34 the funeral home.

(22) Directly or indirectly receiving compensation
 for any professional services not actually performed.

3 (23) Failing to account for or remit any monies,
4 documents, or personal property that belongs to others
5 that comes into a licensee's possession.

6 (24) Treating any person differently to his 7 detriment because of race, color, creed, <u>gender</u> sex, 8 religion, or national origin.

9 (25) Knowingly making any false statements, oral or 10 otherwise, of a character likely to influence, persuade 11 or induce others in the course of performing professional 12 services or activities.

13 (26) Knowingly making or filing false records or
 14 reports in the practice of funeral directing and
 15 <u>embalming</u>.

16 (27) Failing to acquire continuing education17 required under this Code.

18 (28) Failing to comply with any of the following19 required activities:

(A) When reasonably possible, a licensee or 20 21 anyone acting on his or her behalf shall obtain the 22 express authorization of the person or persons 23 responsible for making the funeral arrangements for a deceased human body prior to removing a body from 24 25 the place of death or any place it may be or embalming or attempting to embalm a deceased human 26 body, unless required by State or local law. This 27 requirement is waived whenever removal or embalming 28 directed by local authorities who have 29 is 30 jurisdiction. If the responsibility for the handling of the remains lawfully falls under the jurisdiction 31 of a public agency, then the regulations of the 32 public agency shall prevail. 33

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(B) A licensee shall clearly mark the price of

1 any casket offered for sale or the price of any 2 service using the casket on or in the casket if the casket is displayed at the funeral establishment. 3 4 If the casket is displayed at any other location, regardless of whether the licensee is in control of 5 that location, the casket shall be clearly marked 6 7 and the registrant shall use books, catalogues, brochures, or other printed display aids to show the 8 9 price of each casket or service.

(C) At the time funeral arrangements are made 10 11 and prior to rendering the funeral services, a licensee shall furnish a written statement to be 12 retained by the person or persons making the funeral 13 arrangements, signed by both parties, that shall 14 15 contain: (i) the name, address and telephone number 16 of the funeral establishment and the date on which the arrangements were made; (ii) the price of the 17 service selected and the services and merchandise 18 included for that price; (iii) a clear disclosure 19 20 that the person or persons making the arrangement 21 may decline and receive credit for any service or 22 merchandise not desired and not required by law or the funeral director or the funeral director and 23 embalmer; (iv) the supplemental items of service and 24 25 merchandise requested and the price of each item; (v) the terms or method of payment agreed upon; and 26 27 (vi) a statement as to any monetary advances made by the registrant on behalf of the family. 28

29 (29) A finding by the Department that the license,
30 after having his or her license placed on probationary
31 status or subjected to conditions or restrictions,
32 violated the terms of the probation or failed to comply
33 with such terms or conditions.

34 (30) Violation of any final administrative action

1 <u>of the Director.</u>

2 (31) Being named as a perpetrator in an indicated 3 report by the Department of Children and Family Services 4 pursuant to the Abused and Neglected Child Reporting Act 5 and, upon proof by clear and convincing evidence, being 6 found to have caused a child to be an abused child or 7 neglected child as defined in the Abused and Neglected 8 Child Reporting Act.

9 (c) The Department may refuse to issue or renew, or may 10 suspend, the license of any person who fails to file a 11 return, to pay the tax, penalty or interest shown in a filed 12 return, or to pay any final assessment of tax, penalty or 13 interest as required by any tax Act administered by the 14 Illinois Department of Revenue, until the time as the 15 requirements of the tax Act are satisfied.

Each 19 20 applicant for a funeral director and embalmer's license shall 21 with his or her application submit a statement of the place 22 of practice, ownership, names and license numbers of all directors and embalmers and funeral directors 23 funeral 24 associated with the applicant. The Department shall keep a record, which shall be open to public inspection at all 25 reasonable times, of its proceedings relating 26 to the issuance, refusal, renewal, suspension and revocation of 27 licenses. This record shall also contain the name, known 28 29 place of practice and residence, and the date and number of the license of every licensed funeral director and embalmer, 30 31 licensed funeral director, and licensed funeral director and embalmer intern trainee in this State. 32

33 The Department shall publish an annual list of the names

and addresses of all licensees registered by it under the 1 provisions of this Code, and of all persons whose licenses 2 3 have been suspended or revoked within the past year, together 4 with other information relative to the enforcement of the provisions of this Code as it may deem of interest to the 5 public. One list shall be mailed to each local registrar of 6 7 vital statistics upon request by the registrar. Lists shall also be mailed by the Department to any person in the State 8 9 upon request.
