- 1 AN ACT in relation to public employee benefits.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Pension Code is amended by
- 5 adding Section 17-121.1 as follows:
- 6 (40 ILCS 5/17-121.1 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 17-121.1. Domestic partner eligibility.</u>
- 8 (a) Beginning July 1, 2003, an unmarried teacher may
- 9 <u>designate a domestic partner by filing a written designation</u>
- 10 with the Fund in the manner prescribed by the Fund. The Fund
- 11 <u>may require reasonable evidence that the person designated</u>
- 12 <u>meets the qualifications set forth in subsection (c). Such a</u>
- designation is revocable at any time, but may not be made or
- 14 <u>changed more than once in any 24-month period. The marriage</u>
- 15 <u>of a teacher automatically revokes any designation of a</u>
- 16 <u>domestic partner previously made by that teacher.</u>
- 17 <u>(b) The designated domestic partner of a teacher shall</u>
- 18 <u>be eligible to receive survivor and death benefits under this</u>
- 19 <u>Article in the same manner and subject to the same conditions</u>
- 20 <u>as a surviving spouse.</u> For the purposes of determining

eligibility for those benefits, the date of designation of a

domestic partner shall be deemed the equivalent of the date

- 23 of marriage, and the revocation or change of a designation
- 24 <u>shall be deemed the equivalent of termination of the</u>
- 25 <u>marriage</u>. <u>References in this Article and other applicable</u>
- 26 Articles of this Code to a surviving spouse shall be deemed
- 27 <u>to include a surviving designated domestic partner.</u>
- 28 (c) "Domestic partner" means an individual of the same
- 29 gender as an unmarried teacher who (1) is involved with the
- 30 <u>teacher in a long-term relationship of indefinite duration;</u>
- 31 (2) has resided together with the teacher at the same address

- 1 for at least 12 months; (3) is not related to the teacher by
- 2 <u>blood to a degree of closeness that would prohibit legal</u>
- 3 <u>marriage in the state in which they legally reside; (4) is</u>
- 4 <u>not married to any other person; and (5) has an exclusive</u>
- 5 <u>mutual commitment to the teacher in which they agree to be</u>
- 6 jointly responsible for each other's common welfare and to
- 7 share financial obligations.
- 8 Section 90. The State Mandates Act is amended by adding
- 9 Section 8.27 as follows:
- 10 (30 ILCS 805/8.27 new)
- 11 <u>Sec. 8.27. Exempt mandate. Notwithstanding Sections 6</u>
- 12 and 8 of this Act, no reimbursement by the State is required
- 13 for the implementation of any mandate created by this
- amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly.
- 15 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 16 becoming law.
