- 1 AN ACT concerning education.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing
- 5 Sections 21-1 and 21-11.1 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/21-1) (from Ch. 122, par. 21-1)
- 7 Sec. 21-1. Qualification of teachers. No one may be
- 8 certified to teach or supervise in the public schools of this
- 9 State who is not of good character, of good health, a citizen
- 10 of the United States or legally present and authorized for
- 11 employment, and at least 19 years of age. If-the-holder-of-a
- 12 certificate-under-this-Section-is-not-a-citizen-of-the-United
- 13 States-6-years-after-the-date-of-the-issuance-of-the-original
- 14 certificate,-any-certificate-held-by-such-person-on-that-date
- shall-be-cancelled-by-the-board-of--education--and--no--other
- 16 certificate--to--teach--shall--be-issued-to-such-person-until
- 17 such-person-is-a-citizen-of-the-United-States.
- 18 Citizenship is not required for the issuance of a
- 19 temporary part-time certificate to participants in approved
- 20 training programs for exchange students as described in
- 21 Section 21-10.2. A certificate issued under this plan shall
- 22 expire on June 30 following the date of issue. One renewal
- 23 for one year is authorized if the holder remains as an
- official participant in an approved exchange program.
- In determining good character under this Section, any
- 26 felony conviction of the applicant may be taken into
- 27 consideration, but such a conviction shall not operate as a
- 28 bar to registration.
- No person otherwise qualified shall be denied the right
- 30 to be certified, to receive training for the purpose of
- 31 becoming a teacher or to engage in practice teaching in any

- 1 school because of a physical disability including but not
- 2 limited to visual and hearing disabilities; nor shall any
- 3 school district refuse to employ a teacher on such grounds,
- 4 provided that the person is able to carry out the duties of
- 5 the position for which he applies.
- 6 No person may be granted or continue to hold a teaching
- 7 certificate who has knowingly altered or misrepresented his
- 8 or her teaching qualifications in order to acquire the
- 9 certificate. Any other certificate held by such person may
- 10 be suspended or revoked by the State Teacher Certification
- 11 Board, depending upon the severity of the alteration or
- 12 misrepresentation.
- No one may teach or supervise in the public schools nor
- 14 receive for teaching or supervising any part of any public
- 15 school fund, who does not hold a certificate of qualification
- 16 granted by the State Board of Education or by the State
- 17 Teacher Certification Board and a regional superintendent of
- 18 schools as hereinafter provided, or by the board of education
- of a city having a population exceeding 500,000 inhabitants
- 20 except as provided in Section 34-6 and in Section 10-22.34 or
- 21 Section 10-22.34b. However, the provisions of this Article do
- 22 not apply to a member of the armed forces who is employed as
- 23 a teacher of subjects in the Reserve Officer's Training Corps

of any school. Sections 21-2 through 21-24 do not apply to

- 25 cities having a population exceeding 500,000 inhabitants,
- 26 until July 1, 1988.

- Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, the
- 28 board of education of any school district may grant to a
- 29 teacher of the district a leave of absence with full pay for
- 30 a period of not more than one year to permit such teacher to
- 31 teach in a foreign state under the provisions of the Exchange
- 32 Teacher Program established under Public Law 584, 79th
- 33 Congress, and Public Law 402, 80th Congress, as amended. The
- 34 school board granting such leave of absence may employ with

- 1 or without pay a national of the foreign state wherein the
- 2 teacher on leave of absence will teach, if the national is
- 3 qualified to teach in that foreign state, and if that
- 4 national will teach in a grade level similar to the one which
- 5 was taught in such foreign state. The State Board of
- 6 Education shall promulgate and enforce such reasonable rules
- 7 as may be necessary to effectuate this paragraph.

- 11 Sec. 21-11.1. Certificates for equivalent
- 12 qualifications. An applicant who holds or is eligible to hold
- 13 a teacher's certificate or license under the laws of another
- 14 state or territory of the United States may be granted a
- 15 corresponding teacher's certificate in Illinois on the
- 16 written authorization of the State Board of Education and the
- 17 State Teacher Certification Board upon the following
- 18 conditions:
- 19 (1) That the applicant is at least 19 years of age,
- is of good character, of good health, and a citizen of
- 21 the United States or legally present and authorized for
- 22 <u>employment</u>; and
- 23 (2) That the requirements for a similar teacher's
- certificate in the particular state or territory were, at
- 25 the date of issuance of the certificate, substantially
- 26 equal to the requirements in force at the time the
- 27 application is made for the certificate in this State.
- 28 After January 1, 1988, in addition to satisfying the
- 29 foregoing conditions and requirements, an applicant for a
- 30 corresponding teaching certificate in Illinois also shall be
- 31 required to pass the examinations required under the
- 32 provisions of Section 21-1a as directed by the State Board of
- 33 Education.

- 1 In determining good character under this Section, any
- 2 felony conviction of the applicant may be taken into
- 3 consideration, but the conviction shall not operate as a bar
- 4 to registration.
- 5 The State Board of Education in consultation with the
- 6 State Teacher Certification Board shall prescribe rules and
- 7 regulations establishing the similarity of certificates in
- 8 other states and the standards for determining the
- 9 equivalence of requirements.
