2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,

Section 5. The Ambulatory Surgical Treatment Center Act
is amended by changing Section 6.5 as follows:

Sec. 6.5. Clinical privileges; advanced practice nurses.
All ambulatory surgical treatment centers (ASTC) licensed
under this Act shall comply with the following requirements:

10 (1) No ASTC policy, rule, regulation, or practice shall 11 be inconsistent with the provision of adequate collaboration, 12 including medical direction of licensed advanced practice 13 nurses, in accordance with Section 54.5 of the Medical 14 Practice Act of 1987.

(2) Operative surgical procedures shall be performed 15 only by a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its 16 branches under the Medical Practice Act of 1987, a dentist 17 licensed under the Illinois Dental Practice Act, or a 18 podiatrist licensed under the Podiatric Medical Practice Act 19 20 of 1987, with medical staff membership and surgical clinical privileges granted by the consulting committee of the ASTC. A 21 22 licensed physician, dentist, or podiatrist may be assisted by a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its 23 branches, dentist, dental assistant, podiatrist, licensed 24 advanced practice nurse, licensed physician assistant, 25 26 licensed registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, surgical 27 assistant, surgical technician, or other individuals granted 28 clinical privileges to assist in surgery by the consulting 29 committee of the ASTC. The anesthesia service shall be under the direction 3 (3) 4 of a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches who has had specialized preparation or experience in 5 the area or who has completed a residency in anesthesiology. 6 7 An anesthesiologist, Board certified or Board eligible, is 8 recommended. Anesthesia services may only be administered 9 pursuant to the order of a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches, licensed dentist, or licensed 10 11 podiatrist. (A) The individuals who, with clinical privileges 12 granted by the medical staff and ASTC, may administer 13 anesthesia services are limited to the following: 14 15 (i) an anesthesiologist; or 16 (ii) a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches; or 17 (iii) a dentist with authority to administer 18 19 anesthesia under Section 8.1 of the Illinois Dental Practice Act; or 20 (iv) a licensed certified registered nurse 21 22 anesthetist. 23 (B) For anesthesia services, an anesthesiologist shall participate through discussion of and agreement 24 25 with the anesthesia plan and shall remain physically present and be available on the premises during the 26 delivery of anesthesia services 27 for diagnosis, and treatment of emergency medical consultation, 28 conditions. In the absence of 24-hour availability of 29 30 anesthesiologists with clinical privileges, an alternate 31 policy (requiring participation, presence, and availability of a physician licensed to practice medicine 32 in all its branches) shall be developed by the medical 33 staff consulting committee in consultation with the 34

anesthesia service and included in the medical staff
 consulting committee policies.

(C) A certified registered nurse anesthetist is not 3 4 required to possess prescriptive authority or a written collaborative agreement meeting the requirements 5 of Section 15-15 of the Nursing and Advanced Practice 6 7 Nursing Act to provide anesthesia services ordered by a 8 licensed physician, dentist, or podiatrist. Licensed 9 certified registered nurse anesthetists are authorized to select, order, and administer drugs and apply the 10 11 appropriate medical devices in the provision of 12 anesthesia services under the anesthesia plan agreed with 13 by the anesthesiologist or, in the absence of an available anesthesiologist with clinical privileges, 14 15 agreed with by the operating physician, operating 16 dentist, or operating podiatrist in accordance with the medical staff consulting committee policies of a licensed 17 ambulatory surgical treatment center. 18

(1) No hospital policy, rule, regulation, or practice
shall be inconsistent with the provision of adequate
collaboration, including medical direction of licensed
advanced practice nurses, in accordance with Section 54.5 of
the Medical Practice Act of 1987.

31 (2) Operative surgical procedures shall be performed32 only by a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its

1 branches under the Medical Practice Act of 1987, a dentist 2 licensed under the Illinois Dental Practice Act, or a podiatrist licensed under the Podiatric Medical Practice Act 3 4 of 1987, with medical staff membership and surgical clinical privileges granted at the hospital. A licensed physician, 5 dentist, or podiatrist may be assisted by a physician 6 7 licensed to practice medicine in all its branches, dentist, dental assistant, podiatrist, licensed advanced practice 8 9 nurse, licensed physician assistant, licensed registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, surgical assistant, surgical 10 11 technician, or other individuals granted clinical privileges 12 to assist in surgery at the hospital. <u>Payment for services</u> 13 rendered by an assistant in surgery who is not a hospital employee shall be paid at the appropriate non-physician 14 modifier rate if the payor would have made payment had the 15 16 same services been provided by a physician.

(3) The anesthesia service shall be under the direction 17 of a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its 18 branches who has had specialized preparation or experience in 19 the area or who has completed a residency in anesthesiology. 20 An anesthesiologist, Board certified or Board eligible, is 21 22 recommended. Anesthesia services may only be administered 23 pursuant to the order of a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches, licensed dentist, or licensed 24 25 podiatrist.

(A) The individuals who, with clinical privileges 26 27 granted at the hospital, may administer anesthesia services are limited to the following: 28 29 (i) an anesthesiologist; or 30 (ii) a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches; or 31 (iii) a dentist with authority to administer 32 anesthesia under Section 8.1 of the Illinois Dental 33 34 Practice Act; or

(B) For anesthesia services, an anesthesiologist 3 4 shall participate through discussion of and agreement with the anesthesia plan and shall remain physically 5 present and be available on the premises during the 6 7 delivery of anesthesia services for diagnosis, 8 consultation, and treatment of emergency medical 9 conditions. In the absence of 24-hour availability of anesthesiologists with medical staff privileges, 10 an 11 alternate policy (requiring participation, presence, and availability of a physician licensed to practice medicine 12 in all its branches) shall be developed by the medical 13 staff and licensed hospital in consultation with the 14 15 anesthesia service.

16 (C) A certified registered nurse anesthetist is not required to possess prescriptive authority or a written 17 collaborative agreement meeting the requirements of 18 19 Section 15-15 of the Nursing and Advanced Practice Nursing Act to provide anesthesia services ordered by a 20 21 licensed physician, dentist, or podiatrist. Licensed certified registered nurse anesthetists are authorized to 22 23 select, order, and administer drugs and apply the appropriate medical devices in the provision of 24 25 anesthesia services under the anesthesia plan agreed with by the anesthesiologist or, in the absence of 26 an available anesthesiologist with clinical privileges, 27 agreed with by the operating physician, 28 operating dentist, or operating podiatrist in accordance with the 29 hospital's alternative policy. 30
