SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

410 ILCS 513/20

Amends the Genetic Information Privacy Act. Provides that if an application or other form used by an insurer requests a waiver of an individual's health history, the form must expressly state that information derived from genetic testing is not included in such a waiver. Provides that an insurer's application or other form shall comply with this requirement within 2 years.

AN ACT in relation to public health.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

Section 5. The Genetic Information Privacy Act is amended 5 by changing Section 20 as follows:

(410 ILCS 513/20) 6

7 Sec. 20. Use of genetic testing information for insurance 8 purposes.

(a) An insurer may not seek information derived from 9 genetic testing for use in connection with a policy of accident 10 and health insurance. Except as provided in subsection (b), an 11 12 insurer that receives information derived from genetic testing, regardless of the source of that information, may not 13 14 use the information for a nontherapeutic purpose as it relates 15 to a policy of accident and health insurance.

(b) An insurer may consider the results of genetic testing 16 17 in connection with a policy of accident and health insurance if the individual voluntarily submits the results and the results 18 19 are favorable to the individual.

20 (c) An insurer that possesses information derived from genetic testing may not release the information to a third 21 22 party, except as specified in Section 30.

(d) If an application or other form used by an insurer 23 requests a waiver of an individual's health history, the form 24 must expressly state that information derived from genetic 25 26 testing is not included in such a waiver. An insurer's application or other form shall comply with the requirements of 27 this subsection within 2 years of the effective date of this 28 amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly. 29
