## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/34-83.1 30 ILCS 805/8.28 new

Amends the Chicago School District Article of the School Code. Prohibits residency within the school district from being considered in determining the employment of a teacher. Also, prohibits residency within the district from being considered in determining a teacher's compensation or whether to retain, promote, assign, or transfer that teacher (now, this prohibition applies only if residency within the district was not required at the time of employment as a qualification of employment). Amends the State Mandates Act to require implementation without reimbursement.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
34-83.1 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/34-83.1) (from Ch. 122, par. 34-83.1)

Sec. 34-83.1. Residence requirements. Residency within any school district governed by this Article, if not required at the time of employment as a qualification of employment, shall not be considered in determining <u>the employment or</u> the compensation of a teacher or whether to retain, promote, assign, or transfer that teacher.

Section 90. The State Mandates Act is amended by adding Section 8.28 as follows:

16 (30 ILCS 805/8.28 new) Sec. 8.28. Exempt mandate. Notwithstanding Sections 6 and 8 of this Act, no reimbursement by the State is required for the implementation of any mandate created by this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly.
