school districts receipts from all sources and expenditures for 1 all purposes for each fund; the total operating expense, and 2 3 the per capita cost, and instructional expenditures; federal 4 and state aids and reimbursements; new school buildings, and recognized schools; together with such other information and 5 suggestions as the State Board of Education may deem important 6 7 in relation to the schools and school laws and the means of 8 promoting education throughout the state.
