SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act

Creates the Employ Illinois Job Renewal Act. Requires the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to develop application procedures to certify certain areas in the State as Job Renewal Zones or Agricultural Renewal Zones. Sets forth the qualifications for certification as a Job Renewal Zone or Agricultural Renewal Zone. Sets forth tax incentives for businesses located inside Job Renewal Zones or Agricultural Renewal Zones. Requires the Department to certify all Job Renewal Zones and Agriculture Renewal Zones by July 1, 2007 and provides that all zones expire on June 30, 2019. Requires the Department to report to the General Assembly and Governor no later than January 1, 2018 concerning the zone program. Effective immediately.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Employ
 Illinois Job Renewal Act.
- 6 Section 5. Definitions. As used in this Act:

7 "Department" means the Department of Commerce and Economic8 Opportunity.

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"Local government entity" means a county or a municipality.

- Section 10. Qualifications for Job Renewal Zones. An area is qualified to become a Job Renewal Zone if:
- (1) it is located in a county or is a county with no
 more than 200,000 residents according to the latest data
 available from the U.S Census Bureau; and
- 15 (2) it has experienced unemployment rates over the last
 16 5 years that are higher than at least 75% of all Illinois
 17 local government entities.
- 18 Section 15. Certification of Job Renewal Zones by the 19 Department.

20 (a) The Department must develop an application for Job 21 Renewal Zone certification and contact local government entities that may be qualified to be a Job Renewal Zone under 22 23 Section 10 to inform them of their potential qualification. In 24 determining those local government entities to be certified, in addition to characteristics mentioned in subsection (b), the 25 26 Department must certify an equal amount of zones in the various 27 regions of the State. The Department shall designate Job 28 Renewal Zones in a manner that maximizes their effect equally in regions of the State. The Department may not designate more 29 30 than 10 Job Renewal Zones in the State.

1 (b) In considering applications for the certification of a 2 Job Renewal Zone, the Department must consider all of the 3 following factors:

4 (1) The degree to which the applicant has experienced
5 population decline or equalized assessed property value
6 decline or stagnant growth at greater levels than other
7 local government entities that are eligible for Job Renewal
8 Zone certification.

9 (2) The degree to which the applicant maintains a 10 residency with higher levels of poverty relative to other 11 local government entities that are eligible for Job Renewal 12 Zone certification.

(3) The degree to which school districts within the jurisdiction of the local government entity applying for certification have experienced decline or stagnation in student enrollment having detrimental effects on the schools' State education funding at levels greater than other local government entities that are eligible for certification.

(4) Whether the applicant has developed a strategic
development plan that will guide the redevelopment of its
community or county in a manner that benefits all residents
of the applicant local government entity.

24 (5) Any other relevant factors determined by the25 Department.

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Section 20. Taxes on businesses in Job Renewal Zones.

(a) All businesses located in a Job Renewal Zone, in
addition to any other benefits and incentives that may be
offered at the discretion of the Department or the local
government entity creating the Job Renewal Zone as is provided
under the Enterprise Zone Act, shall qualify for exemptions
from the following taxes:

33 (1) taxes imposed under subsections (a) and (b) of
34 Section 201 of the Illinois Income Tax Act;

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(2) the personal property tax replacement income tax

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under subsection (c) of Section 201 of the Illinois Income
 Tax Act; and

3 (3) the State's portion of the State use or occupation4 taxes.

5 (b) Any business located in a Job Renewal Zone from which 6 the Department has determined at least 51% of its products or 7 services are exported outside of the State shall automatically 8 qualify for EDGE cash incentives as they are provided under the 9 EDGE Tax Credit Act.

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Section 25. Agricultural Renewal Zones.

(a) In addition to the 10 Job Renewal Zones, the Departmentmay certify up to 10 Agriculture Renewal Zones.

(b) Agriculture Renewal Zones may not be larger than the 13 14 agricultural processing facility for which the zone has been 15 designated. For purposes of this Section, "agricultural 16 facility" means one or more facilities or operations that transform, package, sort, or grade livestock or livestock 17 18 agricultural commodities, or plants or products, plant products into goods that are used for intermediate for final 19 consumption including goods for nonfood use, and surrounding 20 property. 21

(c) An Agriculture Renewal Zone may be designated anywhere in which a Job Renewal Zone may be located, under this Act, if the local government entity with jurisdiction has approved its location. An Agriculture Renewal Zone may not be designated within a Job Renewal Zone.

(d) A business in an Agriculture Renewal Zone qualifies for
the same benefits and incentives eligible to businesses in a
Job Renewal Zone.

30 Section 30. Deadline for zone certification; expiration.
31 (a) The Department must set a deadline for its receipt of
32 applications for all zone certifications. The Department must
33 certify all Job Renewal Zones and Agriculture Renewal Zones by
34 July 1, 2007.

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(b) All Job Renewal Zones and Agriculture Renewal Zones
 expire on June 30, 2019.

3 Section 35. Report required; extension of program. 4 (a) By January 1, 2018, the Department must prepare a report to the Governor and the General Assembly detailing the 5 effects of the Job Renewal and Agriculture Renewal programs on 6 7 the local government entities. The report must include, without 8 limitation, information concerning: 9 (1) Employment growth and unemployment decline; 10 (2) Population change; 11 (3) Changes in poverty rates; 12 (4) Changes in per capita income of the residents of the zone; 13 14 (5) Changes in the equalized assessed value of property 15 within the zone; 16 (6) Changes in the cost of providing services to zone residents borne by the local government entity where the 17 18 zone is located; 19 (7) Changes in revenues collected by the local government entity in which the zone is located; and 20 (8) Changes in the cost of housing in the zone. 21 22 (b) If the General Assembly extends the expiration date of 23 this program, the Department shall consider the progress of economic development of each zone then 24 designated and 25 surrounding areas when deciding whether the current 10 Job 26 Renewal Zones and 10 Agriculture Renewal Zones will be

27 re-extended.

28 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 29 becoming law.
