1 AN ACT concerning alcoholic liquor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Liquor Control Act of 1934 is amended by adding Section 9-2b as follows:
- 6 (235 ILCS 5/9-2b new)
- 7 Sec. 9-2b. Prohibition against sale of alcoholic liquor; exception. Notwithstanding any provision in this Act to the 8 contrary, in any township that has voted to prohibit the retail 9 sale of alcoholic liquor under Section 9-2, the township board 10 may authorize the local liquor control commissioner to issue a 11 special event retailer's license (not-for-profit) authorizing 12 the sale of beer for up to 3 days per year for up to 3 years at 13 an agricultural show that is held on privately-owned property 14 15 that is within the township, but is not within the corporate <u>limits of a city</u>, village, or incorporated town. This Section 16 is repealed 3 years after the effective date of this amendatory 17 18 Act of the 93rd General Assembly.
- 19 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 20 becoming law.
